Gospel Reflection

Luke 11:1-13

In our Gospel reading from Luke, some of Jesus' disciples ask our Lord to teach them how to pray. Jesus immediately gives them the beautiful prayer, which we, of

course, call the Our Father. In it, we intimately call upon God as Father. We ask that His will be done (not ours!) and that His kingdom come (not ours!). In other words, we remember that He is our Creator, and everything belongs to Him. Our focus in life should be on His priorities, not our own.

Then we ask Him to supply our needs (to give us our daily bread), forgive our sins, and protect us from evil. That is, we proclaim our complete trust in His provision for us and His mercy towards us. We, too, have the responsibility to extend mercy ourselves, as we forgive those who sin against us.

As we pray the words of the Our Father, we acknowledge this fundamental truth about ourselves and God: God is our Father, and we are beloved and infinitely blessed to be His children. This forms the foundation of a Christian lifestyle.

At the end of the Gospel passage, Jesus encourages us to build a relationship with the Father: Ask Him, seek Him, and knock on His door! He eagerly anticipates blessing us, His children. Keep this in mind throughout the week; then go out and be a source of blessing to others! Christianity is as joyous and straightforward as that.

Eucharistic Revival - A Minute with Jesus



The Eucharist Is Called The Breaking of Bread

At the Last Supper, Jesus gave thanks, then blessed and broke the bread and gave it to the Apostles. Jesus

repeated this action on the day of His Resurrection as He shared a meal with the disciples in Emmaus. The disciples had left Jerusalem, believing that Jesus was dead. As Jesus walked with the disciples to Emmaus, they did not recognize Him. It was in the "breaking of the bread" that He opened their eyes to recognize Him as the risen Lord. This transfigured Bread and Wine – the Eucharist – as *the* Gift of Himself to them, and now to us.

Let's pray this right now and every day this week:

"Jesus, please grant me the grace to recognize You in the Holy Eucharist – please reveal this reality to my heart!"

This week, read the passage of the disciples recognizing Jesus in "the breaking of the bread" in Luke 24:13-35.

The Sacred Scriptures are God's love letter to us. The Bible reveals God's unfailing love in keeping His promises to us to bring us back into His family after the sin of our first parents. In the Old Testament promise, God revealed how His plan would unfold through the coming of the Savior and His Mother would be a virgin: "The Lord Himself will give you a sign. Behold, a virgin shall conceive and

bear a Son and shall name Him Emmanuel" (Isaiah 7:14).

We see that God fulfilled this promise in the New Testament: "In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he said, 'Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you.' But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. Then the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a Son, and you shall name Him Jesus'" (Luke 1:26-31).



States to serve in the Diocese of La Crosse, Wisconsin in 2004. He served as pastor at parishes in:


- Marshfield






HOPE
