The Most Holy Name of Jesus

The Catholic Church has dedicated each month of the year to a particular devotion. For January, it is the *Holy Name of Jesus*. The January devotion is linked to the *Feast of the Circumcision of Christ*, which used to be celebrated on January 1st, eight days after Christmas, in keeping with Jewish custom. This was when Jesus was officially given His name, which in Hebrew means “God Saves”. The *Feast of the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God*, is now celebrated on January 1st. This feast celebrates Mary’s role in the Incarnation of her divine Son, whose name was revealed to her by the angel Gabriel and formally given to Jesus on this day.

The *Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus* is celebrated on January 3rd as a reminder of the power and sanctity of Jesus’ name, which should always be spoken and heard with profound love, respect, and reverence.

Scripture References

Invoking the holy name of Jesus with faith brings help in bodily needs, according to the promise of Christ:

“In My name they shall take up serpents; and if they shall drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them: they shall lay their hands upon the sick, and they shall recover.” (Mark 16:17-18)

In the name of Jesus, the Apostles gave strength to the lame (Acts 3:6; 9:34) and life to the dead. (Acts 9:40)

It gives consolation in spiritual trials. ... It protects us against Satan and his wiles, for the devil fears the name of Jesus, Who has conquered him on the cross.

In the name of Jesus we obtain every blessing and grace for time and eternity, for Christ has said:

“If you ask the Father anything in My name He will give it to you” (John 16:23). Therefore the Church concludes all her prayers by the words: “Through Our Lord Jesus Christ,” etc.

“And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.” (Acts 4:12)

“Therefore God has highly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.” (Philippians 2:9-11)

Prayer to the Holy Name of Jesus

Lord Jesus, we humbly pray for You to give us all a great reverence and respect for Your most holy name. Forgive us for ever having used the name of Jesus in vain, or without due respect.

Help us remember how reverently and lovingly, Your Mother Mary used the name of Jesus, and how humbly Saint Joseph called You and spoke to You by name.

Your name, dear Jesus, is above every other name in heaven or on earth, because You are the Jesus, the Savior of all men. You have saved us, and You have told us to ask God anything in Your name, and it would be granted.

We ask You, humbly and confidently, to bless us and our work, and give us the rich treasures of Your Divine grace, without which we cannot even so much as pronounce the name of Jesus. Amen

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

Epiphany means “manifestation.” The first Epiphany was the visit of the Magi to adore the Christ Child. The Magi, who were actually scholars and scientists, came to be associated with kings. Their gifts reveal this holy Child’s identity; *gold* for Christ’s Kingship, *incense* for His divinity, and *myrrh* for His sacrifice on the Cross.

The *Feast of Epiphany* is traditionally celebrated as the *twelfth night of Christmas*, on January 6th. In the United States, this feast has been moved to the **Sunday, January 4th, 2026**. In many families, the king figurines are moved a bit closer to the nativity scene every day from Christmas Day until Epiphany. Moreover, it is traditional for parish priests to bless water, chalk, and incense on the eve of Epiphany, and use them for the blessing of homes the next day.

The blessing of homes on Epiphany revives the beautiful custom of making our homes sacramentals. Sacramentals make us more mindful, receptive and cooperative with God’s grace. This blessing also reminds us that Christ is the One Who enlightens our hearts and homes with His love. He is the source of our hope, our comfort and our joy.

Marking doorways with blessed chalk is also a witness of faith. Use the chalk to mark above the main door and, if possible, over all exterior doors in the following fashion:

- ◆ Numerals to consecrate the New Year.
- ◆ Initials to remind us of the legendary names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar and also to represent the Latin motto: **Christus mansionem benedicat (May Christ bless this house)**
- ◆ Four crosses to represent the four seasons.
- ◆ Example for the year 2026: **20 + C + M + B + 26**

Epiphany Blessing of the Home

If a priest is present, he leads; otherwise, the head of the family leads. All present go from room to room, blessing each room with holy water and praying the following prayer:

Blessed be all the rooms of this home. May each of them be holy and filled with the spirit of *happiness and peace, love and affection*. May the spirit of *pardn and affection* reside with us and be always ready to heal our divisions. May the spirits of *joy and laughter, hope and faith, playfulness and prayer, compassion and love* be perpetual guests in our home. May God’s holy blessing rest upon us all, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

As the leader inscribes the initials of the three Magi above the exterior doorways using the blessed chalk, the following prayer is prayed: Inscription for the year 2026: **20+ C + M + B + 26**

Blessed be this doorway. May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us as we welcome them with *respect and kindness*. May all our comings and goings be under the seal of God’s loving care. May we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, Jesus, Who is Lord forever and ever. Amen

Saint Alphonsus Liguori's Prayer to the Holy Name

O my Jesus, thou art the Savior who hast given Thy blood and Thy life for me, I pray Thee to write Thy adorable name on my poor heart; so that having it always imprinted in my heart by love, I may also have it ever on my lips, by invoking it in all my necessities.

If the devil tempts me, Thy name will give me strength to resist him; if I lose confidence, Thy name will animate me to hope; if I am in affliction, Thy name will comfort me, by reminding me of all Thou hast endured for me.

If I find myself cold in Thy love, Thy name will inflame me by reminding me of the love Thou hast shown me.

I have fallen into so many sins because I did not call on Thee; from henceforth Thy name shall be my defense, my refuge, my hope, my only consolation, my only love.

Thus do I hope to live, and so do I hope to die, having Thy name always on my lips. Amen



The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, PO Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact **Mrs Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org**. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.**


