70th ANNIVERASARY THE DIOCESE OF BRIDGEPORT: Bishop Caggaino has mandated that all Parishes in the Diocese celebrate the 70th anniversary of the Diocese this weekend of October 21/22nd.

Hence, the Orations of the Mass will be takenfrom the Mass "For the Particular Church." The Readings of the Mass are taken from the Prophet Isaiah LX: 1-6; Resp Psalm XCVI: 1-10; the Book of Revelation XXI: 1-5; and the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew XVI: 13-19.

OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY: two major feast days are commemorated in the month of October:

First, October 7th-the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary-commemorates the victory over the invading Muslims of the Ottoman Empire at the Battle of Lepanto, north of the Gulf of Corinth, in the year 1571, wherein Pope Pius V marshaled the naval forces of Naples, Spain and Venice to thwart the invaders threatening Western Christianity massacring the Faithful and destroying both Orthodox and Catholic Churches in the southern Balkans. A large procession & recitation of the Rosary, invoking the intercession of Our Lady, was prayed in Rome at St. Peter's Square. Before entering battle, the soldiers knelt down to pray the Rosary. After a five-hour battle, they were victorious in defeating the invading Muslim Turks at this decisive maritime battle.

Second, October 13th commemorates the final apparition of The Blessed Virgin Mary to 3 shepherd children outside of Fatima, Portugal. Our Lady requested that everyone reverently pray the Holy Rosary in reparation for the many blasphemies, offenses, and sins committed against Almighty G D.

We continue to pray through Our Lady's intercession for the protection, the growth, and, the holiness of the Holy Church of Christ, Our G D on Earth, and the conversion of sinner, the for forgiveness of sins, and for the salvation of souls.

THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE: we are now collection food items to be distributed to the Daughter of Charity and the Black Rock Food Pantry.

Although these two Apostles are mentioned in the New Testament as being among the 12 men chosen by Our LORD Jesus Christ as His close companions, not much is known for certain about them, except that after the Resurrection, they left Jerusalem to preach, teach, baptize & evangelize.

St. Simon is known as "Simon the Canaanite" possibly because he may have been from the town of Canaan, but more probably because Kananaios is the Aramaic word which translates as Zealous or "the Zealot." Zealots were members of a Jewish sect which represented an extreme Jewish nationalism. They understood the Messianic promise that the Jewish Nation was to be a free and independent Nation with G_D alone as their King. They considered any payment of taxes to the Roman Government as blasphemy against G_D Himself. Historically, These Zealots were known to attack, raid, and even kill foreigners or Jewish dissenters. It is believed that they were chiefly responsible for the rebellion against Rome which ended in the destruction of the Temple and the burning of the City of Jerusalem in the year 70 AD.

Tradition holds that St. Simon was joined by St. Jude in evangelizing throughout Egypt, Persia, Armenia, and lastly Beirut, Lebanon-where they were both martyred for the Holy Christian Faith in the year 65 AD.

St. Jude was known as Judas Thaddaeus to distinguish him from Judah Iscariot, hence the name was abbreviated to Jude or Jude Thaddaeus. He is depicted with a flame around his head, representing his presence at Pentecost at which event he received the Holy Spirit. He is also depicted holding an image of Our Lord, as he is considered to be the patron Saint of desperate or lost causes, and appeals directly to Christ on our behalf.

St. Jude was born of Jewish parents, Cleophas and Mary-a cousin of the Virgin Mary- he would have spoken both Aramaic and Greek. His father was martyred because of his forthright and outspoken devotion to the Risen Christ.

St. Jude along with St. Bartholomew brought Christianity to Armenia. The Armenian Apostolic Church claims to have been founded by him. Hence the Monastery of St. Thaddeus was founded there-which today lies in Northern Iran. In Art, he is usually depicted with an axethe instrument by which he died in Beirut.

Sometime after his death, his body was brought from Beirut to Rome, where it was placed in a crypt in St. Peter's Basilica.
