"ALL HALLOWS EVE – ALL SAINTS EVE" commonly known as HALLOWEEN is the night associated with praying for the Dead which followed the celebration of the Vigil the Mass commemorating the witness and fidelity of all the Martyrs and Saints of the Roman Church, Olde English known as All Hallows-All the Holy Ones.

When a chapel in St. Peter's Basilica was dedicated to all Martyrs and Saints on November 1st in the year 735, the Vigil Mass offered on the evening before-October 31st, was believed to be a night when the spirits were able to leave Hades.

From ancient pagan Celtic and Roman times, it was believed that the ether between the world of the Living and the world of the Dead was blurred or weakened, allowing the Spirits of demons, devils, ghosts, goblins or the Dead who were not at Peace, to manifest themselves on the Earth for the purpose of tormenting the Living.

In an attempt to elude the ghosts and evil Spirits of the Underworld, people would disguise themselves in the hope fooling them whom they believed came to haunt them, and so protect themselves. In addition to disguising themselves, people would bake "soul cakes," and leave them out for the Spirits in an effort to appease them in hopes of winning their favor. This custom of giving the spirits souls cakes has evolved into the modern-day practice of "trick or treat," i.e., giving out candy to people wearing disguises.

SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS NOVEMBER 1st



During the early ages of our Church, a great Persecution broke out against Christians in the year 64 AD, beginning with the order of the Roman Emperor Nero. The Persecution lasted until the Emperor Constantine the Great issued the Edict of Toleration in 313 AD.

Under the period of this great Persecution, many Christians were tortured and martyred for the profession of their faith in the Son of G_D, Our LORD Jesus Christ. Their martyrdom served to empower the surviving holy Believers who were forced into hiding to avoid extermination.

Surviving Christians solemnized the date of a Martyr's death as the day of their entrance into Eternal Life in Heaven in union with G_D. This was typically done at the place of their martyrdom. Frequently groups of Martyrs were sacrificed on the same day, which naturally led to a joint commemoration. During the persecution of the Roman Emperor Diocletian, the number of Martyrs became so great that a separate day could not be assigned to each. But the Church feeling that every Martyr should be venerated, appointed a common day for all the Martyred. We find the first trace of this custom in the city of Antioch on the First Sunday after Pentecost- a tradition which the Eastern Orthodox Church continues to uphold.

In the Western Church, on May 13, 609, Pope Boniface IV consecrated the pagan temple-the Pantheon in Rome-to the honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary and to all Martyrs establishing an annual celebration in Rome to commemorate their witness to Christ.

On November 1st, in the year 735, Pope Gregory III consecrated a chapel in the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome. He established it as an annual memorial to be celebrated every 1st of November, to honor of all the Saints, Martyrs, and Confessors.

Pope Gregory IV in the year 830, extended this celebration to the entire Universal Church, and declared it as a HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION to attend Mass, to honor the Faithful, who because of their witness to Christ Crucified and Risen in Glory, enjoy the Beatific Vision in Heaven. These Saints in Heaven (the Church Triumphant) support, and, intercede on behalf of the Faithful in the world (the Church Militant) in their battle against the enemies of G_D and His Saints, who in turn intercedes by prayer for the Holy Soul in Purgatory (the Church Suffering.)
