Mass Intentions and Intercessions

Intentions for Masses will be made public on the parish calendar on the parish website, in the bulletin or newsletter and posted in the entrance of the church. All parishioners may read the intention. Mass intentions will no longer be announced before or during the Mass.

Often just before Mass, parishioners come to the sacristy and ask the priest to remember persons at the Mass. These requests will not be announced, but the priest who promises to remember the person will include them in his prayer. When parishioners want other parishioners to pray for someone, this intercession may be added to the intercession book near the baptistry. The Mass intention is distinct from intercessions. An intercession is prayer request. An intention is the personal dedication of the fruit of the Mass for the benefit of other persons. The request for an intercession is not the same as participating in the Mass. An intercession is a request made to God, distinct from sharing one's personal participation in the Mass for the benefit of another person.

When parishioners ask for an intention for parish Masses, they are asking the priest who celebrates the Mass to make a personal intention for his participation in the Mass for be the benefit of another person, the intention requested by the parishioner. Parishioners may ask that a Mass be offered for people living or dead. The priest who celebrates the Mass includes the intention as he offers the Mass. There is no limit on the fruit, the benefit of the Mass, the intention does not express an exclusion, it does not mean that the Mass will not benefit others who are not mentioned as intentions. The Mass intention is a sign of the communion of the faithful, the sharing of the faithful in the graces of the celebration of the Mass.

In the history of the Church, one of the ways the people assured the celebration of the Mass was to provide the costs for the celebration. It was an act of charity that benefited all who share in the Mass, those present at the Mass and all the faithful. The donation, given at the time one requested a Mass intention, was an act of charity and was understood as a commitment by the priest to celebrate the Mass, to assure the charitable gift was used for the purpose intended. The announcement of the Mass intention was a way to assure that the purpose of the charitable gift was completed.

Each person who participates in the sacrifice of the Mass, personally joins in the sacrifice of the Mass, the fruit of that personal participation may be offered for other persons. Both the priest and the people who offer the Mass may have intentions for the Mass. Because all who participate in the Mass may offer the fruit of their participation for the benefit of another person, it is especially good for parishioners to attend Mass and offer their personal intention for the Mass. One may request the priest to offer an intention for the Mass, but it is very important that the faithful themselves participate in the Mass and by offering the Mass for the benefit of another, as brothers and sisters in Christ, to enter into the communion that is realized when the sacrifice of the Cross is offered.
