In today's Gospel, we continue to hear Mark report the miraculous healings that Jesus performed in Galilee. The Gospel begins with Jesus healing a man with Jeprosy Jeprosy is a

Jesus healing a man with leprosy. Leprosy is a disfiguring, infectious skin disease that has been surrounded by many social and religious taboos throughout history. In 1873, the cause of leprosy, also known as Hansen's disease, was identified. We now know that leprosy is caused by a bacterial infection. Although it is infectious, modern medical studies have shown that transmission is more difficult than previously thought. Since the 1940s, medical treatments have been available, and the patient no longer needs to be isolated once long-term treatment has begun. In Jesus' time, however, religious and social taboos dictated the behavior of those with leprosy and other skin diseases. The Law of Moses provided for the examination of skin diseases by the priests, and if leprosy was identified, the person was declared unclean. People with leprosy lived in isolation from the community. They were instructed to rip their clothes and to announce their presence with loud cries when moving in the community. If the sores of leprosy healed, the Law of Moses provided a purification rite that permitted the person to return to the community. In today's Gospel, the man with leprosy took the initiative, approaching Jesus and asking for healing. In doing so, the leper violated the religious customs of the day by approaching a person who was clean. His request to Jesus can be interpreted as a courageous and daring act. The confidence of the leper in Jesus' ability to heal him is evident in the words of his request. But his words can also be read as a challenge to Jesus, asking just how far Jesus was willing to extend himself in order to heal someone. While healing the man, Jesus touched him, which also violated established social norms. This is an important sign of the depth of Jesus' compassion for the man and an Important statement about Jesus' interpretation of the Law of Moses. Although Jesus touched the leper, he did not break completely with the Law of Moses. He instructed the man not to tell anyone about the cure and told him to present himself to the priests as prescribed by the Law of Moses. The first instruction sounds nearly impossible to honor.


OMOM Scholarship Fundraiser

Carotid Artery Disease Screening - \$49

The CAROTID ARTERIES are arteries that supply oxygenated blood to the face and brain. This screening may detect the risk of fatty plaque build-up or restriction of blood flow in the Carotid Artery which is the #1 cause of

Thyroid Disease Screening - \$49

The THYROID gland controls how quickly the body makes proteins and sends hormones into the bloodstream that control energy. This screening may detect the pressure of cysts, masses and nodules which greatly affect your metabolism.

** There will be about 60,000+ new cases of thyroid cancer in the U.S. this year **



Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Screening - \$49

The ABDOMINAL AORTA is the main artery that comes off of the heart and supplies the body with oxygenated blood. This screening may detect the presence of aneurysm (Balloon in Artery) which typically show little to no symptoms and prove 90% fatal when aneurysm ruptures.

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm rupture is the 13th leading cause of death in the U.S.



Liver Disease Screening - \$49

The LIVER regulates most chemical levels in the blood, processes these chemicals, and breaks down nutrients and drugs into forms that are easier for the body to process. This screening may detect the presence of cysts, masses or enlargements which may cause the passage of disease from one organ to another.



Left Kidney Disease Screening - \$49

The LEFT KIDNEY performs essential functions by removing waste products from the blood and regulates water and fluid levels. This screening may detect the presence of cysts, masses, enlargements, kidney stones, and other obstructions affecting its function which could cause build-up of toxins and fluid in the blood.

Right Kidney Disease Screening - \$49

The RIGHT KIDNEY performs essential functions by removing waste products from the blood and regulates water and fluid levels. This screening may detect the presence of cysts, masses, enlargements, kidney stones, and other obstructions affecting its function which could cause build-up of toxins and fluid in the blood.



Gallbladder Disease Screening - \$49

The GALLBLADDER is the organ that receives bile from the liver and stores it until needed in the digestive system to break down fats and cholesterols. This screening may detect the presences of cysts, masses, gallstones, and other obstructions affecting is function which could cause build-up of toxins and fluid in the blood.

Spleen Screening - \$49

The SPLEEN plays an important role in regard to the red blood cells and the immune system. The spleen recycles iron in the bloodstream, removes old red blood cells and olds a reserve of blood in case of oxygen loss. This

SPO2 Level- Blood Saturate Levels - \$20

Oxygen-Rich blood travels through the arteries and arterial branches to deliver essential nutrients to your body. Below level blood oxygen leads to complications in the body, tissue and organs.


