**Understanding the Third Commandment in the Light of the Catechism of the Catholic Church**

(Part One)

The Third Commandment, "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy" (Exodus 20:8), holds a central place in the moral and spiritual life of Catholics. Far from being merely a day of rest or a break from labor, the Lord's Day is a sacred opportunity to enter into communion with God, His Church, and one another. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) offers a rich and detailed reflection on this commandment, particularly in paragraphs 2168–2195.

The command to keep the Sabbath day holy has its roots in the creation account and the Exodus experience: In Genesis, God rested on the seventh day after creating the world (cf. Genesis 2:2–3). This divine rest is not inactivity, but the enjoyment of the goodness of creation. In Deuteronomy 5:15, the Sabbath is also tied to the Israelites' liberation from slavery in Egypt, a weekly remembrance of God's saving action. The Catechism highlights both aspects: "God's action is the model for human action. If God 'rested and was refreshed' on the seventh day, man too ought to 'rest' and should let others, especially the poor, 'be refreshed.'" (CCC 2172).

For us Christians, the Sabbath was transformed into Sunday, the "Lord's Day," because it was the day on which Jesus rose from the dead. The Resurrection marks the beginning of the new creation, and Sunday became the weekly celebration of that new life. The Catechism explains: "Sunday is expressly distinguished from the Sabbath which it follows chronologically every week; for Christians its ceremonial observance replaces that of the Sabbath." (CCC 2175). Thus, Sunday is not merely the "Christian Sabbath," but the eighth day, the day of new creation, and the fulfillment of the Sabbath.

The most essential way Catholics keep Sunday holy is by participating in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian life, and the Catechism stresses: "The Sunday celebration of the Lord's Day and his Eucharist is at the heart of the Church's life." (CCC 2177) Participation in Mass is not just a communal event or a personal devotion, it is an obligation for all Catholics, unless excused for a serious reason (such as illness or caring for infants). Deliberate failure to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation is considered a grave sin (CCC 2181). Beyond Mass, Catholics are encouraged to engage in prayer, spiritual reading, and works of charity as ways to sanctify the day.

Today's Gospel sounds puzzling to contemporary readers, but it can be made less so by considering the economic system which stands behind the parable. A steward is dismissed because he is squandering his master's property. He is called dishonest because he is not serving the interests of the rich man, his employer. In response the steward, in an attempt to ensure favor for himself among the rich man's debtors, brokers repayment of the rich man's loans by foregoing the interest and fees that had been levied to line the steward's pockets. It is this action, in which the steward puts aside his greed and takes the longer perspective in order to enhance his security, which is commended by the rich man. The passage concludes with three morals for the listeners. The first exhorts the listener to be prudent about the use of wealth. Like the steward in the parable, those who would follow Jesus must put transitory affairs in proper perspective. Christians should handle the affairs of temporal life with an eye toward eternal life. The second concerns trustworthiness. Those who can be trusted in small things can also be trusted in great things. If Christians handle money and other passing things responsibly, then they can also be trusted with the affairs of the Kingdom of God. Finally, Jesus tells his listeners that no one can serve two masters simultaneously. God must be put ahead of money.

## Saint Pio of Pietrelcina September 23

FRANCESCO FORGIONE WAS BORN IN 1887 IN ITALY TO A PEASANT FAMILY, ONE OF SEVEN CHILDREN. HE WAS VERY PIOUS EVEN AS A CHILD.

HE ENTERED A MONASTERY AT AGE 16 AND WAS ORDAINED AT 23. HE BECAME KNOWN AS PADRE (FATHER) PIO.

PADRE PIO WAS FORCED TO JOIN THE ARMY, BUT WAS DISCHARGED BECAUSE HE WAS SICK.

HE WAS SENT TO A FAR MONASTERY AND THERE HE RECEIVED CHRIST'S STIGMATA.

PADRE PIO SUFFERED GREATLY FROM THE WOUNDS BUT HE WAS STILL CHEERFUL.

SOON THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE WERE COMING TO ST. PIO FOR CONFESSION. HE COULD SEE WHAT WAS IN THEIR SOULS.




