A priest friend of mine received a call from a family whose elderly mother was dying. Within thirty minutes, he was at her bedside, offering the consolation of the sacraments, anointing her with the oil of the sick, and commending her soul to God. She passed not long after, and for months, her family spoke of their deep gratitude for his presence. When I phoned him to commend his faithful ministry, he simply said, "I was just doing my job." His words brought to mind Jesus' teaching this week in Luke 17:10: **"So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty.'"** In a world that often seeks recognition and applause, the Lord invites us into a different mindset — one of humble service. The priest did not see his response as extraordinary; he saw it as a grace to fulfill his vocation. How tempting it is to seek affirmation for doing what I ought to do! Yet Jesus reminds us that true discipleship is not about grandstanding but about quiet faithfulness. It is enough to have served. It is enough to have loved. It is enough to be grateful that we were given the chance to do our duty in the first place. Whether in priesthood, parenthood, or any vocation, what peace-soaked freedom there is in simply doing what is asked of us. No more, no less. Jesus, that is how you quietly love us.

27º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 5 de octubre de 2025



A lo largo del Evangelio encontramos diferentes pasajes donde Jesús elogia a las personas que tienen fe. Por ejemplo: *"Levántate, tu fe te ha salvado"* (Lucas 17:19). Un buen reto podría ser darnos a la tarea de leer los cuatro evangelios y tomar nota de estos pasajes, para así poder comparar a las personas de aquel tiempo con nosotros hoy, en lo que respecta a la fe. ¿En qué creemos actualmente? ¿Cómo podemos medir la fe que hay en nosotros? ¿Seguimos a Jesús solo para pedirle favores y que nos haga milagros, o porque de verdad tenemos fe en Él? El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, en sus números 176 y 184, nos dice lo siguiente sobre la fe: *"La fe es una adhesión personal del hombre entero a Dios que se revela. Comprende una adhesión de la inteligencia y de la voluntad a la revelación que Dios ha hecho de sí mismo mediante sus obras y sus palabras"*. Y añade: *"La fe es un gusto anticipado del conocimiento que nos hará bienaventurados en la vida futura"*. La vida de fe no se construye en solitario. Para su crecimiento, intervienen muchos factores. El primero nos fue dado desde el bautismo, y nuestros padres y abuelos participaron de primera mano en su desarrollo. La comunidad de fe es otro factor esencial. Después, el crecimiento de la fe depende de cada uno. Hoy, hagamos la misma petición que hicieron los apóstoles: *"Señor, aumentanos la fe"*. Seguramente, la respuesta será la misma. ¿Verdad?

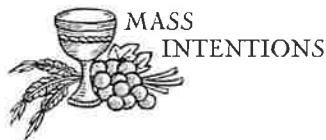

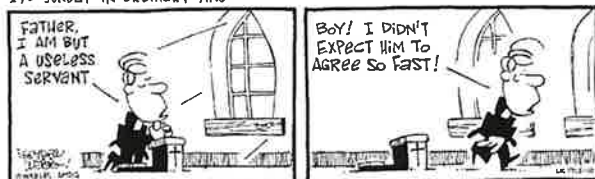

PRACTICING CATHOLIC

The Father Who Knows What You Want

It's easy to give your kid what he's asking for. It's hard to give him what he wants. If a kid asks to eat an ice cream cone, there's nothing wrong with giving him one. But if he's grumpily demanding an ice cream cone at 7:45 in the morning, what he wants — whether he realizes it or not — is some protein and whole grains and a little encouragement to get him going on his day. So you give him eggs and toast, and you watch him struggle to accept it. Sometimes he does and sometimes he doesn't, but either way, you'll be here. You'll forgive him for whatever names he calls you and you'll put the healthy breakfast in the fridge, waiting for him when he's ready to eat it. "Increase my faith." I've said it to God plenty of times, imagining a prayer life that is effortless and a sacramental life that is uncomplicated, an acceptance of truth that is unshakeable. Easy faith — that's what I'm asking for, and lots of it, please. But easy faith isn't faith at all, and faith that you aren't strong enough to hold will break your arms. And what God will never do is say, "Sure, kiddo, here you go," and pass off a false gift as the real thing, just to make us both feel good. He won't hand me something I'm not strong enough to hold. That would be a classic lazy-father move. That would be an ice-cream-cone-at-7:45 a.m. move. Instead, He watches carefully while I navigate the bumpy terrain of the spiritual life, ready to whisper directions in my ear. He holds his breath while the challenges of this world create deep grooves in my soul — and then He irrigates those grooves with the life-giving waters of grace, transforming them into valleys of consolation and respite. Sometimes I call Him names. Sometimes I refuse what He's offering. It's not what I asked for, after all. But it's what I want. Luckily, He knows that better than me.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Be Careful What You Wish For

You've probably heard the phrase "Be careful what you wish for." In my experience, it's not often utilized with a lot of charity. You usually hear it said as a warning. The unspoken sentiment behind it is this: *You're not as strong as you think you are.* As Christians we shouldn't be surprised to look ourselves in the mirror and own that reality. We are not as strong as we may think. We are time and time again shocked and dismayed by our own weaknesses, our own fears, our own shortcomings. Should we be careful what we wish for? The apostles asked Jesus to increase their faith, and He told them it would take work. It would take suffering. It would take patience. But He didn't say it was impossible. As everyday stewards, we need to continue wishing recklessly. Ask God for anything and everything, come to Him with all your needs. Beg Him for grace without limit. When we hear God's voice, it does not always say what we want to hear. But it always speaks the perfect truth. If it tells us of a hardship that we think we cannot bear, let us take solace in the knowledge that we are the stewards — not the landlord.

El Padre que Sabe lo que Quieres

Es fácil darle a tu hijo lo que está pidiendo. Es difícil darle lo que quiere. Si un niño pide comer un cono de helado, no hay nada de malo en darle uno. Pero si está exigiendo de mal humor un cono de helado a las 7:45 de la mañana, lo que quiere, ya sea que se dé cuenta o no, es algo de proteína y granos integrales y un poco de aliento para seguir adelante con su día. Así que le das huevos y pan tostado, y lo ves luchar para aceptarlo. A veces lo hace y a veces no, pero, de cualquier manera, estarás aquí. Lo perdonarás por los apodos que te diga y pondrás el desayuno saludable en la nevera, esperándolo cuando esté listo para comerlo. "Aumenta mi fe". Se lo he dicho a Dios muchas veces, imaginando una vida de oración que no requiere esfuerzo y una vida sacramental que no tiene complicaciones, una aceptación de la verdad que es inquebrantable. Fe fácil, eso es lo que pido, y mucha, por favor. Pero la fe fácil no es fe en absoluto, y la fe en que no eres lo suficientemente fuerte para sostenerla te romperá los brazos. Y lo que Dios nunca hará, es decir: "Claro, niño, aquí tienes", y hacer pasar un regalo falso como si fuera real, solo para que ambos nos sintamos bien. No me entregará algo para lo que no sea lo suficientemente fuerte para sostener. Esa sería una jugada clásica de padre perezoso. Eso sería un movimiento de cono de helado a las 7:45 a.m. En cambio, Él observa cuidadosamente mientras navego por el terreno accidentado de la vida espiritual, listo para susurrarme instrucciones al oído. Él contiene la respiración mientras los desafíos de este mundo crean profundos surcos en mi alma, y luego riega esos surcos con las aguas vivificantes de la gracia, transformándolos en valles de consuelo y respiro. A veces lo llamo por apodos. A veces rechazo lo que Él me ofrece. Después de todo, no es lo que pedí. Pero es lo que quiero. Por suerte, Él lo sabe mejor que yo.

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

Ten cuidado con lo que deseas

Probablemente hayas escuchado la frase "Ten cuidado con lo que deseas." En mi experiencia, no se utiliza a menudo con mucha caridad. Por lo general, lo escuchas decir como una advertencia. El sentimiento oculto detrás de esto es este: no eres tan fuerte como crees que eres. Como cristianos, no debería sorprendernos mirarnos en el espejo y reconocer esa realidad. No somos tan fuertes como pensamos. Estamos una y otra vez conmocionados y consternados por nuestras propias debilidades, nuestros propios miedos, nuestras propias deficiencias. ¿Debemos tener cuidado con lo que deseamos? Los apóstoles le pidieron a Jesús que aumentara su fe, y Él les dijo que eso requeriría trabajo. Se necesitaría sufrimiento. Se necesitaría paciencia. Pero Él no dijo que fuera imposible. Como corresponsables diarios, debemos seguir deseando imprudentemente. Pídele a Dios cualquier cosa y todo, ven a Él con todas tus necesidades. Ruégale gracia sin límite. Cuando escuchamos la voz de Dios, no siempre dice lo que queremos escuchar. Pero siempre dice la verdad perfecta. Si nos habla de una dificultad que pensamos que no podemos soportar, consolémonos sabiendo que somos los corresponsables, no el propietario.
