

**Our Lord Jesus Christ
King of the Universe
November 23, 2025**



Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run, I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all. I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, **"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42).** That word — *remember* — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, **"Today you will be with me in paradise."** He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, **"You will be with me."** That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love. What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him — paradise begins even today.



Nuestro Señor Jesucristo

Rey Del Universo

23 de noviembre de 2025



Con esta solemnidad, la Iglesia recuerda la soberanía de Jesucristo, Rey del Universo: *"La entrada de Jesús en Jerusalén manifiesta la venida del Reino que el Rey-Mesías, recibido en su ciudad por los niños y por los humildes de corazón, va a llevar a cabo por la Pascua de su Muerte y de su Resurrección"* (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, n. 570). Jesús, Tú eres nuestro Rey, desde la cruz donde cruelmente moriste por nosotros para salvarnos. ¡Bendito y adorado seas para siempre! *"Cuando nuestro Salvador estaba colgado en la gloriosa cruz, estaban con Él dos ladrones. ¿Qué se puede deducir de esto? Sin lugar a dudas, se trataba de una burla, de acuerdo con el plan tomado por los judíos, pero también era un cumplimiento de la profecía: 'Le daré su parte entre los grandes y con los poderosos repartirá despojos, pues se entregó indefenso a la muerte y fue tenido por un malhechor' (Isaías 53:12) ... Él pagó las deudas por nosotros, cargó con nuestros pecados y fue azotado por nosotros, según está escrito: 'Por sus sufrimientos fuimos curados, pues Él cargó con nuestros pecados' (Isaías 53:5). Y nos libró de las enfermedades del alma" (San Cirilo de Alejandría [375-444], Comentario al Evangelio de Lucas).* ¡Que viva Cristo Rey!





The King Who Hangs Beside Us

We love to hate the bad thief. Ancient Christian tradition has called him by the name "Gestas." In contrast to Dismas, "the good thief" who recognized and repented of his own sins, Gestas goes down bitter and swinging. With his last breaths he taunts Jesus, poking fun at the absurdity of a deity who allows himself to be crucified by mortals. "Are you not the Christ?" he sneers. But his final words betray an undercurrent of desperation. Of terror. In the end, Gestas just wants Jesus to save him. It's taken me a few hundred read-throughs of this Gospel passage to finally understand a painful truth: I am Gestas. I hang from my own cross — we all do, in this life. But I'm lucky enough that my cross is right beside Jesus, because the sacraments bring him as close to me as he was to Gestas — closer, even. How unfathomable is the mercy of God. And yet, I am not grateful. I don't rejoice at my proximity to my Lord, to the flesh and blood that have bought my salvation. I don't do what I should do, and what Dismas does. I don't say, "Wherever you are King, please, let me be your subject. Wherever you are going, please, take me with you." "Are you not the Christ?" I say instead. And what I mean is exactly what Gestas meant: "Get me down. Take this cross away. I don't want it. I can't take it." What a tragedy it would be, if all Christ had to offer us was an easier life. None of this looks like anyone thought it would. The long-foretold Messiah, whose majesty and might would eradicate violence and establish peace. The guy who was going to make everything okay again. The King of the Jews. And here he hangs: bleeding and dying and doing what looks like nothing. Staring at Gestas. Staring at me. Staring at you. What will you say to him?

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

How Would You Rule Your Kingdom?

It would be kind of awesome to be a king or queen! Absolute rule, untold wealth, and people answering your every beck and call are things that wouldn't be half bad. Of course, I would be a benevolent monarch, and I would hope that all my subjects would love me. They could cheer me as I came out of the palace, and I think my popularity ratings in the polls would be through the roof. But if they weren't, that would be fine, too, because I would rule the kingdom. And that means no throwing me out of office. Talk about job security! As great as that sounds, the King of kings could have had all that as well, but instead, he chose quite a different path. He gave up absolute rule so all his subjects could have the free will to choose to follow him. He gave up untold wealth so he could be treated like a common criminal and receive a death sentence. He gave up having servants at his disposal so he could be the servant of all his subjects himself. Yes, he was the King of kings, but he was nothing like a typical king. As much as I think it would be great to be a king myself, I would rather emulate this King instead. Who would you rather be like? You could have it all or choose to give away everything. You could choose a path of luxury or a path of trial. You could be respected by many or find yourself in a culture that increasingly finds you objectionable. Who would you rather be like? Do you arrive at an answer quickly, or do you need some time to think about it? The King of kings awaits your reply.

El Rey que Cuelga a Nuestro Lado

Nos encanta odiar al ladrón malo. La antigua tradición cristiana lo ha llamado con el nombre de "Gestas". A diferencia de Dismas, "el buen ladrón" que reconoció y se arrepintió de sus propios pecados, Gestas cae amargado y oscilante. Con sus últimos alientos se burla de Jesús, burlándose de lo absurdo de una deidad que se deja crucificar por los mortales. "¿No eres tú el Cristo?", se burla. Pero sus últimas palabras delatan un trasfondo de desesperación. De terror. Al final, Gestas solo quiere que Jesús lo salve. Me han llevado unos cientos de lecturas de este pasaje del Evangelio para entender finalmente una verdad dolorosa: soy Gestas. Me cuelgo de mi propia cruz, todos lo hacemos, en esta vida. Pero tengo la suerte de que mi cruz está justo al lado de Jesús, porque los sacramentos lo acercan tanto a mí como lo estuvo a Gestas, incluso más cerca. ¡Cuán insondable es la misericordia de Dios! Y, sin embargo, no estoy agradecida. No me regocijo por mi proximidad a mi Señor, a la carne y la sangre que han comprado mi salvación. No hago lo que debería hacer, y lo que hace Dismas. Yo no digo: "Dondequiera que seas rey, por favor, permíteme ser tu súbdito. A donde quiera que vayas, por favor, llévame contigo". "¿No eres tú el Cristo?" Digo en cambio. Y lo que quiero decir es exactamente lo que Gestas quiso decir: "Bájame. Quitame esta cruz. No la quiero. No puedo soportarla". ¡Qué tragedia sería, si todo lo que Cristo tuviera para ofrecernos fuera una vida más fácil! Nada de esto parece como alguien pensó que lo sería. El Mesías largamente predicho, cuya majestad y poderío erradicarían la violencia y establecerían la paz. El tipo que iba a hacer que todo volviera a estar bien. El Rey de los Judíos. Y aquí está: sangrando y muriendo y haciendo lo que parece no ser nada. Mirando a Gestas. Mirándome fijamente. Mirándote fijamente. ¿Qué le dirás?

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

¿Cómo Gobernarías tu Reino?

¡Sería increíble ser un rey o una reina! Poder absoluto, riqueza indecible y personas que respondan a cada una de tus llamadas son cosas que no serían tan malas. Por supuesto, yo sería un monarca benevolente, y esperaría que todos mis súbditos me amaran. Me aclamarían cuando saliera del palacio, y creo que mi índice de popularidad en las urnas saldría por los techos. Pero si no fuera así, también estaría bien, porque yo gobernaría el reino. Por mucho que piense que sería genial ser un rey, preferiría emular a este Rey. ¿Cómo quién preferirías ser? Podrías tenerlo todo o elegir dar todo. Podrías elegir un camino de lujo o un camino de prueba. Podrías ser respetado por muchos o encontrarte en una cultura que te encuentra cada vez más objetable. ¿Cómo quién preferirías ser? ¿Llegas a una respuesta rápidamente, o necesitas algo de tiempo para pensarlo? El Rey de los reyes espera tu respuesta.

VIVIR LA LITURGIA

Nuestro rey lleva una corona de espinas, no una corona de oro. Su gloria no está en las riquezas, sino en el sufrimiento. Su ley está escrita en su propia sangre, derramada por amor a nosotros. ¿Comprendemos el don que es estar sujetos a tal rey?


