**4th Sunday of Advent
December 21, 2025**



A priest friend recently told me a remarkable story. One of his cousins reported having a vivid dream in which an angel told him the family needed to exhume their grandmother's body from a cemetery in New York and return it to her birthplace in Romania. She had been dead nearly ten years. As you might expect, the family thought it was, well, crazy. But astonishingly they exhumed her body. It was incorrupt, showing no signs of decomposition. That experience sparked healing, faith, and reconciliation throughout the family. In this Sunday's Gospel, Joseph also receives a dream. He's confused, afraid. But in the quiet of sleep, God speaks: **"Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home"** (Matthew 1:20). When he wakes, Joseph acts. He doesn't overanalyze or dismiss the message. He trusts, and acts. God still speaks — not necessarily through literal dreams but through those deeper intuitions of the heart. St. Ignatius of Loyola taught that God's voice draws us into peace, courage, and love. But we have to listen to it. Advent is a time for stillness. As we prepare for Christ's coming, we're invited to enter that quiet space where God's voice can be heard. When and how do you become most receptive to God? Is it in silence? In prayer? In nature? At Mass? This week, go there. Be still. Listen. And like Joseph, have the courage to act on what God shows you.

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED! – CONNECT WITH TRADITION AND GROW YOUR FAITH

Las Posadas, Explained!

Las Posadas, typically celebrated between Dec. 16 and Dec. 25, is a Mexican tradition which recreates the Holy Family's search for lodging in Bethlehem. A *novenario*, or a devotion which extends over a period of nine days, Las Posadas is a celebration of anticipation for the birth of Jesus Christ, who seeks refuge in the heart of every man and woman. Each night of Las Posadas, a couple portraying Mary and Joseph knocks on the doors of different homes looking for a place to stay. Traditionally, the Holy Family is accompanied by a procession of people singing hymns and bearing candles who stand outside the home as they are denied entry again and again. Finally, they come to the "inn," the house or church that welcomes them. Carols are sung, a feast is enjoyed and star-shaped *piñatas* are broken open. Still practiced in Mexico today, Las Posadas has also become an important cultural and spiritual touchstone for communities of Mexican immigrants who have moved abroad.

CONÉCTATE CON LA TRADICIÓN Y CRECE EN TU FE

Las Posadas, ¡Explicadas!

Las Posadas, que se celebran normalmente entre el 16 y el 25 de diciembre, son una tradición mexicana que recrea la búsqueda de alojamiento de la Sagrada Familia en Belén. Un *novenario*, o una devoción que se extiende por un período de nueve días. Las Posadas son una celebración de anticipación por el nacimiento de Jesucristo, que busca refugio en el corazón de cada hombre y mujer. Cada noche de Las Posadas, una pareja que interpreta a María y José toca las puertas de diferentes casas en busca de un lugar para quedarse. Tradicionalmente, la Sagrada Familia es acompañada por una procesión de personas que cantan himnos y portan velas que se paran fuera de la casa cuando se les niega la entrada una y otra vez. Finalmente, llegan a la "posada", la casa o iglesia que les da la bienvenida. Se cantan villancicos, se disfruta de un festín y se quiebran piñatas en forma de estrella. Todavía practicado en México hoy en día, Las Posadas también se han convertido en una importante piedra de toque cultural y espiritual para las comunidades de inmigrantes mexicanos que se han mudado al extranjero.

4º Domingo de Adviento 21 de diciembre de 2025



¿Dónde está nuestra esperanza en este tercer domingo de Adviento? En este último domingo de Adviento, Emmanuel, Dios con nosotros, está por nacer. Esta es la Buena Noticia que debe alegrarnos: comprender que el nacimiento de Jesús es la garantía de que Dios cumple su promesa con la llegada de su Hijo al mundo. El Evangelio nos da la oportunidad de contemplar el paso de la historia de la salvación en la humanidad. Dios se mezcla entre nosotros, se une a nuestros triunfos y fracasos. Ya no hay nada que temer: Jesús llega para iluminar nuestras tinieblas. "La virgen concebirá y dará a luz un hijo, y le pondrán por nombre Emmanuel, que significa: Dios con nosotros" (Mateo 1:23). También la liturgia de hoy nos permite admirar a José, esposo de la Virgen, y tomar ejemplo de su valor, de su capacidad para guardar silencio y de su forma de actuar ante ella. José tomó la difícil decisión, en medio de la situación que vivía, de no difamar a María y repudiarla en secreto. Protegerla a ella y al niño fue su prioridad. "Tú eres el que pondrás el nombre al hijo que ella dará a luz. Y lo llamarás Jesús, porque él salvará a su pueblo de sus pecados" (Mateo 1:21). Gracias a esa prudencia y justo silencio de José, Jesús pudo nacer de María. ¿Cómo es mi prudencia ante los acontecimientos que atravieso en mi vida? ¿Sé guardar secretos para no destruir la vida de los demás? ¿He guardado espacios de silencio en este Adviento que me ayuden a mi crecimiento espiritual?



PRACTICING CATHOLIC

The First Transfiguration

I imagine Joseph waking up the morning after the dream, blinking in the dim half-light of the dawn. One day, decades from now, the baby his wife carries will stand on a mountaintop. His face will shine like the sun, and those who look upon him will fall down upon their own faces in fear. We call this the transfiguration, and Joseph won't be there to see it. But that doesn't matter. What those men will learn on the mountaintop, Joseph already knows. He learned it last night. Today, he shrugs off the remnants of slumber and stands up. "Rise, and do not be afraid." This is what the baby — a baby no longer, but a man now, one in the last days of his life — will say to his companions on the mountain a few decades from now. They will look up to see him standing there the same as he always was, and they will realize that he did not change at all. They did. "Do not be afraid." This is what the angel said last night as he revealed to Joseph the will of God: that Joseph take Mary and the Child as his own, despite having so many reasons not to do so. And today Joseph wakes up and the world is the same as it always was: Mary is pregnant, and the Child does not belong to him. No, the world has not changed. Joseph has. He rises, and goes to Mary. Advent is drawing quickly to a close, and Christmas is coming soon. The change is upon us. Do we rise to accept it, or do we fall on our faces in fear?

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

The name Emmanuel means, "God is with us." This is a title we use for Jesus frequently during the Advent and Christmas season, but its impact should stay with us throughout the year. The Incarnation, God becoming human in the person of Jesus Christ, broke into our world in a profound manner that means that God is not only with us, God is us. The relationship offered to you and I by God is now more intimate and meaningful because of the birth of Jesus Christ. God is truly with us and our goal is to be truly present to him at all times. To be *prayerful* is an important characteristic of an Everyday Steward. It means more than reciting prayers and setting aside ten minutes a day. Our goal is to experience the presence of God throughout the day in the ordinary and extraordinary moments of living. Offering all the actions and moments of the day to God as we awake, and then examining our day before we go to sleep at night, help lead us closer toward that goal. When we begin to sense God's presence at all times, and we realize that being with God does not mean one of us has to be talking all the time, then we can truly attest to our reality in a quiet voice at any time, "Emmanuel, God is with us."

LIVE THE LITURGY

Sometimes we want God's instructions to be clear and precise — like the angel in Joseph's dream. But Joseph's understanding was only as strong as his devotion to God's will. If we give our lives to God as Joseph did, we will know what he asks of us.

La Primera Transfiguración

Me imagino a José despertando a la mañana siguiente del sueño, parpadeando en la penumbra del amanecer. Un día, dentro de décadas, el bebé que lleva su esposa estará en la cima de una montaña. Su rostro resplandecerá como el sol, y los que lo miren caerán sobre sus propios rostros de miedo. Llamamos a esto la transfiguración, y José no estará allí para verlo. Pero eso no importa. Lo que esos hombres aprenderán en la cima de la montaña, José ya lo sabe. Lo aprendió anoche. Hoy, se sacude los restos de la somnolencia y se levanta. "Levántate, y no tengas miedo". Esto es lo que el bebé —ya no un bebé, sino un hombre ahora, uno en los últimos días de su vida— dirá a sus compañeros en la montaña dentro de unas décadas. Levantarán la vista para verlo de pie, como siempre fue, y se darán cuenta de que no cambió en absoluto. Ellos lo hicieron. "No tengáis miedo". Esto es lo que dijo el ángel anoche al revelar a José la voluntad de Dios: que José tome a María y al Niño como suyos, a pesar de tener tantas razones para no hacerlo. Y hoy José despierta y el mundo es el mismo de siempre: María está embarazada y el Niño no le pertenece. No, el mundo no ha cambiado. José lo ha hecho. Se levanta y se dirige a María. El Adviento está llegando rápidamente a su fin y la Navidad se acerca pronto. El cambio está sobre nosotros. ¿Nos levantamos para aceptarlo, o caemos sobre nuestros propios rostros de miedo?

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

El nombre Emanuel significa, "Dios está con nosotros". Usamos este título frecuentemente para referirnos a Jesús durante las temporadas del Adviento y la Navidad, pero su influencia debe quedar con nosotros a lo largo de todo año. La Encarnación, cuando Dios toma su forma humana, o sea Jesús, entró en el mundo de una manera tan profunda que nos indica que no solamente está Dios con nosotros, pero que Dios está dentro de nosotros. Dios nos ofrece una relación que ahora es más íntima e importante debido al nacimiento de Jesús. Verdaderamente Dios está con nosotros, y nuestro deber es permanecer presente a Él para siempre. Ser *contemplativos* es una característica importante para un discipulado diario. Es más que hacer oración por diez minutos diarios. Nuestra meta es sentir la presencia de Dios durante cada día —durante los momentos ordinarios y extraordinarios. Ofrecerle a Dios todas nuestras acciones y todos los momentos del día cuando nos despertamos, y después examinar nuestro día antes de acostarnos, nos ayuda acercarnos a esa meta. Solamente cuando nos demos cuenta de la presencia de Dios a todas horas, y nos demos cuenta de estar con Dios no significa que siempre uno u otro tienen que estar hablando, entonces en una voz serena nos podemos decir que, "Emanuel, Dios está con nosotros".

VIVIR LA LITURGIA

A veces queremos que las instrucciones de Dios sean claras y precisas, como el ángel en el sueño de José. Pero el entendimiento de José era tan fuerte como su devoción a la voluntad de Dios. Si entregamos nuestras vidas a Dios como lo hizo José, sabremos lo que él nos pide.
