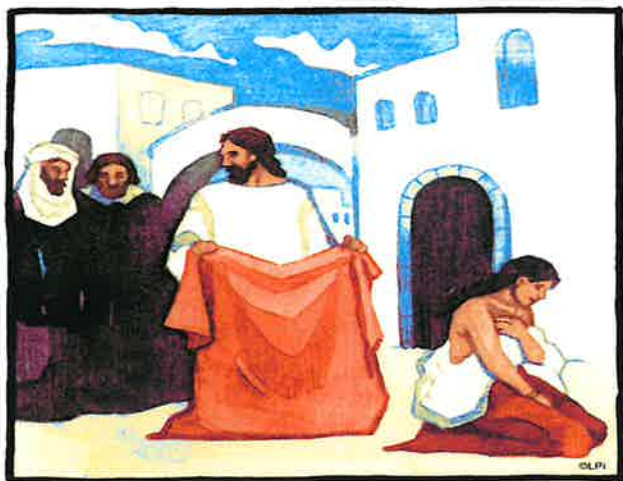

5th Sunday of Lent April 6, 2025



“The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle” (John 8:3). Why do they make her stand in the middle? Why not expose her on the periphery? The reason is something that affects us practically every day. The center is what stabilizes a community’s identity. We humans tend to center ourselves around an accused and condemned victim — though we rarely admit it. This renews our fragile communities and our power as those who weaponize the accusation. This is effective because it is often a victim who represents something truly dangerous for the group. In this case, adultery stands for the breakdown of a community and those within it, because it forces questions like: who is my father? Whose child is this? Is this child one of us, or that of an outsider? The accusers place the adulteress in the center because their community, like most, is built around turning an enemy into a victim. Once you understand this, you’ll see it almost anywhere humans group together (families, politics, workplaces, sports, schools, etc.). The good news is Jesus exposes this dynamic by deftly pointing out the sin-infected hearts of everyone besides the woman. They all leave, symbolizing the breakdown of the old order, and she is **“left alone before him.”** A new community has begun, structured around the merciful love of Christ.

What is in your center? What is in the center of our parish and family communities? Strive to center on Christ’s forgiveness, and we experience the new, lasting community we call the Church.

SEMINARIAN MOVIE NIGHT

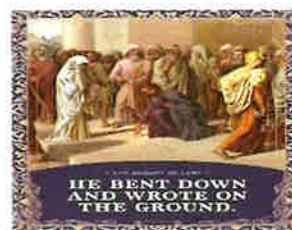

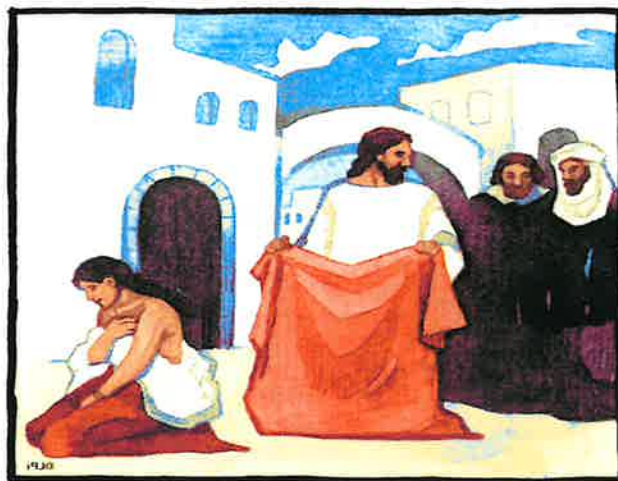

Así que él le ruega, y nos ruega a nosotros: déjate cambiar. Deja que la misericordia te transforme. Vete, y no peques más.



5º Domingo de Cuaresma 6 de abril de 2025



Estamos llegando al final de la Cuaresma. Se termina el Jueves Santo con la Misa de la Cena del Señor. *"En la Cuaresma, la Iglesia renueva la llamada a la conversión. El hombre nuevo nace en el Bautismo. Dios nos hace sus hijos y nos incorpora a Cristo y a su iglesia. Del corazón del hombre renovado, según Dios, proceden los comportamientos buenos. Estamos llamados a abandonar los comportamientos del pecado y a fijar la mirada en lo esencial"* (Papa Francisco). ¿Qué sería lo esencial? Lo primero sería buscar dentro de nosotros mismos para dar respuesta, comenzando con mis actos y los de los demás. A veces, somos tan duros para juzgar. Aplicamos la ley de la piedra sin piedad. Duros de corazón, difíciles para practicar el perdón. Sin embargo, Tú, Señor, me perdonas con la blandura de un Evangelio escrito en el suelo, es decir, en tierra blanda. Aprovechemos hoy para pedir a Jesús la enseñanza de la misericordia. Esa misma misericordia aplicada a la mujer sorprendida en adulterio. ¿Qué debió haber sentido aquella persona acusada a la pregunta de Jesús? *"Mujer, ¿dónde están? ¿Ninguno te ha condenado? Ella contestó: Ninguno, Señor. Y Jesús le dijo: Tampoco yo te condeno. Vete y en adelante no vuelvas a pecar"* (Juan 8:10-11). Pues bien, el reto de la conversión es no volver a pecar. Es aprender día a día a ser buenos, con nosotros mismos y con los demás.

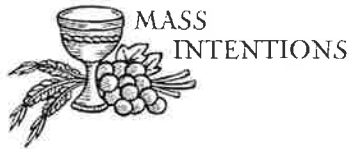

PRACTICING CATHOLIC

Mini Reflection: Too often, we don't care about righteousness or truth. We just care about being right. We have a terrible tendency to see only decisions, and in doing so we dehumanize the people behind them. But when God looks at us, he sees more than the worst decisions we've ever made.

The Allure of Being Right

It wasn't a real question. "The law of Moses says we should stone her. What do you say?" the Pharisees asked Jesus as they brought the adulterous woman before him. But they weren't *really* asking. They didn't care what Jesus' answer was. They didn't ask his opinion because they wanted to know. They asked because they wanted to use his words against him. Righteousness, truth — that wasn't the goal. The goal was being right. And in the middle of the whole scene, dragged before Jesus, used as a literal prop in this staged drama, is a woman. A real flesh-and-blood woman. I find myself wanting to know more about her. She had been "caught in the act," they claimed, but I wonder what that even means. With whom was this act committed, and what were the reasons for her participation in it? Was she coerced? Was she scared? Was she confused? Was it really a cut-and-dry, black-and-white situation of adultery, of lust, of making the wrong decision? We will never know the answers to these questions, and it doesn't matter — it's not our business. God knows the answers. God knows the truth of the matter: what she did, what she chose, what she felt. Because she wasn't a prop to Him. She was a person. When God looks at us, he sees more than the worst decisions we've ever made. I worry that we use one another as props even today, when we try like the Pharisees to illustrate "What is Right." We have a terrible tendency to see only decisions, and in doing so we dehumanize the people behind them. Too often, we don't care about righteousness or truth. We just care about being right.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Make a Way

What's your comfort zone: emotionally, professionally, personally? We all have one. But did you realize that you can have one spiritually? Think about what you like and what you don't particularly enjoy when it comes to church, prayer, and liturgy. We all have "those songs" we crinkle our noses at, either because they're too modern or too old-fashioned. We all have "those people" in our parish whose ideas we aren't so sure about, whether that's because they're trying to change too much or because they seem always to be looking toward the past. Also, when was the last time you sat on the OTHER side of the church during Mass? As much as we may not want to admit it, even (and especially) as people of God, we get deeply attached to our own personal comfort zones — and we tend to view those outside with distrust. But what if God had a comfort zone? What if He viewed us, in our sin and our misery, as too "far away" from Himself to reach? Thankfully, our God is a God who "opens a way in the sea and a path in the mighty waters." Our God is a God who does "something new." The call to stewardship demands that we look outside of ourselves. Our thoughts, our opinions, our preferences — these things are not important to the steward. Even if there is a vast, dry desert of discord, or a seemingly endless wasteland of opposing views between us and our neighbor, God challenges us to "make a way" out of our comfort zone. that together we may announce His praise.

CATÓLICO PRACTICANTE

Reflexión breve: Muy a menudo, no estamos interesados en la justicia o en la verdad. Lo que nos importa es tener la razón. Tenemos una tendencia terrible a ver únicamente las decisiones y al hacer eso deshumanizamos a las personas que las toman. Sin embargo, Dios nos ve y él ve más allá de las peores decisiones que alguna vez hemos tomado.

La fascinación de tener la razón

No fue una verdadera pregunta. "La ley de Moisés manda que la apedreemos. ¿Qué dices tú?", preguntaron los fariseos a Jesús mientras le llevaban a la mujer adúltera a sus pies. Pero, ellos en realidad, no le estaban haciendo una pregunta a Jesús, ni les importaba cuál sería la respuesta de Jesús, no le preguntaron su opinión porque quisieran saber. Los fariseos le preguntaron pues querían usar las palabras de Jesús en su contra. La justicia y la verdad no eran el propósito. Solamente querían dejar claro que ellos tenían razón. En medio de toda esta escena, arrastrada delante de Jesús, utilizada como una verdadera protagonista en este drama escenificado, está una mujer. Una mujer en verdad, de carne y hueso. Me encuentro personalmente queriendo saber más acerca de ella. Los fariseos aseguraron que la "habían encontrado en el acto", pero me pregunto qué significa eso. ¿Con quién se cometió este acto y los motivos por los cuales ella fue parte de eso? ¿Acaso la obligaron? ¿Tenía ella miedo? ¿Estaba confundida? ¿En realidad fue una situación a secas, claramente de adulterio, un acto de lujuria, de tomar la peor decisión? Nunca sabremos las respuestas a esas preguntas, y no importa; no es asunto nuestro. Dios sabe las respuestas. Dios sabe la verdad de todo el asunto: lo que ella hizo, lo que decidió, qué sintió. Porque para Jesús, ella no era una actriz, sino que ella era una persona. Cuando Dios nos ve, Él ve algo más allá de las peores decisiones que alguna vez hemos tomado. Me preocupa que nosotros nos usemos entre sí como protagonistas aún hoy en día, cuando intentamos, igual que los fariseos, demostrar "Lo que es correcto". Tenemos una tendencia terrible a ver únicamente las decisiones, y al hacer eso deshumanizamos a las personas que toman esas decisiones. Muy a menudo, no nos importa la justicia o la verdad. Solo queremos tener la razón.

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

Hacer un camino

¿Cuál es tu zona de confort: emocionalmente; profesionalmente; personalmente? Todos tenemos una. Pero ¿te habías dado cuenta de que puedes tener una espiritualmente? Piensa en lo que te gusta y lo que no disfrutas en particular cuando se trata de la iglesia, la oración y la liturgia. Todos tenemos "esos cantos" ante los que arrugamos la nariz, ya sea porque son demasiado modernos o anticuados. Todos tenemos "esas personas" en nuestra parroquia cuyas ideas no nos convencen, ya sea porque están tratando de cambiar demasiado o porque parecen estar siempre mirando hacia el pasado. Además, ¿cuándo fue la última vez que te sentaste del OTRO lado de la iglesia durante la misa? Por mucho que no queramos admitirlo, incluso (y especialmente) como pueblo de Dios, nos apegamos profundamente a nuestras propias zonas de confort personal, y tendemos a ver a los que están afuera con desconfianza. Pero ¿y si Dios tuviera una zona de confort? ¿Qué pasaría si Él nos viera, en nuestro pecado y nuestra miseria, como demasiado "lejos" de Él mismo para alcanzarlo? Dichosamente, nuestro Dios es un Dios que "abrió un camino en el mar y un sendero en las aguas impetuosas." Nuestro Dios es un Dios que hace "algo nuevo." El llamado a la corresponsabilidad exige que miremos más allá de nosotros mismos. Nuestros pensamientos, nuestras opiniones, nuestras preferencias: estas cosas no son importantes para el corresponsable. Incluso si hay un desierto vasto y seco de discordia, o un baldío aparentemente interminable de puntos de vista opuestos entre nosotros y nuestro vecino, Dios nos desafía a "abrir un camino" fuera de nuestra zona de confort, para que juntos podamos anunciar Su alabanza.
