



THE SEMICIRCLES OF THE COLONNADES REPRESENT THE MATERNAL ARMS OF THE CHURCH

140 great saints line the tops of the colonnades of St. Peter’s Square

The statues on the top of the colonnades of St. Peter’s Square represent prominent saints and founders of different religious orders. Each statue is 10 feet high. Their presence reminds us of all the saints in heaven, the “cloud of witnesses” that is with every believer in the walk of discipleship (cf. Hebrews 12:1).

Catechism:

PENANCE
(Continued . . .)

380. Whence has the priest the power to forgive sins?

The priest has the power to forgive sins from Jesus Christ, who said to his apostles and their successors in the priesthood: “Receive the Holy Spirit; whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them; and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained.”



Only God can forgive sins. But He can decide for Himself how He wants to do it. And the way He has decided upon is to use priests as His instruments.

We can truly say that Christ forgives sins, using the lips and hands of the priest, or we can say that the priest forgives sins by the power Christ gives him.

381. With what words does the priest forgive sins?

The priest forgives sins with the words: “I absolve thee from thy sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.”

382. What are the effects of the sacrament of Penance, worthily received?

The effects of the sacrament of Penance, worthily received, are:

- first**, the restoration or increase of sanctifying grace;
- second**, the forgiveness of sins;
- third**, the remission of the eternal punishment, if necessary, and also of part, at least, of the temporal punishment, due to our sins;
- fourth**, the help to avoid sin in future;
- fifth**, the restoration of the merits of our good works if they have been lost by mortal sin.

St. Louis IX

(1214—1270)

King, Patron of France

It has been said that St. Louis IX embodied “the highest ideals of medieval kingship.”

When he became King of France at the age of 12, his mother acted as regent for him.

At the age of 19, he married Margaret Berenger, with whom he had 11 children.

St. Louis forbade all immoral activities at court and never tolerated obscenity. He protected vassals against the lords who were oppressive, was generous to the poor, founded religious institutions, and housed the Crown of Thorns in the Sainte Chapelle. He was known for his impartial justice, and sovereign rulers sought his arbitration.

In 1244, St. Louis launched a crusade, despite opposition from the nobles. In 1248 the Crusaders captured Damietta. To the King’s grief, many soldiers engaged in crimes of passion and committed unnecessary acts of violence. St. Louis punished plundering and made restitution.

He returned to France but later launched another crusade. St. Louis died of typhus during this crusade. On his deathbed he urged the Greek Orthodox ambassadors to reunite with Rome. St. Louis’ relics were scattered during the French Revolution.
