

-Have you been away from the Church, and have now returned, but want to know more?


-Have you been a Catholic all your life, but never completed all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist)?

VATICAN

THERE IS A MARKER WHERE POPE ST. JOHN PAUL II WAS SHOT

On the right side of St. Peter's Square, facing the basilica, a small marker is on the ground. It is a simple grey stone, with the coat of arms of Pope St. John Paul II, and the date May 13, 1981 in Roman numerals.



It commemorates the place and the date of the attempted assassination of John Paul II. During his regular Wednesday audience, while moving through the crowds, the pope was shot and severely wounded. The wounds from the gunshot should have taken his life, but for no medical reason, the bullet moved within the pope's body and his life was spared.



Catechism: - CONTRITION -

QUALITIES OF TRUE CONTRITION (Continued)

2. Supernatural

392. When is our sorrow supernatural?
 Our sorrow is supernatural when, with the help of God's grace, it arises from motives which spring from faith and not merely from natural motives.



This means we must be sorry because we have offended God and may lose our soul, not just because we may have been caught or because something bad happened to us.

Supernatural means "above the natural." It is *natural* to be sorry for our actions when something unpleasant happens to us. It is *supernatural* to be sorry for sins because of what God has told us, either about the danger of hell or about how sin offends Him, even though nothing unpleasant may have happened to us yet.
