Options for Attending Mass at This Time (September 20, 2020)

Please remember Bishop Robert Deeley's dispensation from Sunday Mass is still in effect. Below are options for attending Mass—in person, drive-in, or live-streamed. See the front page of the bulletin for both the weekend and weekday schedule.

Please keep up your prayers for all those struggling with the coronavirus and all its related difficulties.

1. REGULAR MASS SCHEDULE WITH 50 PEOPLE IN CHURCH AND UP TO 50 PEOPLE IN THE HALL

As recently announced, we can now have up to 50 people in our halls, as well as the church, depending on space needed for distancing. Those in the hall will be attending the same Mass as in the church via TV, and Communion will be brought to the hall. There will be separate entrances with no co-mingling, and the same safety guidelines are still in place: please wear facemasks* and keep 6 feet apart. If you're not feeling well, please stay home for your well being and others. We are no longer requiring online sign-up ahead of time but names/contact information of attendees will still be needed before each Mass in case someone comes down with the virus, so please leave extra time for that when coming to Mass.

- **2. Two Drive-in Mass Options:** Participate in Mass in the safety of your car at the following times and locations (restrooms not available), just follow the directions of the parking volunteers:
 - Sundays in September & October, 8:30am in Belfast at the Waldo County Y parking lot at 157 Lincolnville Ave. in Belfast.
 - Sundays, 11am in Rockland at the St. Bernard parking lot in Rockland.

*A NOTE ON FACE COVERINGS: We are so grateful to be able to gather once again for Mass to celebrate God's Word and share in Holy Eucharist as a parish family. This is a gentle reminder that face masks must be worn during Mass and must be properly worn, covering the entire nose and mouth. This is for all parishioners who are attending our Masses. The only time you may remove your face mask is when receiving Communion. After you receive the Host you may step aside, remove your mask, place the Host in your mouth, place your face mask on and return to your pew. The wearing of face masks properly and for the duration of Mass is essential for the protection and safety of all churchgoers, and as an act of Christian charity we thank you for helping to keep all of us safe by doing so. It can be difficult sometimes, but we can ask Our Lord for the strength to bear this in order to be able to attend Mass together and to receive Him—and He will help us!


