

Diocesan Updates for Attending Mass as of July 4, 2021

Please see below new updates from the Roman Catholic Diocese of Portland Maine on the gradual lifting of COVID-19 restrictions for Mass and other liturgical celebrations over the summer to be in fully implemented by August 1, 2021.



Catholics are once again obligated to attend Mass on **Sundays and Holy Days.**

We will continue:

- No face masks or social distancing required
- Live-stream Mass for those who cannot be present.
- Have sanitizer available at the entrances of the church and at communion stations.
- No physical exchange of the sign of peace.
- No distribution of the Precious Blood

We will begin to implement the following between now and August 1:

- Clear out accumulated chairs, tables, cleaning supplies, posters, displays, etc. related to the pandemic from the narthex, reconciliation room, and other areas of the church.
- Make available printed materials (hymnals, bulletins, lectionaries flyers) etc.
- Make holy water available at entrances.
- Resume the entrance procession, the Gospel procession, collections of the offerings and offertory and recessional processions.
- No Recitation of the Act of Spiritual Communion during
- Distribute Holy Eucharist in the usual procession toward designated communion stations. No social distancing is
- Lift any liturgical restrictions for Rite of baptism of infants, weddings, and funerals that have been in place due to COVID-19.
- Resume use of confessionals and reconciliation rooms.

In addition:

- Staff and volunteers must treat the vaccinated and unvaccinated equally.
- Treat those wearing masks and those not wearing masks equally.
- Anyone is free to wear a mask if he or she wishes.
- It is recommended that those not vaccinated wear a mask.
- If the parish makes socially distanced-seating available, it cannot determine who sits in that seating.

THE CHURCH'S MISSION: SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE 15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In commissioning the Apostles in today's Gospel, Jesus gives them, and us, a preview of His Church's mission after the Resurrection.

His instructions to the Twelve echo those of God to the twelve tribes of

Israel on the eve of their exodus from Egypt. The Israelites likewise were sent out with no bread and only one set of clothes, wearing sandals and carrying a staff (see Exodus 12:11; Deuteronomy 8: 2–4). Like the Israelites, the Apostles are to rely solely on the providence of God and His grace.

Perhaps, also, Mark wants us to see the Apostles' mission, the mission of the Church, as that of leading a new exodus—delivering people from their exile from God and bringing them to the promised land, the kingdom of heaven.

Like Amos in today's First Reading, the Apostles are not professionals" who earn their bread by prophesying. Like Amos, they are simply men (see Acts 14:15) summoned from their ordinary jobs and sent by God to be shepherds of their brothers and sisters.

Again this week, we hear the theme of rejection: Amos experiences it, and Jesus warns the Apostles that some will not welcome or listen to them. The Church is called not necessarily to be successful but only to be faithful to God's command.

With authority and power given to her by Jesus, the Church proclaims God's peace and salvation to those who believe in Him, as we sing in today's Psalm.

This word of truth, this Gospel of salvation, is addressed to each of us, personally, as Paul proclaims in today's Epistle. In the mystery of God's will, we have been chosen from before the foundation of the world—to be His sons and daughters, to live for the praise of His glory.

Let us, then, give thanks for the Church today, and for the spiritual blessings He has bestowed upon us. Let us resolve to further the Church's mission—to help others hear the call to repentance and welcome Christ into their lives.



OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL FEAST DAY: JULY 16TH

Mark 6:7-13

The feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, celebrated on July 16, was first instituted in the late 14th century in commemoration of the approval of the rule of the Carmelite Order a hundred years earlier. According to legend, a religious community was established even before the time of Christ on Mount Carmel. This is the mountain overlooking the Mediterranean Sea on which the prophet Elijah successfully challenged



the priests of Baal and won the people to the true God. The feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel entered the Calendar of the universal Church in the early 18th century.

Although there is no historical evidence for the pre-Christian Carmelite community, references in the 12th century record a community of monks on the holy mountain. Despite continual difficulties, the community built a monastery and church dedicated to the Virgin Mary on Mount Carmel in 1263. Saint Louis, King of France, had visited Mount Carmel in 1254, and brought back six French hermits for whom he built a convent near Paris.

Mount Carmel was taken by the Muslims in 1291, and the brothers were killed and the convent burned. The spread of the Carmelites in Europe is largely attributable to the work of Saint Simon Stock (1247-1265). The Carmelite Order was formally approved in 1274 at the Council of Lyon.






