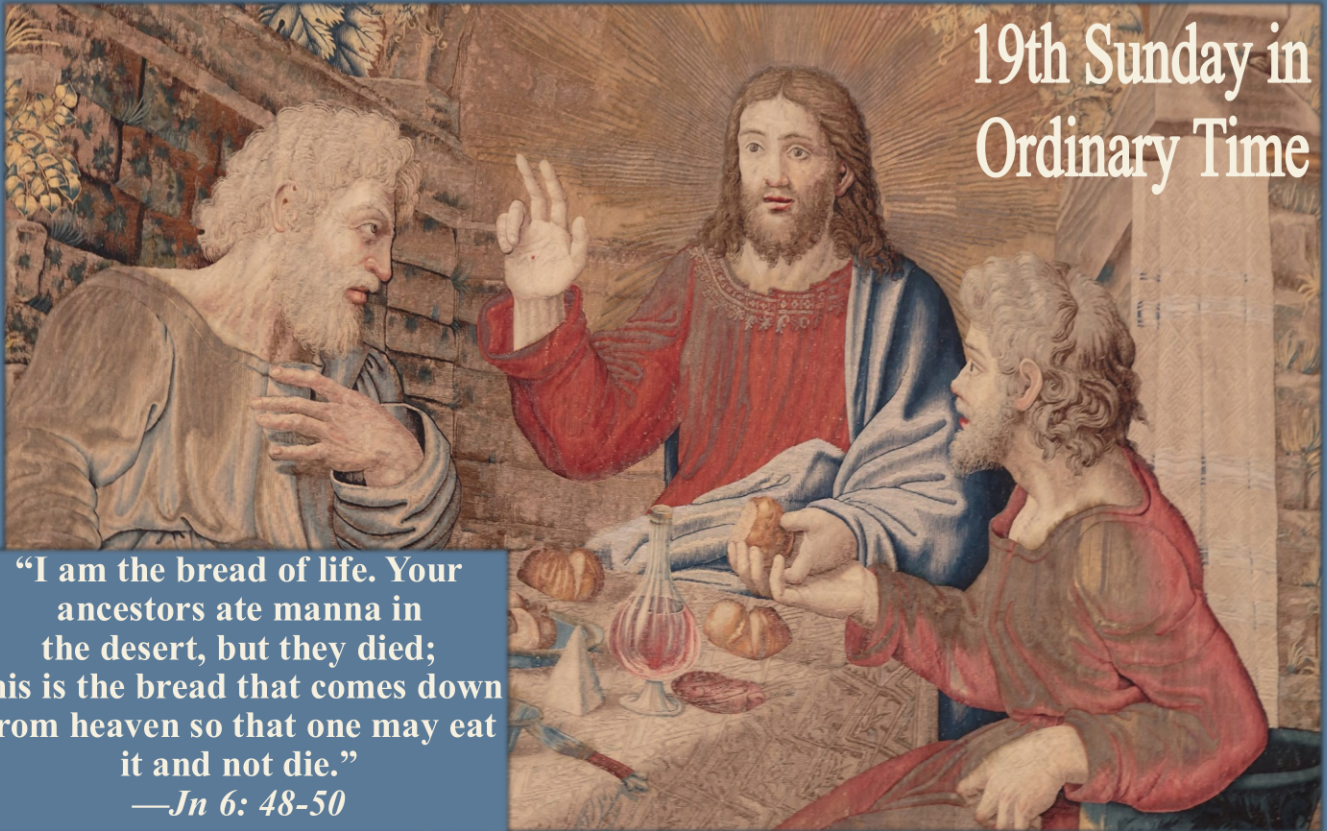

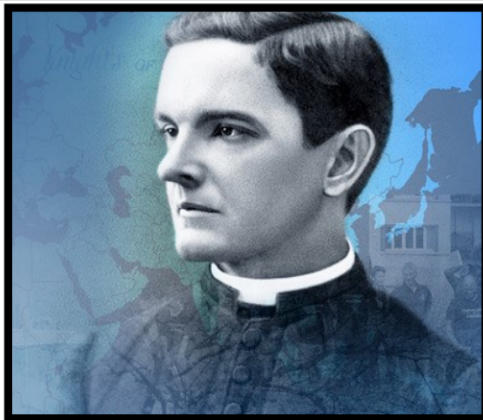

Blessed Father Michael McGivney

Feast Day: August 13th

*Apostle to the Young,
Protector of Christian Family Life, and
Founder of the Knights of Columbus*

August 13th is the official Feast Day in the Catholic Church of Blessed Father Michael McGivney, patron and founder of the Knights of Columbus. Bl. Fr. McGivney was born on August 12, 1852 and passed away on August 14, 1890 (aged 38). His feast day is celebrated on the 13th because it falls between these two dates. Bl. Fr. McGivney was Beatified on October 31, 2020 at the Cathedral

of Saint Joseph in Hartford, Connecticut by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin (on behalf of Pope Francis). The founder of the Knights of Columbus, Bl. Father McGivney was a central figure in the growth of Catholicism in America — galvanizing his flock to care for the widows and orphans of his time and he remains a model for helping families today. His example of charity, evangelization and empowerment of the laity continues to bear fruit and guide Knights of Columbus around the world.



Milestones of Father McGivney's Cause

II. Beatification

Oct. 31, 2020 – Father McGivney is beatified with the title Blessed Michael McGivney during a Mass celebrated at the Cathedral of Saint Joseph in Hartford, Conn.



10. Miracle Approved for Beatification

May 27, 2020 – After extensive medical and theological reviews, the Holy See announces that Pope Francis has authorized a decree regarding the miracle attributed to the intercession of Father McGivney, opening the way for his beatification.



9. Pope Francis Praises Father McGivney's Vision

Feb. 2020 – Pope Francis tells the K of C Board of Directors that the Order has been faithful "to the vision of your founder, Venerable Michael McGivney, who was inspired by the principles of Christian charity and fraternity to assist those most in need." Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori presents Pope Francis with a copy of *Parish Priest* in Italian.



8. Miracle Investigated

Sept. 2017 – Results of an investigation into a possible miracle attributed to the intercession of Father McGivney is sent to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints.



7. Pope Benedict XVI Cites 'Exemplary American Priest'

April 2008 – During his visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, Pope Benedict XVI cites the "remarkable accomplishment of that exemplary American priest, the Venerable Michael McGivney, whose vision and zeal led to the establishment of the Knights of Columbus."



6. Declared Venerable

March 15, 2008 – Confirming Father McGivney's heroic virtue, Pope Benedict XVI declares him a "Venerable Servant of God." The decree states, in part, "Concerning the theological virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love both toward God and neighbor ... they existed to a heroic degree in the Servant of God Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest and Founder of the Fraternal Order the Knights of Columbus."



I. Cause Opens

Dec. 18, 1997 – Father McGivney's Cause for Sainthood is officially opened in Hartford by Archbishop Daniel A. Cronin. Father McGivney is given the title "Servant of God."



2. Diocesan Review Completed

March 6, 2000 – Diocesan investigation into Father McGivney's life, holiness and virtues is closed.



3. Positio Submitted to Rome

Summer 2002 – A 1,000-page document (*Positio*) laying out the case for Father McGivney's cause is presented to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints at the Vatican.



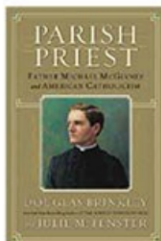
4. John Paul II Commends K of C and Founder

Oct. 2003 – In a message to the Knights of Columbus, St. John Paul II praises the Order and its founder: "In fidelity to the vision of Father McGivney, may you continue to seek new ways of being a leaven of the Gospel in the world and a spiritual force for the renewal of the Church in holiness, unity and truth."



5. Biography Published

July 2006 – *Parish Priest: Father McGivney and American Catholicism*, a biography by historians Douglas Brinkley and Julie Fenster, is published by William Morrow/HarperCollins.



TAKE AND EAT: SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE 19TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Sometimes we feel like Elijah in today's First Reading. We want to lie down and die, keenly aware of our failures—that we seem to be getting no better at doing what God wants of us. We can be tempted to despair, as the prophet was on his forty-day journey in the desert. We can be tempted to “murmur” against God, as the Israelites did during their forty years in the desert (see Exodus 16:2, 7, 8; 1 Corinthians 10:10).

The Gospel today uses the same word, “murmur,” to describe the crowds, who reenact Israel's hardheartedness in the desert.

Jesus tells them that prophecies are being fulfilled in Him, that they are being taught by God. But they can't believe it. They can only see His flesh, that He is the “son” of Joseph and Mary.

Yet if we believe, if we seek Him in our distress, He will deliver us from our fears, as we sing in today's Psalm.

At the altar in every Eucharist, the angel of the Lord, the Lord himself (see Exodus 3:1–2), touches us. He commands us to take and eat His Flesh given for the life of the world (see Matthew 26:26).

This taste of the heavenly gift (see Hebrews 6:4–5) comes to us with a renewed command—to get up and continue on the journey we began in Baptism to the mountain of God, the kingdom of heaven. He will give us the bread of life, the strength and grace we need—as He fed our spiritual ancestors in the wilderness and Elijah in the desert.

So let us stop grieving the Spirit of God, as Paul says in today's Epistle, in another reference to Israel in the desert (see Isaiah 63:10).

Let us say to God as Elijah did, “Take my life.” Not in the sense of wanting to die but in giving ourselves as a sacrificial offering—loving Him as He has loved us, on the Cross and in the Eucharist.

ly be available at the local food pantry. **INGREDIENTS:** Cereal, Crackers, Powdered Milk, Canned Soup, Dried Fruit, Nuts, Chickpeas, Beans, Instant Potatoes, Bread, Canned Vegetables, Canned Fruit, Pork, Chicken, Beef, Whole Milk, Butter, Yogurt, Sour Cream, In-Season Fresh Vegetables (corn, tomatoes, broccoli, squash, green peppers) and Basic Fruits.

- Recipes will be judged on nutritional value and ease of cooking.
- Enter as many recipes as you like. The winning recipes will receive a cash donation to your parish to support the food pantry, soup kitchen or other food-based ministry connected to the parish.
