A CHOICE TO MAKE: SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE 21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

This Sunday's Mass readings conclude a four-week meditation on the Eucharist. The Twelve Apostles in today's Gospel are asked to make a choice—either to believe and accept the New Covenant He offers in His Body and Blood or return to their former ways of life.

Their choice is prefigured by the decision Joshua asks the Twelve Tribes to make in today's First Reading.

Joshua gathers them at Shechem—where God first appeared to their father Abraham promising to make his descendants a great nation in a new land (see Genesis 12:1-9). And he issues a blunt challenge: either renew their covenant with God or serve the alien gods of the surrounding nations.

We too are being asked today to decide whom we will serve. For four weeks we have been presented in the liturgy with the mystery of the Eucharist—a daily miracle far greater than those performed by God in bringing the Israelites out of the land of Egypt.

He has promised us a new homeland and eternal life, offering us bread from heaven to strengthen us on our journey. He has told us that unless we eat His Flesh and drink His Blood we will have no life in us.

It is a hard saying, as many murmur in today's Gospel. Yet He has given us the words of eternal life.

We must believe, as Peter says today, that He is the Holy One of God, who handed Himself over for us, who gave His flesh for the life of the world.

As we hear in today's Epistle, Jesus did this that we might be sanctified, made holy, through the water and word of Baptism by which we enter into His new covenant. Through the Eucharist, He nourishes and cherishes us, making us His own flesh and blood, as husband and wife become one flesh.

Let us renew our covenant today, approaching the altar with confidence that, as we sing in today's Psalm, the Lord will redeem the lives of His servants.

ST. ROSE OF LIMA FEAST DAY: AUG. 23RD

Historians remember St. Rose of Lima for her piety and chastity. Born in 1586 in Lima, Peru to Spanish colonists, and named Isabel Flores de Olivia, she was exceptionally beautiful. Her beauty was so great that she was nicknamed "Rose," a name that remains with her to this day. According to legend, a servant had a vision where her face turned into a rose. At her confirmation in 1597, she officially took the name of Rose. From an early age, Rose wanted to become a nun. She often prayed and fasted in secret. She performed secret penances, some of which were painful and severe. She performed daily adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and took daily communion. Her parents opposed her plan to take a vow of chastity. This resulted in a clash of wills, because her parents wanted her to marry. Her father eventually relented and gave her a room to herself. St. Rose died on August 25, 1617, at the age of 31. According to legend, she accurately predicted the date of her death. Her funeral was a major event attended by all the city's authorities. St. Rose is the patroness of embroiderers, gardeners, florists, those who suffer ridicule for their piety, and people who suffer family problems.

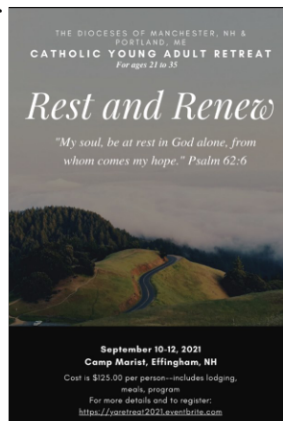

DIOCESAN-WIDE ADULT FAITH FORMATION ECHOES OF FAITH®

WHAT: We invite Catholics across the state of Maine to participate in Echoes of Faith® program. Echoes of Faith® is made up of 11 modules which help participants to discover the truth, goodness, and beauty of the Catholic faith while giving the skills to articulate their faith to others. The Office of Lifelong Faith Formation allows participants to choose between two tracks; the community track or the self-paced track. Those in the community track complete the modules follow the order of modules set by the OLFF staff, complete one module in a 2-month timeframe (finishing all modules in a 24-month time period) and attend the opening and closing gatherings at the beginning and end of each module. Echoes of Faith® can be used to obtain basic catechist certification. If one is seeking to earn basic catechist certification, they must be enrolled in the community track. Those enrolled in the self-paced track are free to chart their own course. The modules are available to them for 12-18 months (24 months if needed).

WHEN: First cohorts began in February 2021 with a new module starting every two months through November 2022 when the module rotation begins to repeat through 2024. The next opportunities for participants to enroll are in July, September, or November 2021.

WHO: Any fully-initiated (baptized, confirmed, sharing in holy Communion) adult Catholic 18 years of age or older who wants to deepen their own relationship with Christ, practice skills for sharing the faith with others, and support the Church's mission of evangelizing and catechesis. Especially suited for those who currently serve as catechists or teachers and leaders of any aspect of parish or Catholic school religious education and faith formation. **HOW:** Register through local parish for one of two options:

(1) **Community Track:** participate in a local or regional small discipleship group with a facilitator and diocesan pre and post sessions working through the material and practicing skills over 2 years OR

(2) **Self-Paced Track:** work through material at own pace for a specified timeframe (up to 24 months depending on when start the process)

Registration and Fee: Adults will register through their local parishes. The fee is \$20/person for Community Track (\$300 value) OR \$50 for Self-Paced Track (\$100 value)

NOTE: Reduced cost to Maine adults made possible through contributions to the Catholic Appeal, a grant from the Lay Continuing Education and Formation Endowment with the Catholic Foundation of Maine, and the partnership of RCL Benziger.

ly be available at the local food pantry. **INGREDIENTS:** Cereal, Crackers, Powdered Milk, Canned Soup, Dried Fruit, Nuts, Chickpeas, Beans, Instant Potatoes, Bread, Canned Vegetables, Canned Fruit, Pork, Chicken, Beef, Whole Milk, Butter, Yogurt, Sour Cream, In-Season Fresh Vegetables (corn, tomatoes, broccoli, squash, green peppers) and Basic Fruits.

- Recipes will be judged on nutritional value and ease of cooking.
- Enter as many recipes as you like. The winning recipes will receive a cash donation to your parish to support the food pantry, soup kitchen or other food-based ministry connected to the parish.
- Deadline for submitting a recipe is August 22, 2021. The winning recipes will be announced on September 17, 2021 (The Feast Day of St. Hildegard).
