ST. BERNARD OF CLAIRVAUX Abbot & Doctor of the Church Feast Day: August 20th

St. Bernard was born of noble parentage in Burgundy, France, in the castle of Fontaines near Dijon. Under the care of his pious parents he was sent at an early age to a college at Chatillon, where he was conspicuous for his remarkable piety and spirit of recollection. At the same place he entered upon



the studies of theology and Holy Scripture. After the death of his mother, fearing the snares and temptations of the world, he resolved to embrace the newly established and very austere institute of the Cistercian Order, of which he was destined to become the greatest ornament. He also persuaded his brothers and several of his friends to follow his example. In 1113, St. Bernard, with thirty young noblemen, presented himself to the holy Abbot, St. Stephen, at Citeaux. After a novitiate spent in great fervor, he made his profession in the following year. His superior soon after, seeing the great progress he had made in the spiritual life, sent him with twelve monks to found a new monastery, which afterward became known as the celebrated Abbey of Clairvaux. St. Bernard was at once appointed Abbot and began that active life which has rendered him the most conspicuous figure in the history of the 12th century. He founded numerous other monasteries, composed a number of works and undertook many journeys for the honor of God. Several Bishoprics were offered him, but he refused them all. The reputation of St. Bernard spread far and wide; even the Popes were governed by his advice. He was commissioned by Pope Eugene III to preach the second Crusade. In obedience to the Sovereign Pontiff he traveled through France and Germany, and aroused the greatest enthusiasm for the holy war among the masses of the population. The failure of the expedition raised a great storm against the saint, but he attributed it to the sins of the Crusaders. St. Bernard was eminently endowed with the gift of miracles. He died on August 20, 1153.



WHAT COMES AFTER THE EASTER VIGIL FOR RCIA?

RCIA certainly has many terms that are not familiar or used in our everyday language. And the period after the Vigil is no exception. We call this the period of Mystagogy and our new members are now called neophytes. A neophyte is someone newly baptized. "Neophyte" comes from Greek words meaning "newly planted" or "young sprouts" and can refer to anyone new at something.

Mystagogia is a Greek term referring to "mysteries". The term mystagogy refers to the learning period following Baptism. It is a period when the newly baptized plumb the depths of and reflect on the mysteries they have experienced through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

The period of mystagogy concludes with the celebration of Pentecost- often with a diocesan celebration such as a Mass for the neophytes. Mystagogy can be a lifetime experience for all of us – as we continue to deepen our understanding and appreciation of the "mysteries."

Our final look at RCIA will include some frequently asked questions about RCIA.

when all the food from the meal is consumed.

nonedible items, like potato peels or eggshells, are often left over.

Food waste often represents a significant portion of household trash, but is meant to be recycled. The rhythms of our planet tend towards cyclic. An army of organisms, including fungi and bacteria, will happily feed on pieces of uneaten pancake or used coffee grounds. When broken down, these items become nutrients, improving soil health and supporting plant life. Through a master plan where new food is produced from the old, nothing is ever wasted.

The simple practice of composting brings us closer to the rhythms of the earth. By working with natural processes, we live a more sustainable lifestyle. In our modern world, a desire for convenience pushes us towards a straight line of use and discard. Purposeful decisions, especially when performed in groups, can lead us back to earth's natural cycles.

One theme in *Laudato Si'* is the adoption of simple lifestyles. We are called to use resources wisely, avoiding waste and sharing equitably with others.

"The ecological conversion needed to bring about lasting change is also a community conversion" (LS 220).

May the food from our breakfasts nourish our bodies as we shift from awareness into action within our faith community.





HOW TO SUPPORT OUR PARISH WITH APPRECIATED ASSETS NOW (FROM A FELLOW PARISHIONER)





Many of us have estate plans that provide for charitable contributions of highly appreciated assets after death. Current IRS regulations make it very beneficial for owners of highly appreciated assets to donate them before death. Various classes of assets can be donated. For this discussion we are describing a publicly traded stock donation. Please note: donors should seek advice from their brokers, advisors, accountants and attorneys before making a direct stock charitable donation.

Federal and state capital gains taxes apply to donors' stock sale profit on an annual basis. Assuming a 90% increase in value and a combined federal and state 20% capital gains tax, donors must sell \$11,800 of stock to have cash for a \$10,000 qualified charitable contribution. Contributing the actual stock eliminates the capital gains tax and results in a \$10,000 charitable deduction for the donor

Both the donor and recipient must have appropriate accounts and follow certain procedures to make qualified stock donations. The recipient must have an account that can receive stock transfers, sell the stock and have the ability to transfer the cash to the intended end user. The donor must make the donation in the same ownership name as the stock ownership. The donor stock ownership name must be consistent with the donor's tax return information. If the stock is owned by a trust the trust must have wording that makes it a "qualified" trust for charitable contributions.

The contribution process generally consists of a "letter of intent" from the donor to the receiving entity describing the stock contribution the intended end user and use and requesting the stock transfer account and numbers. The receiving entity provides the transfer and account information to the donor. The receiving entity is often not the end user. For St Bernard, Our Lady of Good Hope, St. Francis or St. Brendan donations, the Portland Diocese is the receiving entity, while the churches or parish are the end user. In essence, the Diocese receives the contribution and forwards it to the donor's intended user.

The donor provides a letter of instructions to their relevant broker, advisor, accountant or attorney describing the transfer and recipient along with the number of shares to be transferred from account XXXX to recipient account YYY for the intended end user and use.

The recipient provides confirmation of receipt. The paperwork is important for the donor's tax records and to be filed with the donor's tax return to create a full value qualified charitable contribution. If you are interested in learning more, call the parish office at 236-4785.




