

The Holy Spirit at Work in St. Brendan...

Being in the parish office everyday is filled with new joys and new challenges. When we received the below email from Madison Cummings from Canada, we accepted God's challenge! Here is the original email from Madison:

Hope all is well with you. I have a unique situation and want to touch base with you and see if you could offer any insight, suggestions, or ideas. My husband Marko and myself had a civil marriage back in 2020 (due to Covid). He is from Canada, and I am from Belfast, Maine. In order for myself to rejoin him and cross the border we needed to be legally married, and it was the quickest way to go about it.

?

We however want to be married in the church and have our marriage blessed as this is very important for us. Marko grew up Catholic and I myself did not. However, I have wanted to join the Catholic faith and attended private RCIA classes for months alongside my husband and our Deacon. During 2021 we got pregnant and December 30th our son Luka was born.

With the pandemic and a newborn, we were nervous about bringing him out and about. The church was closed for months however once it opened, we were able to baptize our Son Luka through the Catholic Church. Myself however they were unable to, saying they couldn't baptize until Easter.

Our issue is that, we would love to have our Church wedding, and the only time all of our family can be in attendance and witness this special occasion is April 1st (before Easter).

I am reaching out to you, as St Francis of Assisi will be the church we attend Mass at, while home visiting in Maine on occasion. My father was baptized (in Massachusetts) where he grew up however his parents and him moved to Belfast Maine while he was young, and they attended this church. My grandfather (James Cummings) was part of the Knights of Columbus, and my grandmother (Marjorie Cummings) was very involved with the church community as well.

I am wondering if while I am home, if the church would be willing to take me in and baptize me, so that I can be initiated into the Catholic faith alongside my husband and son.

Wow! OK, how could we say no to that? But, we only had a couple of days to make this happen before Madison, Marko and cute little

Luka headed back to Toronto. We were able to verify and received a very nice email from Deacon Robert Suthers, the Deacon in Canada who prepared Madison for becoming Catholic. He did confirm that priests in Canada don't have authority to baptize adults outside of the Easter Vigil.

He wrote the following:

"I am Deacon Robert Suthers writing about Madison Cummings. Madison was able to join our RCIA group and showed a great eagerness to learn as much as she could about becoming a Christian in the Catholic Church.

Unfortunately (or really fortunately) she had to put that on hold whilst she had her baby.

They are a good couple and with Madison's drive I'm sure they will be a good Catholic family. I've been involved with the RCIA program in several parishes for over 30 years and I see, with my experience, that Madison has a great desire to come to a deeper relationship with Jesus."

We were then able to get a letter of permission from Madison's Pastor, Father Andrew Cyruk of Holy Family Church in Bolton, Canada for Madison to receive her sacraments of initiation into the Catholic Church.

So, on Tuesday morning, December 27, Madison alongside her husband and baby boy Luka, received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Eucharist from Father Nathan. It was a quiet, profound, and joyous event. Madison was visibly moved as she finally received what she had been longing for. The daily Mass parishioners were also moved, many to tears, witnessing this

"Holy Family". Afterward all came up to congratulate the family and take pictures.

Madison and Marko said they feel like

they have a "new family" with St. Brendan the Navigator parish and called the parishioners "warm and welcoming". We pray for Madison, Marko and Luka to have continued blessings and God's grace through the sacraments as they journey together as a family. We pray for a wonderful sacrament of matrimony in Canada this April. And we look forward to seeing them whenever they are in town.


