From an Easter Homily by St. Melito of Sardis, Bishop

There was much proclaimed by the prophets about the mystery of the Passover: that mystery is Christ, and to him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

By his Spirit he dealt man's destroyer, death, a fatal blow. For the sake of suffering humanity he came down from heaven to earth, clothed himself in that humanity in the Virgin's womb, and was born a man. Having then a body capable of suffering, he took the pain of fallen man upon himself; he triumphed over the diseases of soul and body that were its cause, and by his Spirit, which was incapable of dying, he dealt man's destroyer, death, a fatal blow.

He was led forth like a lamb; he was slaughtered like a sheep. He

He is the Passover that is our salvation.

It is he who endured every kind of suffering in all those who foreshadowed him. It is he who endured every kind of suffering in all those who foreshadowed him. In Abel he was slain, in Isaac, bound, in Jacob exiled, in Joseph sold, in Moses exposed to die. He was sacrificed in the Passover lamb, persecuted in David, dishonored in the prophets.

It is he who was made man of the Virgin, he who was hung on the tree; it is he who was buried in the earth, raised from the dead, and taken up to the heights of heaven. He is the mute lamb, the slain lamb, the lamb born of Mary, the fair ewe. He was seized from the flock, dragged off to be slaughtered, sacrificed in the evening, and buried at night. On the tree no bone of his was broken; in the earth his body knew no decay. He is the One who rose from the dead, and who raised man from the depths of the tomb.



ST. MELITO OF SARDIS, BISHOP

Feast day: April 1st Death: 180

Little is known about the life of St. Melito of Sardis, a II Century exegete and apologist who served as bishop of Sardis near Lydia, Asia Minor (near modern Izmir, ancient Smyrna). Thought to have been a hermit and a eunuch, he travelled in Palestine, but the reasons for his journey and the details of his itinerary are lost. Most of his work is also lost. 




DAUGHTERS OF ST. BERNARD





ANNULMENT PRESENTATION & DISCUSSION SAT., APRIL 22ND AT ST. BERNARD, 10AM

The Diocesan Tribunal will lead a presentation and discussion on the annulment process in the Catholic Church on Saturday, April 22nd at 10:00am. The information session will be held at Saint Bernard Church Hall (150 Broadway, Rockland). The presentation will cover the steps of the process, grounds for marriage nullity, and related practicalities. There will



be a question and answer period and an opportunity to speak privately to a canonist. All are welcome. The Tribunal is part of the Department of Canonical Services in the Diocese of Portland and handles cases and trials that are subject to the canon law of the Catholic Church. Among the responsibilities of the Tribunal staff is examining petitions for marriage nullity/dissolution. The Tribunal works to process the requests it receives for a declaration of nullity in a just, compassionate, and expedient manner. 


Parishioners who receive Flocknote email will be notified by email.
