

is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the "King of Glory," respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications." (CCC 2628)

The Wonderful Stream

Ezekiel 47 begins with an account of water flowing out from beneath the threshold of the temple. It continues Then he brought me to the bank of the river where he had me sit Wherever the river flows, every sort of living creature that can multiply shall live, and there will be abundant fish, for wherever this water comes the sea shall be made fresh. Along both banks of the river, fruit trees of every kind shall grow; their leaves shall not



fade, nor their fruit fail. Every month they shall bear fresh fruit, for they shall be watered by the flow from the sanctuary. Their fruit shall serve for food, and their leaves for medicine."

God gives us the precious gift of water. In *Laudato Si* (Section II), Pope Francis calls us to think about the issue of water... how we use it, preserve its quality, and avoid its over consumption. Spend a moment today thinking about what you are doing or not doing to care for the water around you.

Let God be your guide in this contemplation: Psalm 23:

The Lord is my shepherd...Beside restful waters he leads me; he refreshes my soul. He guides me in right paths for his name's sake.


