The Real Presence; cont.

From *Credo: Compendium of the Catholic Faith* by Bishop Athanasius Schneider

Is there any bread or wine remaining on the altar after the consecration?

No. After the consecration, the substance of bread and wine no longer exist—only their sensible species or *accidents* remain on the altar.

Is Jesus Christ, whole and entire, then present in the Eucharist?

Yes. Jesus Christ, whole and entire, is substantially present under the appearance of bread, as He is also wholly and entirely present under the appearance of wine.

How is Christ's human soul also present in the Eucharist?

"The soul is present under both kinds, by the force of that natural connection and concomitancy whereby the parts of Christ Our Lord, who hath now risen from the dead to die no more, are united together.:

How is Christ's divinity also present in the Eucharist?

"The divinity is present on account of the admirable hypostatical union thereof with His body and soul."

How can we explain the mode of Christ's presence in the Eucharist?

It is a *sacramental* mode: His body is not present there *locally*, like a physical body that takes up dimensional space, for His living and risen body is properly in heaven. Rather, He is present *substantially*—within every particle of the sacred host, and every drop of the precious blood. In this way, He can be "present in many places in a sacramental manner at one and the same time, without external extension."

Do the consecrated species still retain their natural properties?

Yes. The sacred species have the same properties as they did before transubstantiation (taste, appearance, etc.), and act as they would have acted when the bread and wine were present.

When does Christ cease to be present under the sacred species?

His presence departs when the sacramental species are irreparably altered or corrupted; e.g., the host is digested or decays, or the precious blood is diluted.

Should the Eucharist itself be worshipped?

Yes. "If anyone saith, that, in the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist, Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, is not to be adored with the worship, even external of *latria*, and is, consequently, neither to be venerated with a special festive solemnity, nor to be solemnly borne about in processions, according to the laudable and universal rite and custom of holy Church; or, is not to be proposed publicly to the people to be adored, and that the adorers thereof are idolators; let him be in anathema."

Is the Eucharist the most excellent of all the sacraments?

Yes. For it contains Jesus Christ Himself, whereas the other sacraments have only an instrumental power derived from Him. We call the Eucharist the *Sacrament of sacraments* because it is "the end and consummation of all the sacraments."

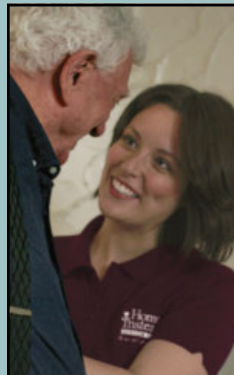

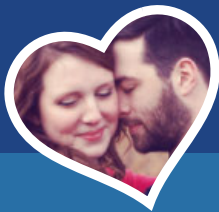

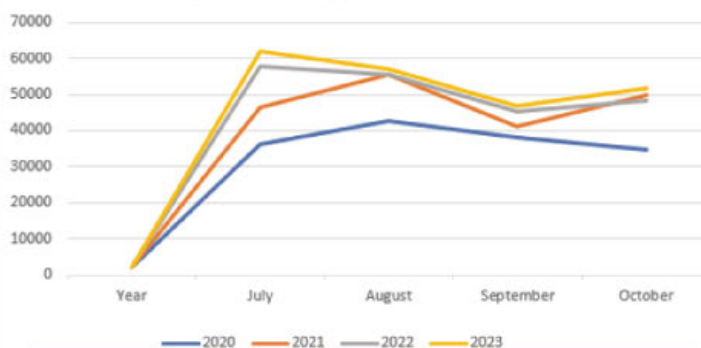
