

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION: THE SCRUTINIES

The Scrutinies are three special rites that help prepare the Elect, those participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), to enter the Catholic Church. They take place often during the season of Lent and involves a more intense period of examination and preparation for the Elect and those being received



into the Church (and us!). The Scrutinies are associated with three specific Gospel stories on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent:

- Jesus encountering the Samaritan woman at the well, where He offers Himself as the Living Water,
- Jesus healing the man born blind, where He gives Himself as Light of the World, and
- Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead, where He reveals Himself as the Resurrection and the Life.

What Happens?

After the Gospel and Homily, the Elect and their Godparents come forward during each of the three weeks of the Scrutinies. The Celebrant addresses the whole assembly, asking us to pray for a spirit of repentance, an awareness of sin, and strength of will for the Elect. He prays for them as we pray for them. While this is happening, we can recognize the need to seek these same graces in prayer for our own continuous conversions.

The Priest then lays hands on each of the Elect individually, and he prays silently over them. Among other intentions, he prays an exorcism prayer, asking God to strengthen and protect them from temptation and deceit. We can use this time to pray silently for our brothers and sisters in Christ, and to ask that we not fall victim to temptation or deceit as we aspire to love God more deeply, and conform ourselves to Him.

Let us keep praying for our catechumen (Mary Ann Butler) and candidate (Gretchen Wolff) in this special part of their journey!

A Reflection on Technology and Humanity

Laudato Si - Chapter Three takes up the issue of technology. Like with many things, we have come to recognize that there are two sides of this "coin", both needing consideration. Pope Francis writes:

(102) Humanity has entered a new era in which our technical prowess has brough us to a crossroads.

We are the beneficiaries of two centuries of enormous waves of change. It is right to rejoice in these advances and to be excited by the immense possibilities which they continue to open up before us.

We know that, when well-directed, these many advances can improve the quality of life.

(104)Yet we also must recognize that not all technological advances have been used wisely. Some, and the corresponding power, economic interests, and greed that have come with them, have proven to be detrimental to humanity. Not every increase in these newfound powers has yielded an increase in progress. Some have actually taken us backwards and put nature and human wellbeing out of sync.

"Contemporary man has not been trained to use power well", (105, Romano Guardini) because our immense technological development has not been accompanied by a development in human responsibilities, values, and conscience. Technology is not neutral. It has become so easy to get caught up in "unrestrained delusions of grandeur", comfort, and new power that we fail to question or see the implications and consequences of our actions.




