

Meaning of Marian Symbols

These Marian Symbols can be found in art, church décor, sacramentals, holy cards, and more from across the centuries. Each tells us a little about the Blessed Virgin Mary and her role in Salvation History. The symbols also show us the connection between Mary and Jesus. As the Mother of God, everything she does leads us to know, love, and follow her Son. Check out the descriptions of these twelve symbols, and then use them to make your own Marian monogram on the following page.



MARIAN M & CROSS

This Cross is intertwined with a Marian M can be seen on the back of the Miraculous Medal and in other Marian art. What we believe about Mary always comes first from what we believe about Christ.



MARIAN FLOWERS

In the Middle Ages, flowers were given religious names as a little way to sanctify, or make holy, an everyday object. Many flowers have Marian names and when grown together are called a Mary Garden.



JESUS, MARY, & JOSEPH

JMJ is an abbreviation for the names of the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Labeling your work with "JMJ" is a way to dedicate your task to the Holy Family, asking them to watch over you.



MARIAN CROWN

Kings and queens on earth wear crowns as signs of their authority. Jesus is the King of the Universel As we honor Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth, we often depict her receiving a Heavenly crown in art such as statues, icons, and paintings.



CROWN OF TWELVE STARS

In the Book of Revelation Mary has a crown of twelve stars on her head, surrounded by the sun and the moon. Twelve reminds us of the Tribes of Israel in the Old Testament and the Apostles in the New Testament, symbolizing the perfect authority of Christ's Church.



SORROWFUL HEART OF MARY

The Seven Sorrows of Mary are stories from the Bible where the Blessed Mother experienced pain and sadness during Jesus' life. A symbolic Heart pierced by seven swords is used to remind us of those sorrows.



MIRACULOUS MEDAL

This medal has Our Lady, the Immaculate Conception, on the front and a Marian M and Cross, Sacred and Immaculate Heart, and a circle of twelve stars on the back. It was given to St. Catherine Labouré in 1830.



MOST HOLY ROSARY

Made of a string of beads beginning and ending with a Crucifix, a Rosary is a tool that helps us count prayers as we say them. While praying the Our fathers and Hail Manys, we are invited to meditate on the Mysteries of Jesus's life.



AUSPICE MARIA

Auspice Maria is Latin for "Under the Protection of Mary." This monogram of an interwoven A and M is a symbol used to mark someone or something as dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary.



FLEUR-DE-LIS

This decorative version of a lify is often connected with the Annunciation when Gabriel announced the Incamation—that God would become Man, and would be called Jesus. Lifes, which stand for purity, are symbols of both Mary and Joseph. Fleur—de—lis is French for "flower of the lify."



IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY


Closely connected with the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Immaculate Heart of Mary is ringed with roses and pierced by a sword. The Immaculate Heart is symbolic of her pure, maternal, and sacrificial love.



ADVENT CANDLES

While not solely a Marian symbol, Advent Candles represent the waiting and preparation of Advent. We remember that we must take time to prepare our heart like Mary did for the coming of Christ.



A CALL TO ENCOUNTER: REMEMBERING POPE FRANCIS

From his very first appearance on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, to his last years confined mostly to a wheelchair, Pope Francis always seemed one step ahead of the rest of us. Indeed, his whole life embodied the surprise of the Gospel. If I had to try to sum up Pope Francis's ministry (throughout his life, not just as Pope), I would do so with one word: encounter. Whether advocating for the poor and migrants, working to instill the Church with synodality, or traveling to places no one would expect a pope to visit, the concept of encounter runs through it all. He prioritized encounter because it is God's style. God, by humbling himself and coming close to humans in the person of Jesus, modeled and embodied encounter. And so, the quotation from Francis that best sums up his life, comes from his exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, published mere months after the start of his Petrine ministry:

The Gospel tells us constantly to run the risk of a face-to-face encounter with others, with their physical presence which challenges us, with their pain and their pleas, with their joy which infect us in our close and continuous interaction. True faith in the incarnate Son of God is inseparable from self-giving, from membership in the community, from service, from reconciliation with others. The Son of God, by becoming flesh, summoned us to the revolution of tenderness (EG 88).

This says it all—not only about Pope Francis's life and ministry, but about what should be the animating principle of every Christian life.

Vacancy of the Holy See - Papal Interregnum

The Papal Interregnum is a period governed by papal law, which admits of no changes to Church governance, or to the spiritual or material patrimony of St. Peter, save the election of his successor.

What Happens During the Interregnum

- 1. The Nine Days of Mourning (Novendiales). The Pope is laid in state in St. Peter's Basilica, permitting the faithful to pay their respects. Every day each Cardinal celebrates a Memorial Mass. Between the fourth and sixth day of this period a Solemn Funeral is celebrated in St. Peter's Basilica by the Dean of the College of Cardinals, with the other Cardinals. The College of Cardinals will also declare an official mourning period of nine days, called the Novendiales. On each of the nine days a different Cardinal celebrates a public funeral rite for the Holy Father, following the Ordo Exsequiarum Romani Pontificis (2024). While Popes are typically entombed in the crypt of St. Peter's, Pope Francis has directed that after his funeral he is to be entombed at the Papal Marian Basilica of St. Mary Major.
- **2.** The Preparation for the Conclave. From Day 10 to the beginning of the Conclave, which must begin no earlier than Day 16, and no later than Day 21 of the Vacancy.
- 3. The Conclave. From the time that the Cardinals enter the Conclave until the one elected accepts his election.



Saints and Hope by Sadlier Religion

St. Teresa of Ávila — Known for her deep trust in God's guidance, she about the importance of hope in the spiritual journey.

She believed that no matter the challenges, God's love and grace would always be there to lead us to peace.



St. Maximilian Kolbe—In the face of extreme suffering in the Auschwitz concentration camp, he displayed profound hope. He gave his life to save another prisoner, showing that even in the darkest moments, love and hope can shine through.



St. John Paul II—A saint who faced great personal suffering, including the assassination attempt on his life, he continually preached the message of hope, especially through his famous words, "Be not afraid." His faith and perseverance inspire hope for a brighter future.



St. Padre Pio—A saint of great compassion and perseverance, he offered hope to those who struggled in faith. His life of prayer, suffering, and miracles reminds us that God is always with us, especially in difficult times.
