

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (August 15) is a holy day of obligation which celebrates Mary's Assumption into heaven, body and soul, at the end of her earthly life. It is a joyful day for Catholics as the Assumption celebrates what each of us hopes and expects to happen: the Lord of the harvest will one day, in the fullness of time, raise our earthly bodies from the ground and join them to our souls in the kingdom of Heaven for all eternity.

The Church has been observing the Assumption of Mary into Heaven as a holy day since about the 4th century. Early celebrations of the Assumption coincided with late summer harvest festivals, honoring Mary as the "first fruit" harvested from God's creation at the same time of year that the first fruits of the field were being harvested. Homilies on the Assumption can be found going back to the sixth century. The feast was celebrated under various names (Commemoration, Dormition, Passing, Assumption) from at least the fifth or sixth century.

Did you know? Part 10 - Fetal Microchimerism

I Scientists have established that women who have given birth or who have been pregnant and lost a baby to miscarriage or abortion, carry some of their baby's DNA in their bodies after a pregnancy is over, often for many decades. This is the phenomenon of fetal microchimerism.

I Fetal microchimerism has been written about in numerous scholarly journals. The transfer of fetal cells begins in the first trimester and occurs via the placenta. These cells enter into the mother's bloodstream and eventually implant themselves into the mother's tissues. An internet search will turn up a wealth of reading on this phenomenon.

I Some studies even present evidence indicating that fetal cells in the mother may play a protective role in her health years later.

I Whether a woman is ultimately able to give birth and hold her baby in her arms or not, fetal microchimerism indicates that this other life that was within her body before birth will have left a permanent physical presence. 


