



Did you know? Part 14, continued...

- **Broadening Criteria:** In the Netherlands and Belgium, patients with psychiatric suffering or dementia, not only those with terminal illness, may request euthanasia.
- **Children Included:** Belgium allows euthanasia for minors of any age (with parental consent). The Netherlands allows it for children over 12 in limited circumstances.
- **Rising Numbers:** In the Netherlands, euthanasia now accounts for about 1 in 20 deaths. In Belgium, it is about 1 in 30 deaths.
- **Canada's Expansion:** Since 2016, Canada's "Medical Assistance in Dying" (MAiD) has grown rapidly. More than 13,000 Canadians died by MAiD in 2022, over 4% of all deaths—and eligibility is expanding to non-terminal conditions.
- **Tourism Concerns:** Switzerland allows assisted suicide for non-residents, leading to "suicide tourism."





Laudato Si'

Today's readings all elevate the Call for the Poor.

The prophet Amos spoke at a time when the northern kingdom of Israel was very successful economically under the veneer of prosperity and religious observance, but the poor and vulnerable were being crushed to the ground. For Amos, it was an insult to God. Such developments in our world today continue to insult God, our Creator. St. Paul tells us that our Christian duty requires prayer for all in authority who are responsible for peace and the common good. The exercise of power and authority is a serious and holy responsibility, not one to be taken lightly. If Paul had civic power today, would he neglect serious consideration of the common good and the climate issues that confront us? Wouldn't he insist that we all take it seriously?

In the gospel, Jesus praises the resourcefulness and determination of morally questionable people who figured out a way to make things better for others as a way to escape punishment. If even they are able to respond to those in need around them, how much more should we do who are dedicated disciples of Jesus?

The steward found it easy to be generous because the goods he managed belonged to his master. Might that be true about each of us? Is not everything we possess a gift that belongs to God? This parable challenges us to realize our own well-to-do status and possessiveness and encourages us to be more aware of the struggles of people in today's world. How can we individually and as a community, apply the gifts bestowed on us with both charity and justice? Excerpts from Catholic Climate Covenant
