

I hope that everyone had a safe and restful Independence Day. As stated last week, today our 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass is open to the public, as well as live-streaming on the web. Please visit our webpage, where you will view an instructional document, then you may register for Mass, Confession or private prayer, by clicking on the appropriate link.

See the bulletin for the statement from the USCCB (usccb.org) on this week's Supreme Court decision which removes some of the anti-Catholic restrictions to Catholic schools receiving public funds. The USCCB also issued a report on permanent deacons, please see a quote from the report on the next page. We are blessed to have Deacon Tom at our parish and we thank him for all that he does here. Vatican News (vaticannews.va) reports on another statement from the USCCB, in opposition to the Supreme Court's decision to allow executions at the federal level. Also in the bulletin, see the article from California Catholic (cacatholic.com), the official voice of California's Catholic community, regarding provisions in Gov. Newsom's budget for essential workers; undocumented workers are, to some extent, included too. See also Angelus News (angelusnews.com) article, "For Black Catholics, Fighting Racism Means Putting Faith in Action." Finally, the article from Vatican News (vaticannews.com) reports that Msgr. Georg Ratzinger, the brother of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, passed away on Wednesday, in Germany.

U.S. BISHOPS GRATEFUL FOR SUPREME COURT'S DECISION IN BLAINE AMENDMENT CASE

(6.30.20, usccb.org) The U.S. Supreme Court issued its decision in Espinoza v. Montana Dept. of Revenue, which challenged the Montana Supreme Court's decision to invalidate a tax credit scholarship program because families benefiting include those who send their children to religiously-affiliated schools, a violation of the Montana state constitution's "Blaine Amendment" of 1889 against aid to religious schools. By vote of 5-4, the Court ruled in favor of the petitioners.

"The Court has rightly ruled that the U.S. Constitution does not permit states to discriminate against religion. This decision means that religious persons and organizations can, like everyone else, participate in government programs that are open to all... A strong civil society needs the full participation of religious institutions. By ensuring the rights of faith-based organizations' freedom to serve, the Court is also promoting the common good.

"The Court has also dealt a blow to the odious legacy of anti-Catholicism in America. Blaine Amendments, which are in 37 states' constitutions, were the product of nativism and bigotry. They were never meant to ensure government neutrality towards religion, but were expressions of hostility toward the Catholic Church. We are grateful that the Supreme Court has taken an important step that will help bring an end to this shameful legacy" (usccb.org).



US BISHOPS APPEAL TO ADMINISTRATION TO REVERSE COURSE ON FEDERAL EXECUTIONS

(7.1.20, vaticannews.va) The U.S. Supreme Court declined to take up the case of federal death row prisoners who had challenged the government's lethal injection protocol, paving the way for the Trump Administration to carry out the first executions at the federal level in nearly two decades.... the government can proceed with four executions ... this month.

The USCCB stated ... "Pope St. John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis have all called for an end to the death penalty around the world. As ... articulated through the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the death penalty is unacceptable as an affront to the Gospel and to respect for human life" (vaticannews.va).

ST. TIMOTHY CHURCH REOPENING DIRECTIVES

We welcome you back to public Masses, Confessions and individual visits, in a limited way. To help you prepare we are including below an overview of how our church is putting into place the directives given by the archdiocese. Keep in mind that since each church and parish are different, the directives may apply a little bit differently at each location. Complete directives are on our webpage.

Please note:

- No more than 100 people (incl. celebrants and staff) may be in the church at a time.
- Those at higher risk from COVID-19 (i.e. older or with underlying health conditions) should stay home; anyone with a cough, feeling sick or with a temperature above 100.4 should not come to church.
- Hand hygiene upon entering and exiting church is required.
- Cloth face coverings must be worn on church campus (not on children under 2) at all times.
- 6-foot social distancing on church campus is required. Seating plans and waiting in line reflect this.
- Sole entry to the church is front Pico door, arrive 15 minutes early.
- Pre-registration required for Mass, Confessions, visits to the church: follow the links on the parish webpage or call the rectory.
- Those who do not pre-register must wait for those who reserved to enter the Church, and if there's room, they'll be allowed entry.
 Name, email, etc. will be required for contact tracing.
- Members of a single household may sit together.
- Communion to be distributed by one person at the end of Mass.
- Do not remove face mask until after receiving Communion and stepping aside. Adjust your mask to consume the Host, and immediately replace your mask as you leave.
- Please place your donation in the collection basket near the altar rail/Mary's statue (remember to bring your envelopes; checks or cash can be placed in basket, envelopes will not be in pews).
- Exit out the front Pico doors.
- Congregating in groups before/after Mass is not allowed.
- The church is sanitized after individual visits and after each Mass.
- Confessions: on parish hall portico. Registration required.

FOR BLACK CATHOLICS, FIGHTING RACISM MEANS PUTTING FAITH IN ACTION

(6.30.20, angelusnews.com) "This video took me a really long time to make," says John Thordarson. "With everything that's been going on ... I feel like it's important to say something, but I wasn't quite sure what that something was."

"That something" Thordarson was seeking to express was in response to the death of George Floyd, an African American man who died May 25 after being pinned down for nearly nine minutes by a Minneapolis police officer.

... To start that conversation, John decided to share the story of his parents, an African American woman and an Irish American man who fell in love and married in a time of segregation....

"The whole reason that [my parents] got married is because they didn't look at each other as what they were supposed to be," said Thordarson. "They just looked at each other as people" (article and video link: angelusnews.com).

GEORG RATZINGER, BROTHER OF POPE EMERITUS BENEDICT, DIES IN REGENSBURG

(7.1.20, vaticannews.va) The elderly Bavarian priest had been hospitalized in Regensburg, in Bavaria, where he lived and where he received his brother Joseph's final visit, with whom he had been ordained on the same day.

Benedict XVI said, "From the beginning of my life my brother has always been for me not only a companion, but also a trustworthy guide. For me he has been a point of orientation and of reference with the clarity and determination of his decisions. He has always shown me the path to take, even in difficult situations" (vaticannews.va).
