Pastor's Notes

November 15, 2020

33rd Week in Ordinary Time

Blessed are you who fear the LORD.
— Psalm 128:1a

Today is World Day of the Poor. This year's theme is "Stretch forth your hand to the poor." In his message for the 4th World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis writes, "We cannot feel 'alright' when any member of the human family is left behind and in the shadows. The silent cry of so many poor men, women and children should find the people of God at the forefront, always and everywhere, in efforts to give them a voice, to protect and support them in the face of hypocrisy and so many unfulfilled promises, and to invite them to share in the life of the community" (no. 4). We especially pray for all those who have been impacted by the Coronavirus and encourage a spirit of fraternity amongst our community. See the bulletin and bulletin insert for details, including details about the Catholic Campaign for Human Development Collection, which takes place next weekend. Just as we did for World Mission Sunday, you will be able to donate online, or by mail-in or drop-off.

November is Black Catholic History Month. See the bulletin for information about Mother Mary Lange, OSP, whose cause for sainthood was opened in 1991. See our webpage for the link to the article about Archbishop Wilton Gregory, who was recently named to be the first black Cardinal in the U.S.

After the All Souls Novena of Masses, prayers continue all month. See the bulletin for details and go to our webpage to register the name of a deceased loved one and make a donation. The names will appear on our webpage and on a special placard at mass for the month of November. We are doing this since we cannot and do not use envelopes at this time for All Souls.

Religious Education classes have begun, virtually, for youth and adults. See the bulletin for details and links to register online.

Mass and Sacraments continue in our outdoor Mass area. Please note that Saturday Mass is now at 4:00 p.m. Confessions are at 3:30 p.m., due to daylight savings. Saturday and Sunday Masses are livestreamed. School Mass for students and families takes place each Friday. California State and local county officials ordered the closure of churches for *inside* services. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles stated, "outdoor Masses and other liturgical services are allowed on parish grounds." Details are in the bulletin and on our webpage. See our webpage for Mass and Confessions schedule, watch an instructional video, then you can register for outdoor Mass and Confession.

★ **Register online for Religious Education** (Baptism, Penance, First Communion, Confirmation) for youth and adults. See the flyers in the bulletin; go to sttimothy.org and click on the Religious Ed tab at the top of the page.

★ **Go to sttimothy.org for online resources and for Sunday Mass** at St. Timothy's. See bulletin for details. We are again accepting Mass Intentions.

★ **In the Archdiocese of Los Angeles**, churches are closed to indoor services. Outdoor services are allowed, with health directives in place. Catholics are dispensed. Rectory offices are open, in a limited manner, for drop-off or pick up of mail, and a staff member is available by phone; someone is in the office-see rectory hours on bulletin cover-though no meetings or gatherings, (other than outside Mass or liturgical services) are permitted. ST. TIMOTHY CHURCH DIRECTIVES FOR OUTSIDE MASS

We welcome you to outside Masses and Confessions, in a limited way. **This overview is of how our church is putting into place the directives given by the archdiocese. Since each church and parish are different, the directives may apply a little bit differently at each location.** Complete directives are at sttimothy.org

- Those at higher risk from COVID-19 (i.e. older or with underlying health conditions) should stay home; as should anyone with a cough, feeling sick or with a temperature above 100.4.
- Hand hygiene upon entering and exiting worship area is required.
- Cloth face coverings must be worn on church campus at all times.
- 6-foot social distancing is required.
- Worship area entry: ramp on Pico (between the hall and parking lot); arrive 15 minutes early.
- Pre-registration required for Mass, Confessions: follow the links on parish webpage or call the rectory.
- Those not pre-registered may enter, if there's room, after those pre-registered enter. Contact tracing information is required.
- Members of a single household may sit together.
- Communion is distributed at the end of Mass.
- **Do not remove face mask until after receiving Communion and stepping aside. Adjust mask to consume Host, immediately replace mask.**
- Place donations in the collection basket (bring your envelopes; checks or cash can be placed in basket).
- Congregating before/after Mass is not allowed.
- Confessions: on parish hall portico. Registration required.

COVID-19 Update, Oct. 16

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles announced updated guidelines to limit the spread of COVID-19 among its faith community given new guidelines set by State of California and local county officials. Parishes...will discontinue indoor Masses and other liturgical services, effective immediately in accordance with state directives.

Outdoor Masses and other liturgical services...are allowed and encouraged. Parishioners must wear face coverings and practice social distancing, even outdoors.

Parish offices are to be closed to the public...a minimal number of essential parish staff members (may) continue working in the office provided that social distancing is observed (lacatholics.org).

Black Catholic History Month

Mother Mary Lange, OSP (c. 1784-1882)
Founder, Oblate Sisters of Providence

Elizabeth Lange, born in Cuba in 1784, emigrated to the United States in the early 1800s. She eventually settled in Baltimore, probably in 1813. With her friend Marie Magdaleine Balas, she opened the first school in that city that provided education to African American children.



With the encouragement of her spiritual advisor, Fr. Jacques Hector Joubert, SS, Mother Mary Lange undertook the creation of a religious congregation for women of color at a time when the established orders only accepted women of European descent. She and three companions made vows as the first Oblate Sisters of Providence on July 2, 1829. Her Cause for Canonization was opened in 1991, when she was declared a Servant of God.


