


We welcome our school students, families, and staff, and our Religious Education families and catechists. This is also the STYM Mass, with contemporary music.

TODAY'S READINGS



First Reading — The widow of Zarephath had only a handful of flour and a little oil, but made a little cake for Elijah (1 Kings 17:10-16).

Psalm — Praise the Lord, my soul! (Psalm 146).

Second Reading — Christ will appear a second time to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him (Hebrews 9:24-28).

Gospel — In the course of His teaching Jesus said to the crowds, "Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation." ST. TIMOTHY CHURCH DIRECTIVES FOR MASS

The Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, Most Reverend Jose Gomez, announced the following:

Effective June 19, 2021: The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in response to the coronavirus for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles is lifted. Those who have serious and legitimate reasons are dispensed.

Updated directives as of August 7, 2021



• In the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, face coverings must be used indoors for the safety and protection of all people regardless of vaccination status in accordance with the mandates of the County of Los Angeles.

- Please self-attest your health and exposure level to the COVID-19 virus before attending Mass.
- Hand sanitation is available at church entrances.
- Please wash your hands, maintain good hygiene.
- Only bread will be given at Communion and only into the hand.
- Liturgical singing can take place while wearing face coverings.
- Collections can be taken.
- Entrance and recessional processions are allowed, as well as the gifts of bread and wine.
- Registration is not required to attend.
- There will be no assigned seating.
- Please be respectful of spacing: allow 3' between households.



DID YOU KNOW? A MESSAGE FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE USE CONCRETE VISUAL RULES TO HELP CHILDREN STAY SAFE

Parents in a crowded place, like a playground or store, will often tell their children, "Stay where I can see you." While the parent understands that this means, "Stay close," a child does not necessarily understand the limit — when can a parent see or not see them? A clearer direction would be to tell your child, "Stay where you can see me." This gives them the boundary — they must be able to see you no matter where they go. 

All parishes and schools in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles are invited to enter the Guadalupe Procession Float Contest on




