## Pope Francis' comments on same-sex unions

Many people have been asking me regarding the comments of Pope Francis that have come out this week on same sex union. He said in an interview: "Homosexual people have a right to be in a family. They are children of God and have a right to a family. Nobody should be thrown out or be made miserable over it. What we have to create is a civil union law. That way they are legally covered."

It is very hard to give your opinion when you don't know the context in which those phrases were taken from. However, Archbishop Victor Manuel Fernandez, a theologian who has long been close to the pope, said something that can clarify the comment of the pope. He said that the pope has it very clear that the expression 'marriage' has a precise meaning and only applies to a stable union between a man and a woman open to communicating life. However, there are very close unions between people of the same sex, which do not imply sexual relations per se, but a very intense and stable alliance. They know each other well, they share the same roof for many years, they take care of each other, they sacrifice for each other. Then it can happen that they prefer that in an extreme case or illness, they do not consult their relatives, but rather that person who knows their intentions in depth. And for the same reason they prefer that it be that person who inherits all their assets, etc. This may be contemplated in the law and is called 'civil union, or "civil coexistence law."

Another thing we need to keep in mind is that this is his personal view and cannot signal a change in the perennial teaching of the Sacred Scriptures and of the Church. The teaching remains clear that homosexual acts, along with fornication and adultery, are sinful and cannot be approved under any circumstances. Nor can any pope unseat the biblical teaching that marriage is the union of one man with one woman till death do them part, bearing fruit in the children God shall deign to send them.


Somehow the apostle who shared the same name as the one whose life took such a desperate turn became the one folks would turn to in times of desperate need.


