The Mass Explained: Sacred Vessels

Sacred Vessels hold the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The chalice is the cup used to hold the Blood of Christ. The Paten and Ciborium hold the Body of Christ. The pyx is a small case for transporting the Eucharist to the sick and homebound. The monstrance is used to display the Body of Christ for Eucharistic adoration. *Sacred vessels may be made from solid, nonabsorbent precious materials, such as gold, silver, other precious metals, and hard woods, that are designed to make it apparent that they are indeed sacred vessels for liturgical purposes, and do not easily break or deteriorate.* The Sacred Vessels of the Church are to be treated with special care and reverence.

Paragraph 279 of the GIRM: *Sacred vessels are purified by the priest, deacon, or an instituted acolyte after Communion or after Mass, insofar as possible at the credence table. The purification of the chalice is done with water, or with wine and water, and then drunk. The paten is wiped clean with the purificator.*

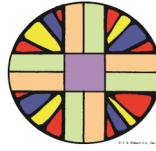

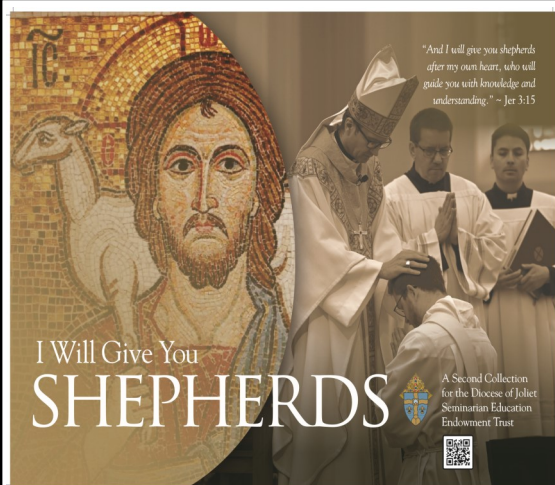

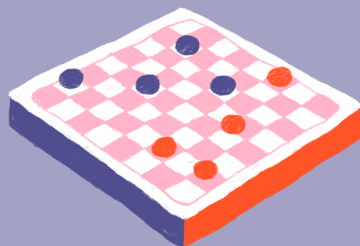
