The Mass Explained

Sacramentals: Aka. The Smells and Bells

Throughout the Sunday liturgy experience, from the moment one walks through the door, until they moment one leaves, there are several Sacramentals which are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments. They signify effects, particularly of a spiritual nature, which are obtained through the intercession of the Church. Holy Water is used to bless oneself upon entering and exiting the Church building, as well as during Easter Season when the priest administers the sprinkling rite. The sign of the Cross is another prayer that is prayed, and expressed physically as well. The smell of incense is used The usage of incense adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendence of the Mass which links heaven with earth, and allow us to enter into the presence of God. Bells are rung at the consecration, though not required, to bring attention to the Consecration of the Eucharist. There are many other Sacramentals that are used outside of Mass, and they are some of the most recognizable religious symbols that are uniquely Catholic.

Sacrament of Baptism

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangement must be made through the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the date requested. Please do not reserve a hall or make other preparations before confirming the date with the Pastor. At least one of the engaged persons (or their parents) must be a registered and active parishioner of Holy Family. Weddings are not scheduled on Saturday evenings or Sundays.





The tradition of the **Oplatki** originated in Poland during Early Christian times. This Christmas Custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water.

HOW TO CELEBRATE THE OPLATKI TRADITION

Typically right before the Christmas Eve meal, the entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatek. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. The purpose of this act is primarily to express ones unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.


THE SYMBOLISM

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another. This symbolism is deepened by the fact that the name of the town where Jesus Christ was born, Bethlehem, means "House of Bread."


Villasecca, Trinity Services, Catholic Charities, Joliet Hospice, Our Lady of Angels, Guardian Angel and River Valley Detention Center.
