Faith Explained : Lent

Lent is a liturgical season which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. During those forty days of Lent, excluding Sundays, we go through a purification through fasting and prayer. Jesus modeled this for us when he fasted and prayed for forty days in the desert before he began his public ministry. This fast prepares us for the feast, which is Easter Sunday when we celebrate the resurrection of Christ.

Ashes have long been used in spiritual practices as a symbol of mourning, mortality, and repentance. In the old testament prophets would wear sack cloth and ashes, sitting in ashes, and even mixing ashes in food and drink. The use of ashes to begin Lent has been a practice as early as the eighth century.

The practice of almsgiving during lent symbolizes making others needs our own. This is done by donating our time, money and goods to those who are in need. Fasting and prayer are closely tied to almsgiving, by sending us from our prayer into action. Our prayer can reveal to us who we should donate to, as well as what to donate. Be led by the Lord this lent in your prayer, fasting and almsgiving and rise to a renewed life on Easter.

Dear Holy Family parishioners,



I offer my gratitude to Bishop Ronald Hicks for appointing me as your new pastor effective July 1, 2023.

For the past five years I have served as pastor of Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Naperville. During my tenure there, the staff, parish leaders and I worked together to strengthen existing ministries and programs, as well as launch new endeavors.

Saints Peter and Paul Catholic School is thriving—spiritually, culturally, and financially—under the leadership of Mrs. Tricia Weis, who I hired in 2020. Enrollment has grown to over 475 preschool through eighth-grade students, and we have completed a junior high security project and full remodeling of the school administrative offices. We opened the preschool in 2021, which has been enthusiastically supported. To foster community after the pandemic, we introduced a major summer festival in association with the 175th anniversary of the parish. Homecoming Fest has been an overwhelming success, with 1,600 attendees this past year. And Hope for Tanzania is a nonprofit that was launched in 2021 to support the work of our former priest-in-residence, Fr. Nestor Mtweve. Since the launch, the parish generously has raised an astounding \$448,000 to support and expand the INUKA Rehabilitation Hospital, which now has a security wall, ambulance, outpatient building, and therapy center, as well as medical and therapy equipment to better assist its patients—some of the most vulnerable children in Tanzania.

Although I am extremely proud of the work we accomplished, I was drawn to the opportunity created when Fr. John Phan announced his intention to incardinate to the Diocese of San Diego for family reasons. My new assignment at Holy Family is very appealing to me for personal reasons as well.

In many ways, I consider this opportunity a full-circle moment. I was baptized at Holy Family Parish when it was originally located on Larkin Avenue in Joliet. By the time I began CCD (religious education) classes, our family had joined St. Jude Parish in Joliet. I am a 1982 graduate of Joliet Catholic Academy, and was ordained to the priesthood in 2000. After serving for five years as parochial vicar at Immaculate Conception in Elmhurst, I spent 13 years at the Cathedral of St. Raymond Nonnatus in my hometown of Joliet. So I'm very much looking forward to moving back to the area, especially in light of some family circumstances.

I am extremely close with my younger brother Todd—who lost his wife to cancer in 2017—and their children Bryan and Brianna. Although Bryan is now more independent as a college student at the University of Dayton, his 17-year-old sister Brianna is a child with medically complex needs who requires constant supervision and care. Although Todd has a demanding job that largely allows him to work from home, it does require travel several times per year. Because Todd's family lives just two miles from Holy Family, I am very grateful that I will be better able to provide spot care and the occasional overnight coverage for Brianna.

As Holy Family transitions pastoral leadership in the first half of 2023, be assured of my prayers for you and my enthusiasm to get to serve and know each of you. And I humbly ask for your prayers as well.

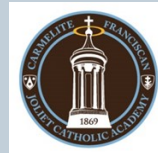

Lenten Regulations

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is sinful.
5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. Therefore, all of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial. All Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church, pray and perform works of charity and mercy.
6. Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

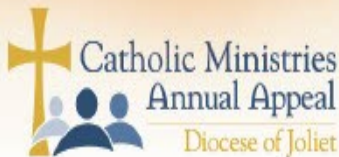

Remember, if we raise more than our goal, the diocese will return to us 70 percent of the amount over goal. This is an amazing opportunity for our parish.

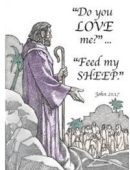
