Faith Explained: The Church's Calendar

We are in the middle of the 50 days of Easter. Next Sunday we will celebrate the Ascension of Jesus, and then conclude the Ester Season the following weekend with Pentecost. These celebrations and the rest throughout the year are what make up the Liturgical year, or calendar. These feasts commemorate and communicate the mystery of Christ. God gave us the seventh day, the Sabbath, as a day of rest with the purpose of remembering, and the liturgical calendar provides us with God's revelations to remember while we rest.

The apostle John wrote his Gospel showing the actions of Jesus lining up with the Jewish feasts, and points out that Jesus died on the cross at the time Passover lambs were sacrificed in the temple. Passover was the culmination of Jewish feasts, and now the fulfillment of the feast of Passover, the passion death and resurrection or Paschal Mystery is the culmination of Christian feasts.

The church calendar starts on the first Sunday of Advent, Christmas follows, then ordinary time, Lent, the Triduum, and Easter, then more odindary time. There are other feasts during all seasons of the calendar, such as the feast of the annunciation, the assumption of Mary, along with solemnities and memorials.



I, for example, empathically declare that as I celebrate 29 years of priesthood, I am happy! His answer surprised me, "Fr. Ron, you are a joyful priest... and the seminarians need to see your joy."
