

The Eucharistic Revival



Our Sunday Mass is a partaking of the divine liturgy. We pray, "Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Our Mass on earth is as it is in Heaven. In our Mass at the consecration of the Eucharist the priest will elevate the host. Let your eyes look up from the host, to the large statue above the altar of Christ Crucified. After the elevation of the host, we proclaim the great AMEN, as is in Rev. 5:14. - 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. Therefore, all of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial. All Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church, pray and perform works of charity and mercy.
- 6. Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.



St. Gianna Molla was born near Milan, Italy in 1922. In 1942, she began

her studies in medicine in Milan and received her diploma in 1949. As a

doctor she specialized in pediat-

rics. Then in 1954, she met Pietro Moll,


an engineer, and the two became engaged. The pair married in 1955.

and they ended up having four children together, Pierluigi in 1956, Mariolina in 1957, Laura in 1959 and Gianna in 1962

During her last pregnancy, she developed a fibroma on her uterus. The doctors said they could do a hysterectomy or just remove the fibroma alone. St. Gianna Molla opted for the removal of the fibroma since she wanted to preserve her child's life. On April 21, 1962, she gave birth to Gianna Emanuela, her fourth child.

However, seven days later St. Gianna Molla developed septic peritonitis and died on the morning of Easter Saturday, April 28, 1962. She gave her life so her baby would live. St. Gianna Molla was beatified in 1994 by St. Pope John Paul II and canonized in 2004 by St. Pope John Paul II. Her feast day is April 28th and she is the patronage of doctors, mothers, wives, families, and the unborn. Her Catholic faith and respecting life were very important to her.

St. Gianna Molla inspirational quote: "Love and sacrifice are closely linked. We cannot love without suffering, and we cannot suffer without love.

Spiritual Motherhood of Priests Ministry

For centuries, nuns, living with the great blessing of Eucharistic Adoration continuously available to them, have offered their prayers and sacrifices specifically for the needs of priests. So aware of the importance of this apostolate of prayer for priests, Pope John Paul II founded a cloistered convent in the Vatican, whose members dedicate their entire lives to praying for the intentions of the pontiff.

The idea of spiritual adoption of priests, where a woman adopts a certain priest as her spiritual "son" for whom she promises to pray, was extended to lay women in 2007 with Pope Benedict XVI's approval.
