Thirteenth Week in Ordinary Time

Peter is such a fascinating character because his commitment to Jesus does not come all at once. Like most of us, his journey with Christ involves ups and downs, fits and starts. He recklessly drops his fishing career to follow Jesus. He answers this question about Jesus's identity correctly and becomes a leader among the apostles. Right after this episode, he is rebuked by Jesus for not wanting to accept the suffering and death of his Lord. He ends up denying Jesus, them responding again to his shoreline call after the resurrection. Whenever we stumble in our faithfulness, we might look to Peter as an example. In the end, his encounter with the Risen Christ enables him to replace cowardice with courage. He becomes a bold preacher of the divine work he has seen, insisting on bringing this message to people who don't want to hear it. He will continue to do so through persecution and imprisonment, until finally he follows Jesus all the way to the cross. Peter and Paul were leaders of the early church, granted authority to shape that church and what it would become. But as we see in the first and second readings, they also suffered greatly. Their lives were not glamourous. Their love for Christ made them willing to endure a great deal of pain in service to him. Like Peter and Paul, we might be called to some amount of suffering for Christ's sake. Jesus did after all, tell us to take up our crosses if we would be his disciples. We are not called to seek out unnecessary suffering, but when pain inevitably finds us, we can rest in the knowledge that Jesus has conquered it. It is no longer suffering for its own sake; we do not hurt in vain. When we join our suffering with Christ's, he can transform it into something life-giving and good.
