You shall love the LORD, your God,

Deuteronomy 6:5

LOVE GOD

As we near the end of the liturgical year we listen to Gospel readings from the final stage of Jesus' ministry—his teaching in Jerusalem. This Sunday Jesus is in conversation with one of the scribes of the temple. In a rare occurrence Jesus and the scribe agree on the two greatest commandments—to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself.

In today's selection from Deuteronomy Moses gives this teaching to the Israelites as the core of their life of faith and prayer, and Psalm 18 echoes this prayer with the words, "I love you, O LORD, my strength" (Psalm 18:2). Jews and Christians agree that our greatest responsibility is to love the one and only God, and that we cannot claim to love God without loving our neighbor as ourselves.

The first reading from today's Mass (Tuesday, October 26th) said "The sufferings of the life are nothing compared to the joy that awaits us in Heaven."



A dark cloud of tragedy has hung over our parish since last Saturday evening. Fr. Arbel had just heard confessions and was returning to the parish house. Adele Valdez, our parishioner, was driving early to evening Mass. A collision occurred on New Airport Rd, near Hwy. 49 and Walgreens. It is reported that Mrs. Valdez may have passed out and then drove into Fr. Arbel's car. Adele Valdez died immediately and Fr. Arbel had his right leg badly broken.



When I shared the sad and tragic news at the beginning of Sunday Masses There was not a dry eye in the congregation. Since then I have talked with Mrs. Valdez's daughter, Terry Napper and Fr. Arbel. Terry, besides feeling the pain of her Mom's passing, was also worried about Fr. Arbel. Terry said she felt consolation because her Mom was going to Mass and that she is now with God. Terry said, she, her four brothersMichael, Dennis, Jim and Charles were praying for their Mom and Fr. Arbel's recovery. As the parish community of St. Teresa's we join with Adele's family in praying for their Mom and for Fr. Arbel.

I've been talking with Fr. Arbel and he's having further surgery on his broken leg this Thursday. Fr. Arbel is in good spirits and hopes to be back ministering in the parish in the near future. Bishop Soto has been there for Father and today asked us for Terry Napper's phone number and address.

As parish staff, we will keep you informed of Father's progress .
