Jesus and the Temple of God

It was a bright and busy day in Jerusalem. The streets were full of people coming from far and wide to celebrate the great feast of Passover. Families carried baskets of food. children held on to their parents' hands, and everyone was excited to go to the Temple the holiest place where they could pray to God.

When Jesus arrived at the Temple, He expected to find people praying and thanking God. But instead...

He heard baa! coo! clink! clink! There were animals everywhere — sheep, cows, and doves! And people were sitting at tables exchanging money, arguing loudly about prices.

The Temple had turned into a noisy marketplace! Jesus' eyes filled with sadness. This was not what His Father's house was meant to be. He took some cords and gently made a small whip. Then, with a strong and loving voice, He said,

"Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!"

The people were surprised. The animals ran out, the coins scattered across the floor, and soon the Temple was quiet again. Jesus


looked around and said, "My Father's house is a house of prayer."

Some of the leaders were angry and asked Him, "Who gave You the right to do this? Show us a sign!"

Jesus answered, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." They didn't understand that Jesus was talking about His own body — that one day He would die and rise again after three days.

Later, after Jesus' Resurrection, His friends remembered His words. Then they understood that Jesus was the true Temple — the place where God lives with His people forever.

God's house — our church — is a special place of prayer and love. When we come to church, we come to meet Jesus. Let's keep our hearts clean and full of kindness, just as Jesus kept His Father's house holy.



Homily on John 2:13-22

"Today's Gospel tells us about a moment in Jesus' life that surprises many — when He enters the Temple in Jerusalem and drives out the merchants and money changers. He overturns tables, scatters coins, and says with authority:

"Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!"

At first, this might seem like anger, but it is not a selfish anger — it is a holy zeal for the house of God. Jesus is showing us how deeply He loves His Father and how sacred the Temple is. It was meant to be a place of prayer, not business.

1. Jesus Cleanses the Temple — A Call to Purity

The Temple in Jerusalem was the center of worship for the Jewish people. It was where they believed God's presence dwelled. But over time, people began to lose that sense of reverence. Instead of prayer and silence, there was noise, trading, and profit-making.

So when Jesus enters and cleanses the Temple, He is reminding everyone — and us today — that God's house must be holy. It must be a place where we come to meet God with sincere hearts.

This same message applies to our own churches. When we enter the church, we step into a sacred space — a place where Heaven and Earth meet. Jesus invites us to come with hearts full of respect, silence, and love.

2. The True Temple — Jesus Himself

When the people ask Jesus for a sign, He says, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up."

They are confused, thinking He is talking about the stone building. But Jesus is speaking about His own body — He is the true Temple, where God's presence fully dwells.

This means that from now on, we do not only meet God in a building, but in Jesus Himself. When we receive Him in the Eucharist, we receive the living Temple of God.

When we pray in His name, God listens through Him.

And when we love others, we make His presence visible in the world.

3. We Are Temples of the Holy Spirit

Through baptism, we too become temples of God's Spirit.

Saint Paul reminds us:

"Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?" (1 Corinthians 3:16)

This means that Jesus also wants to cleanse our hearts, just as He cleansed the Temple in Jerusalem.

He wants to remove anything that blocks us from loving God — anger, pride, jealousy, selfishness, sin.

Every time we confess our sins, Jesus cleans our inner temple. He makes our hearts a beautiful dwelling place for His Spirit.

4. The Lesson for Our Daily Life

Let us ask ourselves:

Is my heart a place where God can live?

Do I treat God's house with love and reverence?

Am I allowing Jesus to cleanse and renew my heart each day?

When we come to Mass, when we pray, when we forgive others — we are building a holy temple for God inside ourselves.

Conclusion

Dear friends, Jesus reminds us that holiness begins within.

He wants our hearts, our homes, and our churches to be filled with love, not noise; with prayer, not pride.

So today, let us open our hearts to Him and say: "Lord Jesus, cleanse the temple of my heart. Make me holy, make me loving, make me truly Yours."

Homilía Juan 2:13-22

El Evangelio de hoy nos cuenta un momento sorprendente en la vida de Jesús — cuando Él entra en el Templo de Jerusalén y expulsa a los comerciantes y cambistas de dinero. Voltea las mesas, derrama las monedas y dice con autoridad:

"Saquen esto de aquí y no conviertan la casa de mi Padre en un mercado."

A primera vista, parece un acto de enojo, pero no es un enojo egoísta — es un celo santo por la casa de Dios. Jesús nos muestra cuánto ama a su Padre y cuán sagrado es el Templo. El Templo debía ser un lugar de oración, no de negocios.

1. Jesús Purifica el Templo — Un Llamado a la Pureza

El Templo de Jerusalén era el centro del culto para el pueblo judío. Era el lugar donde creían que habitaba la presencia de Dios. Pero con el tiempo, la gente fue perdiendo el sentido de lo sagrado. En lugar de silencio y oración, había ruido, discusiones y comercio.

Por eso Jesús entra y purifica el Templo, recordando a todos — y también a nosotros hoy — que la casa de Dios debe ser santa.

Debe ser un lugar donde venimos a encontrarnos con Dios con un corazón sincero.

Este mismo mensaje se aplica a nuestras iglesias. Cuando entramos en la iglesia, entramos en un espacio sagrado — un lugar donde el cielo y la tierra se encuentran. Jesús nos invita a venir con respeto, silencio y amor.

2. El Verdadero Templo — Jesús Mismo

Cuando las personas le piden una señal, Jesús dice: "Destruyan este templo y en tres días lo levantaré."

Ellos no entienden, pensando que habla del edificio. Pero Jesús se refiere a su propio cuerpo — Él es el verdadero Templo, donde habita plenamente la presencia de Dios.

Esto significa que ahora no solo encontramos a

Dios en un edificio, sino en Jesús mismo.
Cuando lo recibimos en la Eucaristía, recibimos
el Templo viviente de Dios. Cuando oramos en
su nombre, Dios nos escucha por medio de Él.
Y cuando amamos a los demás, hacemos visible
su presencia en el mundo.

3. Nosotros Somos Templos del Espíritu Santo

Por el bautismo, nosotros también nos convertimos en templos de Dios. San Pablo nos recuerda: "¿No saben que ustedes son templo de Dios y que el Espíritu de Dios habita en ustedes?" (1 Corintios 3:16) Esto significa que Jesús también quiere limpiar nuestro corazón, así como limpió el Templo de Jerusalén. Quiere sacar de nosotros todo lo que nos aleja de Dios — el enojo, el orgullo, los celos, el egoísmo y el pecado.

Cada vez que nos confesamos, Jesús limpia nuestro templo interior. Hace de nuestro corazón un lugar hermoso donde pueda habitar su Espíritu.

4. La Enseñanza para Nuestra Vida Diaria

Preguntémonos:

¿Es mi corazón un lugar donde Dios puede habitar?

¿Trato la casa de Dios con amor y respeto?

¿Permito que Jesús limpie y renueve mi corazón cada día?

Cada vez que vamos a misa, oramos o perdonamos, estamos construyendo un templo santo dentro de nosotros.

Queridos hermanos, Jesús nos recuerda que la santidad empieza dentro del corazón.

Él quiere que nuestros corazones, nuestras casas y nuestras iglesias estén llenas de amor, no de ruido; de oración, no de orgullo.

Por eso hoy, abramos nuestro corazón y digamos: "Señor Jesús, limpia el templo de mi corazón. Hazme santo, hazme amoroso, hazme completamente tuyo."
