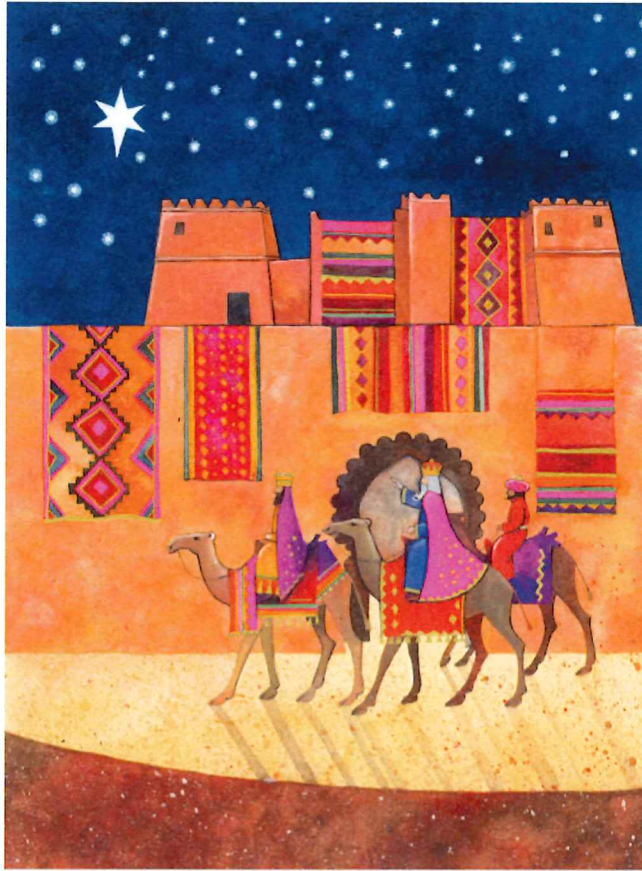

# EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

**Sunday, January 5, 2025**  
**Treasures for the Lord**



*Today's readings: Isaiah 60:1–6; Psalm 72:1–2, 7–8, 10–11, 12–13; Ephesians 3:2–3a, 5–6; Matthew 2:1–12.* The Magi travel to pay homage to the Holy Family after Jesus is born, a fulfillment of the prophecy we hear in the first reading. Isaiah urges Jerusalem to “rise up in splendor,” for the light has come. He tells of people who journey a long distance, “bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord.” The Magi do just this and bring three gifts to honor baby Jesus: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. There is much symbolism in these gifts: gold identifies Jesus as a king; frankincense, used as incense for offerings, symbolizes prayer; myrrh, used in healing and embalming, foreshadows Jesus’ death.

Though it may feel like Christmas is over as the world has moved on from celebrating the holiday season, the Church celebrates Christmas until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (this year, that is next Sunday, January 12). In the spirit of Christmas, reflect on what treasures you possess to give to the Lord, on what gifts you can offer to your community and the Church. After your prayerful reflection, offer a gift to someone this week. A person in your community might appreciate the gift of quality time; an agency might welcome your volunteer hours; children in your family would appreciate the gift of faith through faith-sharing on the Epiphany; and organizations that serve families appreciate monetary gifts.





## THIS WEEK AT HOME

### Monday, January 6

#### Consolation and Desolation

“Do not trust every spirit but test the spirits to see whether they belong to God,” warns John the apostle. Indeed, it is critical to discern God’s will. St. Ignatius of Loyola writes about the states of consolation (joy, peace, being settled) and desolation (fear, anxiety, being unsettled) in prayerful decision-making. Per St. John’s encouragement to deepen our spiritual awareness, take time today to learn about Ignatian discernment. Consider how you can practice prayerful discernment. *Today’s readings: 1 John 3:22–4:6; Psalm 2:7bc–8, 10–12a; Matthew 4:12–17, 23–25.*

### Tuesday, January 7

#### Abundance

Jesus takes five loaves and two fish to feed the vast crowd gathered to hear him preach. The disciples are skeptical as Jesus turns a small amount of food into an abundance that feeds five thousand people. Invite your family to reflect on the abundance with which God has blessed you. Gather at the end of the day and say a prayer of gratitude, naming some of those blessings. *Today’s readings: 1 John 4:7–10; Psalm 72:1–2, 3–4, 7–8; Mark 6:34–44.*

### Wednesday, January 8

#### Take Courage

In today’s Gospel, Jesus walks on water during a storm to reach the disciples. They are terrified, but Jesus says to them: “Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid!” The wind dies down and the disciples are astounded. Their hearts are hardened, as they cannot comprehend Jesus’ self-revelation as the Son of God. Find a church in your area that offers Eucharistic adoration. When you go to pray, consider how you can keep your heart from hardening. How can you surrender your fears? *Today’s readings: 1 John 4:11–18; Psalm 72:1–2, 10, 12–13; Mark 6:45–52.*

### Thursday, January 9

#### Liberty

Highlighting Jesus’ mission of liberation, the Gospel proclaims that he will especially serve the marginalized and forgotten, bringing “glad tidings to the poor.” From the first reading, we hear that “God is love.” Further, “We love because he first loved us.” Set time aside this week to serve someone who is afflicted or oppressed. While you serve, pray with John the apostle’s words: whoever does not love another “whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen.” *Today’s readings: 1 John 4:19–5:4; Psalm 72:1–2, 14 and 15bc, 17; Luke 4:14–22a.*

### Friday, January 10

#### Withdraw to Pray

Jesus cleanses a leper and, while word of his ministry spreads and crowds gather to listen to him, he withdraws “to deserted places to pray.” Amid his healing and preaching, Jesus models the importance of cultivating a prayer life. Spend time creating a prayer space in your home. This should be a space to which you can withdraw, like Jesus. Set time aside to pray in this space at least once every week. *Today’s readings: 1 John 5:5–13; Psalm 147:12–13, 14–15, 19–20; Luke 5:12–16.*

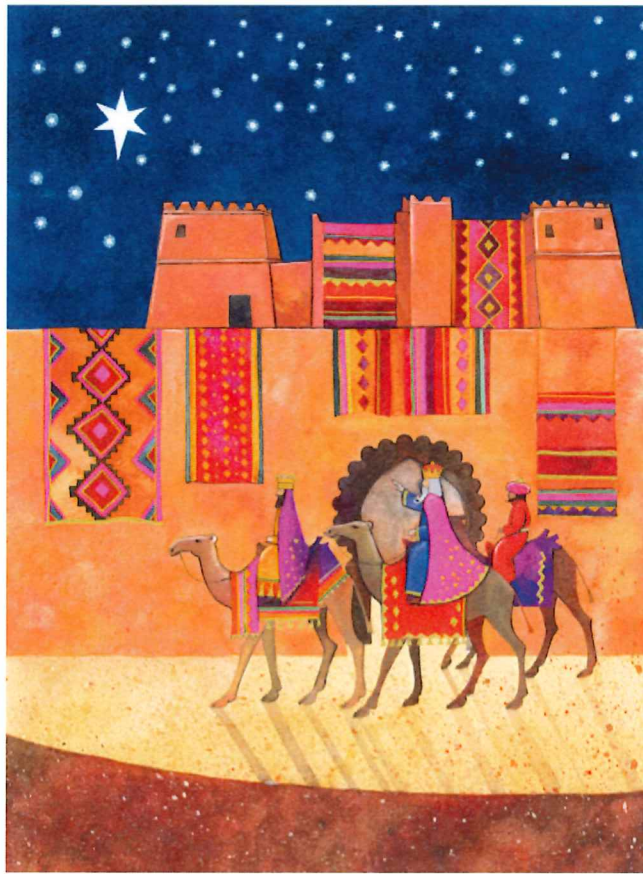
### Saturday, January 11

#### Idols

Take John the Baptist’s words to heart: “He must increase; I must decrease.” To do so, “be on your guard against idols,” as the first reading states, and consider what takes you away from God. Before going to sleep tonight, prayerfully review your day. How did you give glory to God? What “idols” distracted you from doing so? *Today’s readings: 1 John 5:14–21; Psalm 149:1–2, 3–4, 5, 6a and 9b; John 3:22–30.*

**Domingo, 5 de enero de 2025**

**Tesoros para el Señor**

*Lecturas del día: Isaías 60:1–6; Salmo 72:1–2, 7–8, 10–11, 12–13; Efesios 3:2–3a, 5–6; Mateo 2:1–12.* Los Reyes Magos viajan para rendir homenaje a la Sagrada Familia después del nacimiento de Jesús, cumplimiento de la profecía escuchada en la primera lectura. Isaías insta a Jerusalén: “¡Levántate, brilla!”, porque ha llegado la luz. Habla de personas que viajan largas distancias “trayendo incienso y oro y proclamando las alabanzas del Señor”. Esto es lo que hacen los Magos y traen tres regalos para honrar al niño Jesús: oro, incienso y mirra. Hay mucho simbolismo en los regalos: el oro identifica a Jesús como rey; el incienso, empleado para las ofrendas, simboliza la oración, y la mirra, utilizada para curar y embalsamar, presagia la muerte de Jesús.

Aunque pareciera que la Navidad hubiera ya terminado, pues el mundo dejó atrás la temporada navideña, la Iglesia celebra la Navidad hasta la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor (este año, será el próximo domingo 12 de enero). Con espíritu navideño, reflexione sobre qué tesoros regalarle al Señor, qué dones ofrecer a la comunidad y a la Iglesia. Después de meditar en oración, ofrezca un regalo a alguien esta semana. Alguien de su comunidad agradecería el regalo de tiempo de calidad; a una agencia le vendrían bien unas horas de voluntariado; los niños de su familia apreciarían el don de la fe si la comprarte en la Epifanía; y las organizaciones que sirven a las familias apreciarían las donaciones monetarias.





## ESTA SEMANA EN CASA

### Lunes, 6 de enero

#### Consuelo y desolación

“No crean a todos los que se dicen inspirados, más bien, pongan a prueba su inspiración, para ver si procede de Dios”, advierte san Juan. Es, pues, fundamental discernir la voluntad de Dios. San Ignacio de Loyola también alerta sobre los estados de consolación (gozo, paz, tranquilidad) y desolación (miedo, ansiedad, inquietud) cuando se han de tomar decisiones en oración. Siguiendo el consejo de san Juan, profundice su conciencia espiritual; aprenda el discernimiento ignaciano. Piense en cómo practicar el discernimiento orante. *Lecturas del día: 1 Juan 3:22—4:6; Salmo 2:7bc–8, 10–12a; Mateo 4:12–17, 23–25.*

### Martes, 7 de enero

#### Abundancia

Para alimentar a la multitud reunida para escuchar su palabra, Jesús toma cinco panes y dos peces. Sorprende que, con tan pocos recursos, cinco mil personas comieran en abundancia y que todavía sobrarian doce canastas de alimento. Invite a su familia a reflexionar sobre la abundancia con la que Dios los ha bendecido. Reúnanse al final del día y digan una oración de gratitud, mencionando algunas de esas bendiciones. *Lecturas del día: 1 Juan 4:7–10; Salmo 72:1–2, 3–4, 7–8; Marcos 6:34–44.*

### Miércoles, 8 de enero

#### ¡Ánimo!

Escuchamos que, en la oscuridad de la madrugada, Jesús se acerca a sus discípulos caminando sobre el agua encrespada. Al verlo ellos se aterrorizan. Jesús les dice: “¡Tranquilícense! Soy yo, no teman”. El viento amaina y los discípulos quedan pasmados. Sus corazones están endurecidos porque no comprenden quién es Jesús, el Hijo de Dios. Ore en una iglesia donde haya adoración eucarística. Reflexione cómo evitar

que el corazón se le endurezca. ¿Cómo superarlos miedos? *Lecturas del día: 1 Juan 4:11–18; Salmo 72:1–2, 10, 12–13; Marcos 6:45–52.*

### Jueves, 9 de enero

#### Liberar

La misión liberadora de Jesús se enfoca especialmente en los marginados y olvidados; trae “buenas nuevas a los pobres”. Ya en la primera lectura escuchamos que “Dios es amor”. Además, “amamos porque él nos amó antes”. Esta semana dedique tiempo para aliviar a alguien afligido u oprimido. Haga ese servicio motivado por las palabras de san Juan: quien no ama “al hermano a quien ve, no puede amar a Dios a quien no ve”. *Lecturas del día: 1 Juan 4:19—5:4; Salmo 72:1–2, 14 y 15bc, 17; Lucas 4:14–22a.*

### Viernes, 10 de enero

#### Retirarse a orar

Jesús limpia a un leproso y se corre la voz; la multitud se apiña para escucharlo, pero él se retira “a lugares solitarios a orar”. Así, sanando y predicando, Jesús muestra la importancia de cultivar la oración. Haga un espacio de oración en su casa, donde pueda concentrarse a orar, como Jesús. Ore en ese espacio al menos una vez por semana. *Lecturas del día: 1 Juan 5:5–13; Salmo 147:12–13, 14–15, 19–20; Lucas 5:12–16.*

### Sábado, 11 de enero

#### Ídolos

Medite cómo vivir las palabras de Juan el Bautista: “Él debe crecer y yo disminuir”. Para ello, “cuídense de los ídolos”, como advierte la primera lectura, e identifique lo que le aleja de Dios. Antes de ir a dormir esta noche, repase su día en oración. ¿Cómo le dio gloria a Dios? ¿Qué “ídolos” le obstruyeron hacerlo? *Lecturas del día: 1 Juan 5:14–21; Salmo 149:1–2, 3–4, 5, 6a y 9b; Juan 3:22–30.*

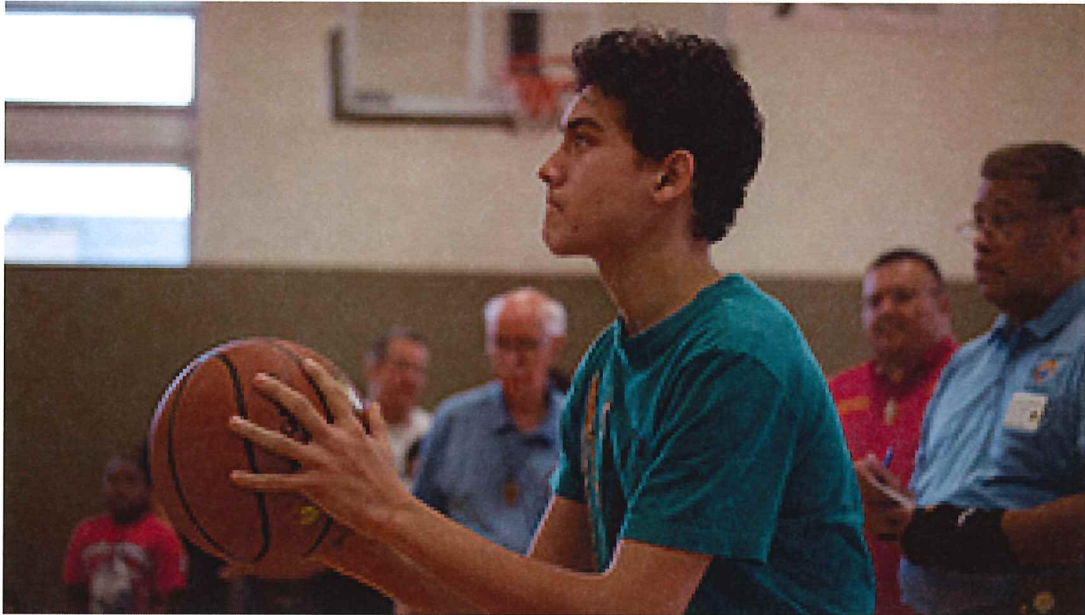
