Sunday, June 1, 2025

Witnesses



Today's readings: Acts 1:1–11; Psalm 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9; Ephesians 1:17–23 or Hebrews 9:24–28; 10:19–23; Luke 24: 46–53. Before ascending to heaven, Jesus points to Scripture: “It is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations.” He reminds his disciples that they are witnesses to these life-changing events. Being a witness requires recalling the event (or events) that one has seen. The disciples are called to share with all nations the news of the miraculous events that they have witnessed. You, too, are a witness to the paschal mystery and participate in it each time you attend Mass. As Mass ends, the priest dismisses the faithful

to spread the news. That we are sent forth becomes evident in the dismissals “Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord” and “Go In peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.”

Though preaching the Gospel may seem like an overwhelming task, God enables and accompanies us. Jesus tells the disciples to stay in Jerusalem until the Holy Spirit comes, and they “are clothed with the power from on high.” The Spirit strengthens them to joyfully accept the difficult yet transformative call to be followers of Christ. We, too, must lean on God for the tenacity to live as the hands and feet of Christ. Pray for the wisdom to see the Holy Spirit moving through you.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, June 2

Sts. Marcellinus and Peter

Though little is known about Sts. Marcellinus and Peter, they were important enough to be included in one of our Eucharistic Prayers. Marcellinus and Peter were a priest and an exorcist, respectively, in the fourth century. Both were beheaded in 304. Today, their service to the Church is celebrated: those whose blood is shed in the name of their faith are joined closely to Christ and, thus, to us. Say a prayer in gratitude for the long tradition to which saints such as Marcellinus and Peter have dedicated themselves. *Today's readings: Acts 19:1–8; Psalm 68:2–3ab, 4–5acd, 6–7ab; John 16:29–33.*

Tuesday, June 3

St. Charles Lwanga and Companions

In various parts of Africa, St. Charles Lwanga is well known as the patron of youth and Catholic action. Charles and twenty-one other young Ugandans were burned to death for refusing to participate in immoral acts in 1886. The virtue of courage is exemplified in these martyrs. How can you courageously say yes to your faith in times of temptation? *Today's readings: Acts 20:17–27; Psalm 68:10–11, 20–21; John 17:1–11a.*

Wednesday, June 4

Tend the Church of God

Today we hear St. Paul address the presbyters. He is instructing them on the difficulties found in the community at Ephesus and surrounding areas. He warns them to guard the community against false prophets that are sure to emerge once he departs. He concludes his remarks by citing Jesus, who said, “It is more blessed to give than to receive.” How are you giving to the Church? What is a way you can “tend the Church of God”? *Today's readings: Acts 20:28–38; Psalm 68:29–30, 33–35a, 35bc–36ab; John 17:11b–19.*

Thursday, June 5

St. Boniface

St. Boniface was an English Benedictine monk. He dedicated himself to the conversion of Germanic tribes. To reform the German Church, Boniface was guided by two principles: restoring the obedience of wayward clergy and establishing Benedictine monasteries (houses of prayer). He was massacred with more than fifty others while preparing converts for confirmation. *Today's readings: Acts 22:30, 23:6–11; Psalm 16:1–2a and 5, 7–8, 9–10, 11; John 17:20–26.*

Friday, June 6

St. Norbert

St. Norbert founded the Premonstratensians, or the Norbertines, (a religious order) in twelfth-century France. They were tasked with combating heresies, revitalizing the faithful, and aiding in reconciliation efforts among enemies. St. Norbert knew that none of that important work could be done without God and found much strength in his devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. If Eucharistic adoration is available in your area, schedule time to pray before the sacrament. If it is not available, spend time in silence praying near a tabernacle. Ask Jesus to strengthen your faith. *Today's readings: Acts 25:13b–21; Psalm 103:1–2, 11–12, 19–20ab; John 21:15–19.*

Saturday, June 7

Gazing on the Lord's Face

Joining the psalmist, we sing, “The just will gaze on your face, O Lord.” What is a just deed to which you can commit yourself as the end of the Easter season nears? How have you gazed on the Lord's face? Regardless of whether you consider yourself artistic, consider drawing or painting the face of the Lord that you are gazing upon. Challenge yourself to think creatively. Allow the Lord to speak to you through this time spent creating. *Today's readings: Acts 28:16–20, 30–31; Psalm 11:4, 5 and 7; John 21:20–25.*

Testigos



Lecturas del día: Hechos 1:1–11; Salmo 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9; Efesios 1:17–23 o bien Hebreos 9:24–28; 10:19–23; Lucas 24: 46–53. Antes de ascender al cielo, Jesús hace referencia a la Sagrada Escritura: “Está escrito que el Mesías sufriría y resucitaría de entre los muertos al tercer día y que en su nombre se predicaría el arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados a todas las naciones”. Recuerda a sus discípulos que ellos son testigos de estos acontecimientos que cambiaron sus vidas. Ser testigo exige recordar el evento que uno ha visto. Los discípulos están llamados a compartir con todas las naciones las noticias de los acontecimientos milagrosos que han presenciado. Usted también es testigo del misterio pascual y participa en él cada vez que asiste a misa. Para

terminar la misa, el sacerdote despide a los fieles para que difundan la noticia: “En la paz de Cristo, vayan a servir a Dios y a sus hermanos” y “Anuncien a todos la alegría del Señor resucitado. Pueden ir en paz”.

Aunque predicar el Evangelio sea una tarea abrumadora, Dios nos capacita y acompaña. Jesús dice a los discípulos que se queden en Jerusalén hasta que venga el Espíritu Santo y sean “revestidos del poder de lo alto”. El Espíritu los fortalece para aceptar con alegría el difícil pero transformador llamado a ser seguidores de Cristo. Nosotros también nos apoyamos en Dios para tener la tenacidad de vivir como las manos y los pies de Cristo. Ore para tener la sabiduría de ver al Espíritu Santo obrar a través de usted.



ESTA SEMANA EN CASA

Lunes, 2 de junio

Santos Marcelino y Pedro

Aunque se sabe poco de los santos Marcelino y Pedro, fueron tan importantes que están incluidos en una de nuestras Plegarias Eucarísticas. Marcelino era sacerdote y Pedro exorcista en el siglo IV. Ambos fueron decapitados en el año 304. Hoy se celebra su servicio a la Iglesia: aquellos cuya sangre es derramada en nombre de su fe están estrechamente unidos a Cristo y, por tanto, a nosotros. Agradezca en oración por la larga tradición a la que se han dedicado santos como Marcelino y Pedro. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 19:1–8; Salmo 68:2–3ab, 4–5acd, 6–7ab; Juan 16:29–33.*

Martes, 3 de junio

San Carlos Lwanga y Compañeros

En varias partes de África a san Carlos Lwanga se le conoce como patrón de la juventud y de la acción católica. Carlos y otros veintiún jóvenes ugandeses fueron quemados vivos por negarse a participar en acciones inmorales en 1886. La virtud del coraje se ejemplifica en estos mártires. ¿Cómo puede usted decir “sí” con valentía en tiempos de tentación? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 20:17–27; Salmo 68:10–11, 20–21; Juan 17:1–11a.*

Miércoles, 4 de junio

Cuiden a la Iglesia de Dios

Hoy escuchamos a san Pablo dirigirse a los presbíteros; los instruye sobre las dificultades en la comunidad de Éfeso y sus alrededores. Les advierte que protejan a la comunidad contra los falsos profetas que seguramente surgirán una vez que él se vaya. Concluye citando a Jesús: “Es mejor dar que recibir”. ¿Qué le está usted dando a la Iglesia? ¿De qué manera puede “cuidar a la Iglesia de Dios”? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 20:28–38; Salmo 68:29–30, 33–35a, 35bc–36ab; Juan 17:11b–19.*

Jueves, 5 de junio

San Bonifacio

San Bonifacio, un monje benedictino inglés, se dedicó a convertir las tribus germánicas al cristianismo. Para reformar la Iglesia alemana, Bonifacio siguió dos principios: restaurar la obediencia del clero descarriado y establecer monasterios benedictinos (casas de oración). Fue masacrado junto con más de cincuenta personas mientras preparaba a los conversos para la confirmación. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 22:30, 23:6–11; Salmo 16:1–2a y 5, 7–8, 9–10, 11; Juan 17:20–26.*

Viernes, 6 de junio

San Norberto

San Norberto fundó los premonstratenses o norbertinos (una orden religiosa) en la Francia del siglo XII. Se les encomendó combatir las herejías, revitalizar a los fieles y ayudar en los esfuerzos de reconciliación entre enemigos. San Norberto sabía que ninguna de esas importantes obras se realizaría sin Dios y encontró mucha fuerza en su devoción al Santísimo Sacramento. Si hay adoración eucarística en su área, programe un tiempo para orar ante el Santísimo Sacramento. Si no hay, ore en silencio cerca del sagrario. Pida a Jesús que le fortalezca la fe. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 25:13b–21; Salmo 103:1–2, 11–12, 19–20ab; Juan 21:15–19.*

Sábado, 7 de junio

Contemplar el rostro del Señor

Con el salmista, cantamos: “Los justos mirarán tu rostro, oh Señor”. ¿Cuál es una acción justa a la que pueda usted comprometerse hacia el final del Tiempo Pascual? ¿Dónde ha contemplado el rostro del Señor? Más allá de si tiene condiciones artísticas, dibuje o pinte el rostro del Señor que usted contempla. Póngase a prueba y piense creativamente. Permita que el Señor le hable durante este tiempo dedicado a crear. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 28:16–20, 30–31; Salmo 11:4, 5 y 7; Juan 21:20–25.*


