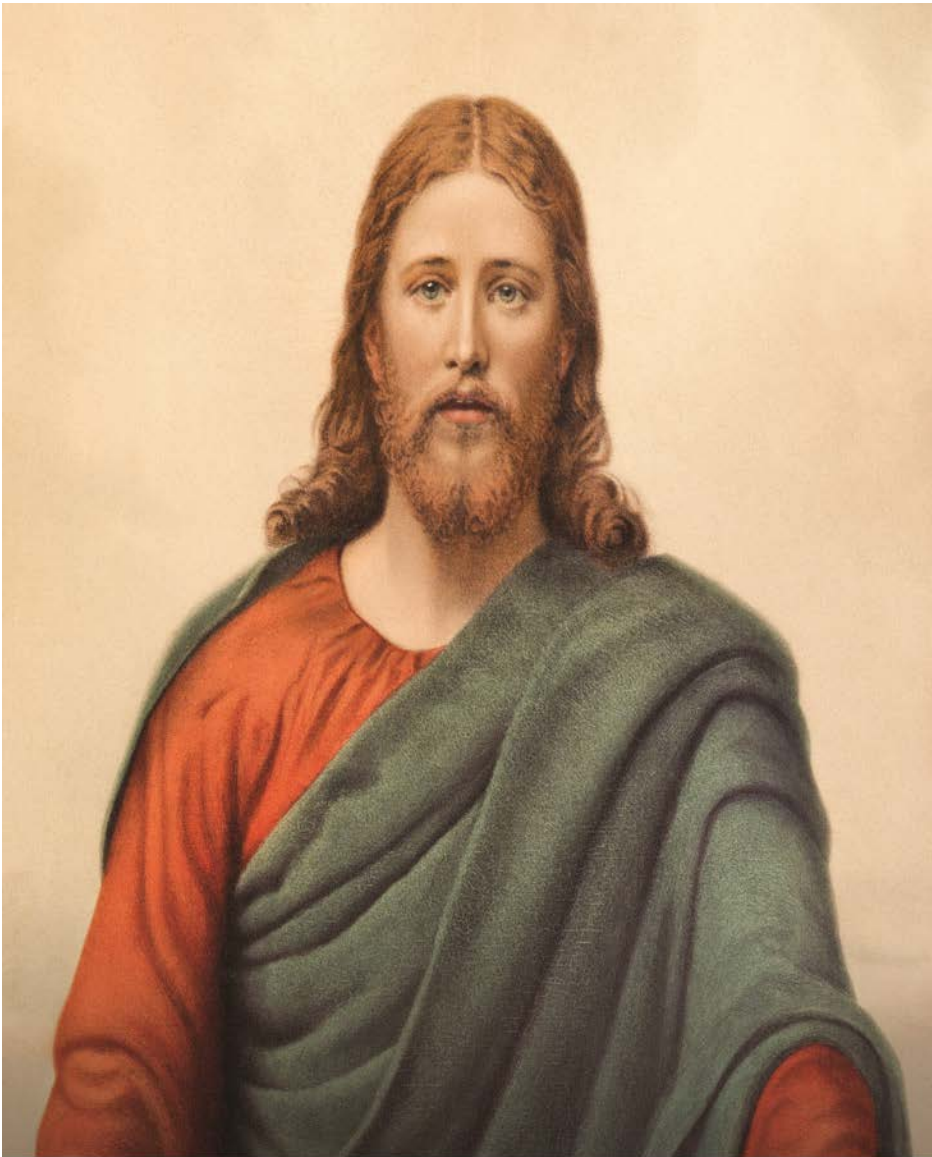

Gospel Meditation

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.

CATHOLIC SHARING APPEAL

Although a handful of parishes are close to their pledged goal at this point, the vast majority of parishes are not. Two of the main pressures on next year's budget is our Priest Retirement funding and Seminary educational costs for two and perhaps new seminarians for our diocese.

As of May 3rd, of the 886 families registered at St. Charles, only 72 have pledged a total of \$17,230 towards the parish goal of \$53,156, which is only 32% of our parish goal. As you can see, we have some ground to make up! Please help to make our goal this year!

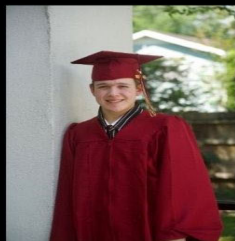

13. POCKET CATECHISM ON THE EUCHARIST

What if someone cannot receive Holy Communion?

At any given Mass, there will be individuals who lack the proper disposition. They are encouraged to make a Spiritual Communion, that is, to invite Jesus to come and dwell within them and help them live good lives. Participation in Mass gives glory to God. It is of great benefit even when someone does not receive Holy Communion.

Even in cases where it is not possible to receive sacramental communion, participation at Mass remains necessary, important, meaningful and fruitful. In such circumstances it is beneficial to cultivate a desire for full union with Christ through the practice of spiritual communion, praised by Pope John Paul II and recommended by saints who were masters of the spiritual life.

Feast Day - May 22

Patroness of Impossible Cases

St. Rita was born at Spoleto, Italy, in 1381. At an early age she begged her parents to allow her to enter a convent. Instead they arranged a marriage for her. Rita became a good wife and mother, but her husband was a man of violent temper. In anger he often mistreated his wife. He taught their children his own evil ways. Rita tried to perform her duties faithfully and to pray and receive the sacraments frequently.

After nearly twenty years of marriage, her husband was stabbed by an enemy but before he died he repented because Rita prayed for him.

Shortly afterwards her two sons died, and Rita was alone in the world. Prayer, fasting, penances of many kinds, and good works filled her days. She was admitted to the convent of the Augustinian nuns at Cascia in Umbria, and began a life of perfect obedience and great charity. Sister Rita had a great devotion to the Passion of Christ. "Please let me suffer like You, Divine Savior," she said one day, and suddenly one of the thorns from the crucifix struck her on the forehead. It left a deep wound which did not heal and which caused her much suffering for the rest of her life. She died on May 22, 1457.

St. Bede the Venerable, Priest and Doctor of the Church

Feast Day: May 25

St. Bede was born at Jarrow, England, in 673. He joined the Benedictines and was ordained priest in 702. He was considered far and wide as the most learned man of his day. His written works, most of which are extant, comprise all branches of knowledge: history, rhetoric, cosmography, orthography, astronomy, music, grammar, philosophy, poetry, exegesis and hagiography. The best known and most authoritative of his historical works is the "Ecclesiastical History of the English People," which is a complete history up to 731. He died in 735. St. Gregory VII, Pope

Feast Day: May 25

Hildebrand was born in Tuscany, Italy, and went to France where he embraced the monastic state in the renowned Abbey of Cluny. He was called back to Rome and soon gained a great reputation for learning and sanctity. He helped to carry out the reforms of Leo IX and succeeded him in 1073, taking the name of Gregory VII. Continuing the reforms of St. Leo, he worked especially to eradicate simony and the looseness of morals of the clergy, and to free the Church from the influence of temporal rulers.

Henry IV, the German Emperor, whom he had excommunicated for flagrantly denying the Church's authority to invest Bishops, came to him at Canossa and stood barefoot in the snow to beg for a pardon which the Pope granted. However, this famous act of repentance was a sham; when Henry seized Rome in 1084, he set up an antipope and forced Gregory into exile at Salerno, where he died the following year—steadfast to the end. His last recorded words were: "I have loved justice and hated iniquity . . . ; therefore, I die in exile."

St. Mary Magdalen de Pazzi, Virgin **Feast Day:** May 25

Born of a noble Florentine family in 1566, Mary became a Carmelite nun in Florence at seventeen. God favored her with the most wonderful graces, and she lived in that mysterious sphere to which many saints have been raised, called the Extraordinary Way. She was also endowed with the spirit of prophecy. She found her vocation in prayer and penance for the reform of all states of life in the Church and for the conversion of all men.

The last three years of her life were characterized by intense bodily and mental suffering, yet she prayed to suffer more, so great was her love for Jesus Christ Crucified. She died on May 25, 1607, shortly after Pope Leo XI, whose elevation to the papacy and subsequent death she had foretold.

St. Philip Neri, Priest

Feast Day: May 26

Patron of Rome

St. Philip was born in Florence in 1515, the very same year that St. Teresa was born at Avila in Spain. From his sixth year he was characterized by the most perfect obedience toward his parents. Having finished his classical studies at eighteen, he was sent to an uncle who lived near Monte Cassino. But St. Philip, desirous of serving God without worldly distractions, went to Rome in 1533 and became preceptor to the children of a Florentine nobleman.

Even at this period of his life he obtained a great reputation for sanctity. While teaching others he devoted himself to the study of philosophy and theology. His desire to save souls caused him to establish the Confraternity of the Blessed Trinity in 1548, with the object of serving pilgrims and the sick. In obedience to his confessor he became a priest in June, 1551, at nearly thirty-six years of age.

He now began to dwell in a small community near the Church of St. Jerome, continuing his mortified life. In the same year he laid the foundation of the Congregation of the Oratory. In 1575, Gregory XIII approved it, and in 1583 gave to St. Philip the new Church of La Vallicella, which is still called La Chiesa Nuova—the New Church. Here the saint lived, edifying all Rome by his virtues and laboring zealously for souls in the ministry of the confessional. He enjoyed the favor of Popes Pius IV and V, Gregory XIII and XIV and Clement VIII, and the friendship of many great men, among whom was St. Charles Borromeo. After a life of penance and of eminent usefulness, St. Philip died in 1595.
