From The Pastor's Desk

Have you ever been to a circus? Almost every circus always has at least one high wire act. During this act, the performer walks a tightrope high in the air. The skill most needed for this type of dangerous undertaking is balance. Without balance, he would not be able to take more than a few steps without crashing down to the ground. And strange as it may seem, the object that many tightrope walkers use for balance is a large pole that they hold usually around chest level. Looking at them, we wonder how such a large object can help them. But the pole actually gives them more of a chance at balance than anything else.

In a very real way, you and I are in a kind of circus that requires continual balance. Life is often heavy on one side and we quickly sense that something is not going as it should. Usually that heavy side is made up of too much activity. Many of us are constantly trying to catch up with ourselves. We are just going too fast and we don't know how to get out of the rat race. We laugh at all of those predictions made so many years ago about how much leisure time we were going to have in the future. Those so-called prophets promised us that with more and better inventions our lives were going to be so much easier. Well, that has clearly not been the case. Many people are working longer hours than they ever imagined. The stress level for many people is at a clearly unacceptable level. We seem to have lost our balance.

Even two thousand years ago, Jesus was very aware of the necessity of balance. He knew that he needed to preach and to show signs that God's kingdom had come — curing the sick, casting out demons, forgiving sins; but he also knew quite clearly that he needed prayer and quiet to stay firmly grounded in his relationship to his Father. And so we hear in today's Gospel that: in the morning, while it was still very dark, Jesus got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. It seems that even Jesus needed that space apart, that quiet time of prayer to his Father. His loving and mysterious union with his Father was at the heart of his life.

When our lives are made up of 99% activity and only 1% prayer, we sense that something is not right. In fact, when we are overly active, the little time that we give to prayer is often just prayer on the run. Our prayer becomes just another activity. We often reserve just the minimal time for prayer and so when we get to it, we feel we have to get it all done in a hurry. Maybe we spend three minutes in prayer before we go to bed or when we rise in the morning. And that's it. It's hardly enough nourishment to get us through the day.

We simply need time to reflect and become aware of whom we are in God's eyes. We need the time and space to examine our lives and ask ourselves if everything we do is absolutely necessary. We must periodically ask ourselves in quiet and prayer about our relationships. Are we loving in a Christian and non-possessive way, or are we loving only so that we will receive love? And we don't need to ask these questions just once. They must be part and parcel of a reflective style of spirituality.

We know that the person who walks high above the air on a tightrope needed a lot of practice to attain such great balance. In our own lives, we should try not to become too discouraged when we have to renew our efforts at balance in our own lives. Any attempt we put forth to bring harmony into our lives is well worth the effort.
