Those who attend Mass in the Church, if you need a washroom, please use the one in the office hallway. Do not go downstairs.



**STATEMENT FROM THE CANADIAN CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS FOLLOWING THE RECENT DISCOVERY AT THE FORMER KAMLOOPS INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL ON THE TK'EMLUPS TE SECWEPEME FIRST NATION:**

On behalf of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCCB), I express our deepest sorrow for the heartrending loss of the children at the former Kamloops Indian Residential School on the Tk'émłups te Secwépemc First Nation. The news of the recent discovery is shocking. It rekindles trauma in numerous communities across this land. Honouring the dignity of the lost little ones demands that the truth be brought to light. This tragedy profoundly impacts Indigenous communities, with whom many people across this land and throughout the world now stand in solidarity. As we see ever more clearly the pain and suffering of the past, the Bishops of Canada pledge to continue walking side by side with Indigenous Peoples in the present, seeking greater healing and reconciliation for the future. We lift up prayers to the Lord for the children who have lost their lives and pledge our close accompaniment of Indigenous families and communities. May our Creator God bless all of us with consolation and hope.

**LETTER FROM BISHOP JENSEN:**

June 1, 2021

The discovery of unmarked graves of children at the site of the former Kamloops Residential School is a national tragedy. Disrespect shown for the lives of indigenous children and their families reflects the racism that often influenced public attitudes and federal government policies in the last century. On behalf of everyone in the diocese, I offer prayer for the eternal repose of these innocent children and for their families who mourn. The Truth and Reconciliation Commission asked the federal government for an accounting of those who died while attending residential schools. The involvement of the provincial coroner's service now may help supply the facts we do not yet have and provide some measure of peace for the families. Confronting the past, however painful, is a necessary step on the path of reconciliation and healing among all who call this country home. We implore God's mercy for those who suffered and ask for the grace to work for respect for every life.
