Dear Parishioners, Thank You

Thank you to our staff and volunteers for all your help during Holy Week and Easter Week. Thanks to our ushers, lectors, extra ordinary ministers of Holy Communion, musicians, and digital ushers.

I'm grateful to all our parishioners and visitors for your patience, understanding, and cooperation. We were able to fit everyone inside our church who wanted to come. Those with contraptions were able to sit fairly close to the canopy entrance.

Mini-Resurrection

With Divine Mercy Sunday, we conclude the Easter Octave but we continue to celebrate the Easter Season through Pentecost. I'm pleased to see more and more people return to Mass.

It's as if our parish is experiencing a miniresurrection. We still need to be careful, but let's make some more changes not just to get us back to normal but to reach a place better than before the pandemic.

More Exits and Holy Communion in the Parking Lot

With more people attending Mass, we need to find a better way for exiting after Mass. We need to continue to have just one entrance, the canopy entrance. But we can exit from all the exits.

To make the exit by the rectory available, we are going to bring Holy Communion to those in the parking lot at the same time we distribute Holy Communion in the church.

Coming to the Parish Office

We will continue to be available by telephone and e-mail, but I think we can begin to help parishioners in the Parish Center.

Our office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30 AM to 3 PM. We're going to try to take a lunch break at about 12 Noon.

The Parish Center foyer and new conference room (old chapel) are big open spaces. We'll meet with you there for Mass cards and other inquiries. Wear a mask and stay six feet apart.

Mass Intentions

Many people have asked when we will open the 2022 Mass book. Our goal is around July 1st. Here's the reasoning:

- 1) We have plenty of room left in the 2021 Mass book.
- We are just opening the parish office now. We want several weeks of figuring out how best to meet with parishioners.
- 3) We want to determine the Mass schedule for 2022. Currently, we have six Sunday Masses. We will likely go down to five. We'll have a better idea in June when anyone who wants to get the vaccine will be fully vaccinated.

Church Seating

For Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, we maximized seating. We were ready for 900+ people. We had a record 748 people for the five Easter Sunday Masses. Our new record for a single Mass is 190 at the 10 AM Easter Sunday Mass.

We are changing our strategy. Instead of maximizing seating, we are now going for simplicity and flexibility. You'll notice that the chairs in the parish hall are in neat columns. Couples are by the window. Triples are by the bathrooms. Two columns of singles are in the middle. It also has a more "churchy" feel. If a Mass has few triples but plenty of singles, we can easily split the triples in the parish hall into singles and doubles by moving one chair toward the wall.

Religious Article Store

Victor continues to work on moving the Religious Article Store to the Parish Center. The old conference room is becoming the new store. He needs some time to get everything out of the boxes, but we've had a couple people make specific requests that we've been able to fill.

New Confessional & Livestreaming Control Room

The old store is the new confessional room and livestreaming control room. We're not yet ready to use it as a confessional. When we do use it, it will be great to have penitents in the back of the church rather than the front.

Temporary Confessional

While we still need big open spaces, we'll continue to use the parish hall as our temporary confessional. Just walk up to the screen in the back, stand, and let the priest know you're there. Try not to touch anything.

Spring Confession Schedule

Mondays, 2-4 PM and 6-7 PM Fridays, during the 3 PM Holy Hour

COVID-19 Vaccinations

I obtained my first Moderna shot at Toms River North on April 6th. I was very impressed with how well organized and big the operation is. It seems that it might be getting easier to schedule an appointment at OCHD.org.

Based on my sister's experience, I don't expect to have any big problems after I get my second shot on May 6th. She was able to work a regular day the day after her second shot. Even so, I scheduled my second shot for a Thursday, my day off. And Fridays tend to be slower than other days of the week.

When it comes to the morality of the vaccines, there are several things to consider. I recommend the National Catholic Bioethics Center for more information: www.ncbcenter.org.

When it comes to the scientific evidence regarding the safety and efficacy of the vaccines, consult your doctor and other trusted sources. Again, I look to the National Catholic Bioethics Center, EWTN, The Catholic Thing, and *Crisis Magazine*. While I've read some of the reporting on scientific matters, I am relying on experts that I trust.
