
A Hindu Peace Prayer

War is a monster that consumes everything in its path.


Peace is a gift shared at meals of memory with Christians, Muslims, and Jews.

(Reader #1): God of Mercy,

All people, Israelis and Palestinians, deserve to live in peace and unafraid, with a right to determine their future together.

(Reader #2): God of the Nations,

let not one more child or elder be sacrificed on altars of political expediency. Keep safe all people from unjust leaders who would exploit vulnerability for their own distorted ends.

Give wise discernment to those making decisions to pursue peace. Provide them insight into fostering well-being, freedom, and thriving for all. Teach all of us to resolve injustices with righteousness, not rockets. Guard our hearts against retaliation, and give us hearts for love alone.

(Reader #1): Strengthen our faith in you, O God of All Flesh,

even when we don't have clear answers, so that we may still offer ourselves nonviolently for the cause of peace.

THE PEACE POEM (words and music)

Taking Sides

Left Side: Today I am taking sides.

Right Side: I am taking the side of Peace.

Left Side: Peace, which I will not abandon even when its voice is drowned out by hurt and hatred, bitterness of loss, cries of right and wrong.

Right Side: I am taking the side of Peace whose name has barely been spoken in this winnerless war.



Left Side: I will hold Peace in my arms, and share my body's breath, lest Peace be added to the body count.

Right Side: I will call for de-escalation even when I want nothing more than to get even.
I will do it in the service of Peace.

Left Side: I will make a clearing in the overgrown thicket of cause and effect so Peace can breathe for a minute and reach for the sky.

Right Side: I will do what I must to save the life of Peace.
I will breathe through tears.
I will swallow pride.
I will bite my tongue.
I will offer love
without testing for deservingness.

ALL TOGETHER: So don't ask me to wave a flag today unless it is the flag of Peace.

Don't ask me to sing an anthem unless it is a song of Peace.

Don't ask me to take sides unless it is the side of Peace.



VOW OF NONVIOLENCE

Recognizing the violence in my own heart, yet trusting in the goodness and mercy of God, I vow to practice the nonviolence of Jesus who taught us in the Sermon on the Mount:

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the sons and daughters of God...You have learned how it was said, 'You must love your neighbor and hate your enemy,' but I say to you, 'Love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you. In this way, you will be daughters and sons of your Creator in heaven."

I vow to carry out in my life the love and example of Jesus:

- by striving for peace within myself and seeking to be a peacemaker in my daily life;
- by refusing to retaliate in the face of provocation and violence;
- by persevering in nonviolence of tongue and heart;
- by living conscientiously and simply so that I do not deprive others of the means to live;
- by actively resisting evil and working nonviolently to abolish war and the causes of war from my own heart and from the face of the earth.

God, I trust in Your sustaining love and believe that just as You gave me the grace and desire to offer this, so You will also bestow abundant grace to fulfill it. Amen.

As we close this prayer service, we recognize the powerful challenges that we face in creating the world of peace with justice that we all desire. May our coming together here today remind us that we are not alone, and that together, we will and ARE making a difference.
