Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Angels,

This coming week we are happy finally to have on Wednesday evening, Aug. 19, the Abbot of St. Benedict's Abbey in Atchison, the Right Reverend James R. Albers, O.S.B., officiate at the Confirmation Mass and administer the Sacrament to confirmandi, with both their parents and their sponsors present. It has been a long time coming. Please pray for all of them that the Holy Spirit may take hold of them and make them witnesses and true disciples for Jesus's Church.

The Serra Club Mass on Wednesday, Aug. 5 had here the Archbishop and all the seminarians with their parents and with more priests here than ever in the sanctuary concelebrating the Mass. It was a time of celebration most especially for those persons from parishes and areas in the Archdiocese whose own parishes have not opened up more to allowing bigger crowds or have not enjoyed good sacred music for a long time. Our parishioner, Melanie Savner, who is the mover and shaker in the Vocations Office as the Administrative Assistant, mentioned to me over the dinner in our hall catered by the Serrans for the seminarians and their parents: "I think everything went fantastic. Our church was beautiful. The parish ladies had done such a great job. I'm so proud of our parish and all of the parishioners who pulled together to make this happen." Indeed, our staff and parish volunteers put on the finest example of hospitality and service since C-19 hit by welcoming so many first-time persons to our parish church over which they marveled. The hall's newly-painted interior really shone off at the banquet dinner where some of the parishioners' finest desserts reached the stomachs of many who had never had the delights of Basehor before.

Some of you do not know what is the Serra Club. It was started in the first part of the twentieth century here in the U.S.A. by ardent Catholics wanting to help make an impact on vocations to the priesthood in their dioceses.

Let's hear in its own words what Serra International does:

OUR MISSION

Serrans are Catholic lay men and women who vigorously respond to the call to promote and support vocations to the ministerial priesthood and consecrated life in the Catholic Church. Since Serra International's founding in 1935 in Seattle, over 1,100 Serra clubs have been chartered in 46 countries around the world. Today, Serra's global lay vocations apostolate is made strong by over 20,000 members. Members of Serra are lay Catholic men and women of all ages and backgrounds who ensure the future of our Church by creating a "culture of vocations."

Their mission is three-fold:

- Promote and support vocations to the ministerial priesthood of the Catholic Church as a particular vocation of service and support priests in their sacred ministry;
- Encourage and promote vocations to the consecrated life in the Catholic Church;
- Assist members to recognize and respond, each in his own life, to God's call to holiness in Jesus Christ, through the Holy Spirit.

PONTIFICAL WORK FOR VOCATIONS

Serra International is the only lay organization aggregated to a primary pontifical work. A pontifical work is an organization instituted by the Vatican to advance a particular goal of the Catholic Church. In 1941, Pope Pius XII created the Pontificium Opus Vocationum Sacerdotalium (The Pontifical Work for Priestly Vocations) to encourage and coordinate efforts to promote vocations to the sacred priesthood of the Catholic Church. Aggregation, or affiliation, to this pontifical work reflects not only specific support from the Vatican for our mission, but also confers special spiritual benefits on all Serrans. Serra Aggregated to Pontifical Work in 1951

At its ninth annual convention, held in Kansas City in 1951, Serra International approved a request, made through its episcopal moderator, Samuel Cardinal Stritch, Archbishop of Chicago, for affiliation with the Pontifical Work for Priestly Vocations. The Congregation of Seminaries and Universities, having been informed beforehand of the request and wishing to show by a quick reply the favor with which the petition was received and thus to encourage the important work of Serra International, granted the request immediately, on the very day of the convention, and so informed the delegates by radiogram directed to the Most Reverend Apostolic Delegate.

The Statutes of the Pontifical Work for Priestly Vocations

I. The Pontifical Work for Priestly Vocations is the principal work for protecting, promoting, and helping priestly vocations. It was established by Our Holy Father Pope Pius XII in the Apostolic letter, Cum Nobis, given motu proprio on November 4, 1941.

II. The Pontifical Work for Priestly Vocations has its headquarters in the Sacred Congregation of Seminaries and Universities.

III. To attain the end for which it was instituted, the Pontifical Work

1) is concerned primarily with setting forth a true and clear notion of the nature, the necessity, and the excellence of the priesthood;

2) promotes the offering up of Masses, Communion, prayers and works of penance and charity to the end that God may grant many and excellent priestly vocations;

3) encourages the growth of the project which is established in each diocese for priestly vocations, and tries to have such projects set up where they do not already exist.

IV. Societies can be aggregated to the Pontifical Work, and persons joined to it.

V. The Pontifical Work for Priestly Vocations is consecrated to Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Supreme and Eternal Priest; it is entrusted to the maternal care of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Queen of Apostles, and to the guardianship of Saint Joseph, the Patron of the Church Universal. It pays particular honor to the saintly Princes of the Apostles, Saints Peter and Paul.
