



Memorial of St. Fabian and St. Sebastian

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Angels,

On the 4th Sunday of January, I continue the tradition of the past 3 Sundays of writing about something new in our parish for 2021. Today's new addition I highlight is that of the framed portrait celebrating the man of the year—literally the Patron of the Universal Church that our Church commemorates this entire year through December 8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception—St. Joseph.

Now that both are hung—our Church-authorized and authenticated replica of the Tilma of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the framed replica painting of a robust St. Joseph holding the Christ Child and his standard symbol of a lily—we can see how the two pieces complement each other. While in the Tilma an angel supports the Mother of God from below, with St. Joseph and the Child Jesus, angels hover above them. Just as the portrait of Our Lady is a copy, so, too, the portrait of St. Joseph is a replica of a famous painting by Bartolome' Estaban Murillo of the Patron Saint of a Happy Death. B.E. Murillo, who was born in Kansas City, Missouri's sister city of Seville, Spain, lived from 1617 – 1682, and was most renowned for his religious subjects.

We have placed the framed portraits "in the heavens" above the tapestries of the angels, above the crushingly earthly Crucifixion of Our Lord. This befits the status of such exalted human creatures who have gone to their rewards in heaven, as the Head of the Holy Family, whom we extol especially in this year of St. Joseph, and the Heart of the Holy Family, the Blessed Virgin Mother, placed where everyone in the nave can look up and encounter them.

Some may have figured that the framed works should replace 2 of the angel tapestries. However, there are lots of spaces in the pews where the angel tapestries in sanctuary niches may not be viewed. If we had put portraits in any of the niches in place of where the angel tapestries are, they would not be

able to be used by a good segment of the people in the pews at times as a focal point for prayer to the saints as intercessors. That focal point for intercessory prayer is probably the most important point of sacred art involving the saints.

One expert on his art specifies that while Murillo thrived during the Baroque Era, his works are

“executed in the more contemporary naturalistic style of the Sevillian school, established by [Diego Velázquez](#) and continued by [Francisco de Zurbarán](#). That series is characterized by realism and [tenebrism](#) (contrasting light and shade) and use of commonplace models, with an emphasis on [genre](#) or scenes of everyday life.

“The softly modeled forms, rich colours, and broad brushwork ... reflect direct visual contact with the art of the 16th-century Venetians and the Flemish Baroque painters....

“The often mystical significance of his subjects is countered by the idealized reality of his figures based on familiar human [archetypes](#), with natural gestures and tender, devout expressions, creating an effect of [intimate](#) rather than exalted religious [sentiment](#).”

One final thought. It seems most appropriate that the depictions of Mary and of Joseph be first revealed to the public at Masses celebrated on January 23, which is traditionally the Feast of the Espousals of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph. The Feast continues to be celebrated by various segments of the Catholic Church on that day. My hope is that these new images may foster greater devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and to St. Joseph among all those in the pews. St. Mary and St. Joseph, pray for us!

ACTS also supports our Project Rachel for post-abortive women. Here is a message I received from a woman who attended one of our weekend retreats.

"I have carried this deep wound for 40 years, like 40 years in the desert, and I am finally free of the shame... It was the most amazing weekend and I cannot thank everyone enough for my continued healing. Thank God the Catholic Church has this ministry ... I will lead people to Christ in honor of my children in heaven and will help people to realize the evil of abortion to my dying days." I am overwhelmed to know that our ministry can make such a difference in so many lives!

Finally, **ACTS** will now support our new Foster Care Ministry. We had over thirty parishes attend our foster fair this summer and are starting to inspire more foster and respite families. We are also beginning to train more "support teams" that will wrap around these families who have opened their hearts and homes to protect vulnerable children. I am excited about all we can do to overcome the Foster Care crisis in our communities!

Please know when you stand up to encourage families to support **ACTS**, you are making a real difference in the lives' of the unborn, vulnerable children and the families who care for them, and women in crisis or who have suffered greatly after an abortion. Thank you!


