Tuesday, Memorial of St. John of the Cross, Dec. 14

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Angels,

Already, this week has been a jam-packed one. We started out with the usual Sunday Masses, I went to hear confessions at another parish in the afternoon and totally enjoyed the euphoric program of our Advent Festival of Lessons & Carols with our traditional Christmas party after it at the parish hall with a visit from Ol' St. Nick, treats for the children and our Basehor-own Simple Simon's pizza.

Monday, St. Lucy's Day, we started off the Advent Parish Mission of Forty Hours of Devotion with an on-fire and very engaging Mass and homily whose fervor continued on Tuesday with the hour long preaching of Fr. Shawn Tunink. On Wednesday on the third week of Advent, on a blustery day of temperatures reminding us of Spring, with threatening winds, we concluded our Advent Parish Mission as though it was in late Spring, near Easter with a nice lunch for those who stayed to socialize.

A sad occurrence, Tuesday, was the funeral and burial of Abbot Barnabas Senecal, O.S.B., who confirmed thousands of persons in his time as the head of St. Benedict's Abbey in Atchison. He was beloved for many things, not the least for his signature hymns that he loved to sing in conferring Confirmation: "Servant Song" and "Hail Mary, Gentle Woman." When the current Abbot, James Albers, arrived at the abbey there was Abbot Barnabas and three other emeriti. Now there is only Abbot James ... but at the Benedictine Abbey in Conception, MO there are at least four former abbots and the current one. How strange the designs of Providence! Tues evening a great time was had by all at the annual CWO Christmas party.

Certainly, one of the true "reasons of the season" in conjunction with the Nativity of Our Lord and Savior is our counting of our blessings from God of those who in Christ Jesus's name, have touched us by His grace, and enriched our lives. For many of us – indeed, for most! – that means giving thanks and praying for those souls dear to us who have gone before us in this last year, marked with the sign of Faith, and have been laid to rest. It is not sentimentalism to look squarely in the face of the loss of someone you loved, or who meant a lot to you, and to feel grief at their loss at the Year's End. That is why our parish's new "Hope and Healing" Group – meant to help the bereaved – inspired by the Holy Spirit, publicized initially in this bulletin and set to meet in January of the new year for the first time, will be such a godsend to those who avail themselves of the opportunity to come together in Christ Jesus and by sharing of their grief experiences help to aid others and themselves in holy, healing ways. Please, if you are mourning, if you are hurting, avail yourself of this good opportunity! I believe that Christ is coming knocking at the door of your hearts to help heal them through this group.

Traditionally, Dec 26, when not on a Sunday, is St. Stephen's Day, the Proto-Martyr. Some may find it strange that the day after Christmas -the Nativity we celebrate of the Divine Messiah's Coming in the form of a newborn infant of the utmost purity - to then celebrate the First Martyr of the Church and of the New Testament! For some, it seems incongruous. Rather, it is all a part - as is the next day, and the day after, and the day after that - of recognizing the Blood of the Martyrs (the Holy Innocents, Dec 28, and St. Thomas Becket, Dec 29) co-mingle with the lives of the pure and innocent (St. John the Evangelist, the Beloved Apostle, Dec. 27).

I pray that all encounter the Holy Family this Feast Day on Sunday Dec 26 and in the remaining days of the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons in a unique and galvanizing way. May all our "auld lang syne" - our good, old times - be causes of joyful remembering with hopeful faith in the future. "Should auld acquaintance be forgot, and auld lang syne?" No, "auld acquaintances" should not be forgot. If we had not been in contact before Christmas, contact auld acquaintances **during** the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons. And, while forgetting hurtful times, it can be a source of comfort and of aid to us in remembering times long past. Let us by doing these things prayerfully prepare in a most Christian manner to welcome in the new year.

May this End of Year Time and New Year's Eve be causes of celebration in the Lord as we prepare to ring in another Year of Grace, Anno Domino 2022 (kudos to David Hornick)!
