Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Angels Parish,

### Catholics - Did You Know?

If you work with people, you have probably discovered that in recent years, people have been more on edge. Those in the service industries and retail notice, and deal with it daily. Priests are no exception, since they interact with so many people. This article was taken from the Fall 2020 issue of a Word on Fire publication, and was written by Fr. Steve Grunow, a close associate of Bishop Robert Barron.

"I've had experience as a parish priest and know the often difficult feedback a priest may receive about the Mass he offers..." Priests are human beings. They are trying very hard to cooperate with the grace Christ gives them, even though they sense that they're often going to prove inadequate to the task. Priests don't have a sense that they're super beings that can just, through an act of will, get everything right and give everyone what they want in the way that they want it. Instead, they are simply pouring out their life in service to the Church. Because priests are imperfect, criticism and complaining will come. However, incessant criticism and complaint bears down on a priest. Eventually, it has the potential to destroy him. When a priest receives criticism and complaint, he is receiving this darkness rather than projecting it out into the community. It is a dangerous business. I do wish that more lay people were aware of these trials in the lives of priests. Maybe at times when we are disappointed with Father, we might want to think about where his failure and inadequacy has come from. It isn't just a sense of his own personal sin. It's bearing the weight of the culture of criticism and complaint that can take hold of a parish, and even take hold of a priest's life. Even in the holy places, the work of the evil one gets in, and has to be dealt with. In the life of many parish priests, I call it the water torture of criticism and complaint."

Pray for all our priests, whose mission is to bring us to a closer relationship with our God and guide us to heaven. The majority of our priests are joyful and love what they do, but we all have felt the sting of criticism. Though they minister for the glory of God, positive feedback would be something we can do for our priests when so many people are on edge.
