Dear Parish Family and Friends of Holy Angels,

As always, it is very good to plunge into the sacred, penitential Season of Lent as we did a very few days ago on Ash Wednesday. We have the great prayer, penance and active charity guide to Lent that our Holy Angels Relationship Team created and had published for everyone. It will be a wonderful Lenten companion!

Just as important is the tri-fold brochure meticulously put together by our pastoral assistant that highlights just about everything that is going on in the parish that relates to prayer, to almsgiving and to penance.

Our parish charity this Lent throughout the season focuses on some wonderful religious women who include parishioners of ours. For many of you who attend our regular 8 am Sunday Mass, and often daily Masses as well as solemnities not on weekends, you have witnessed the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George joining us. This year marks their hundredth anniversary of their coming to the United States and settling in Alton, Illinois where their national mother house is located. On December 26, 1923, they arrived from Germany and have spread out throughout the United States and with a 51-year-old mission in Brazil. Their charism is to "make the merciful love of Christ visible in our service." In doing this they are involved in education, healthcare, youth ministry, mission work and archdiocesan administration. It is a joy to be able to give back to the good Sisters so that they can use our charitable financial support we give them from the Soup and Bread meals as well as the St. Joseph's Table, Dinner and Auction and also the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper collection.

Something that should appeal to a lot of people is our Wednesday evening, March 15 introduction to St. Monica's Prayer Club at our parish hall. It is not meant as a parish group as such but should be a bridge between parishes and people that are intent on praying for the spiritual welfare of people they love. This evening presentation by a member of another St. Monica's Prayer Group is about bringing people together in a concerted effort to pray for family prodigals we love. The introduction is to see if we have enough interest to create a St. Monica's Prayer Club for persons caring to bring back by prayer - such as St. Monica did with her son, who became St. Augustine – fallen-away Catholics and to bring others to the fold. This deepens one's spiritual life in ways one could never guess! For every one person converting to the Catholic Faith, there are six baptized and confirmed Catholics leaving the Catholic Faith. This hemorrhage truly pains and hurts the Mystical Body of Christ. Come to the parish hall 7 p.m., Wednesday, March 15 for this one-time presentation!

This year, our biggest Lenten event is our directed Lenten Parish Retreat, Monday, March 20 through Thursday, March 23. Dom Daniel or Fr. Nash is the good priest presiding over the canonry of priests in Glen Cove, Long Island, NY, at which a number of priests have care of several different parishes. The focus of our Lenten retreat is to bring us, as the retreat director says, "face to face" with relatable instances in comparing the instruments of the passion to where similar things occur in nature and help us carry our crosses, our sacrifices and our agonies. Dom Daniel is the celebrant of the Mass of on the Solemnity of St. Joseph at 6 p.m., Monday, Mar. 20 as well as the celebrant of the other Masses. Our other retreat days all have 6:30 p.m. Mass times: Tues. – Thurs., Mar. 21 – Mar. 23. Thursday, the last evening of the retreat, we have Stations of the Cross in the main church at 6 p.m., a half hour before Mass.

As one can see, outside of the Lenten Parish Retreat week, besides our usual weekly Thursday 5:30 p.m. Mass and 6 p.m. Stations of the Cross, there are many things of which to take advantage during Lent.


Contemporary Choir sings at the 4:30 Mass on one Saturday of each month. Rehearsal will be on the day of at 3:30pm.
